# **SENATE BILL 1309**

AN ACT

AMENDING TITLE 1, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; BY ADDING CHAPTER 7; RELATING TO ARIZONA CITIZENSHIP.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:  
2       Section 1. Title 1, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended by adding  
3 chapter 7, to read:

CHAPTER 7  
ARIZONA CITIZENSHIP  
ARTICLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

## 1-701. Arizona citizenship

- A. A PERSON IS A CITIZEN OF THE STATE OF ARIZONA IF:
    - 1. THE PERSON IS BORN IN THE UNITED STATES AND SUBJECT TO THE JURISDICTION THEREOF, AND
    - 2. THE PERSON IS LAWFULLY DOMICILED IN THE STATE OF ARIZONA.
  - B. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, SUBJECT TO THE JURISDICTION OF THE UNITED STATES HAS THE MEANING THAT IT BEARS IN SECTION 1 OF THE EIGHTEENTH AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION, NAMELY THAT THE PERSON IS A CHILD OF AT LEAST ONE PARENT WHO OWES NO ALLEGIANCE TO ANY FOREIGN SOVEREIGNTY, OR A CHILD WITHOUT CITIZENSHIP OR NATIONALITY IN ANY FOREIGN COUNTRY. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, A PERSON WHO OWES NO ALLEGIANCE TO ANY FOREIGN SOVEREIGNTY IS A UNITED STATES CITIZEN OR NATIONAL, AN IMMIGRANT ACCORDED THE PRIVILEGE OF RESIDING PERMANENTLY IN THE UNITED STATES, OR A PERSON WITHOUT CITIZENSHIP OR NATIONALITY IN ANY FOREIGN COUNTRY.
  - C. IN ADDITION TO THE CRITERIA OF CITIZENSHIP DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTIONS A AND B, A PERSON IS A CITIZEN OF THE STATE OF ARIZONA IF:
    - 1. THE PERSON IS NATURALIZED IN THE UNITED STATES, AND
    - 2. THE PERSON IS LAWFULLY DOMICILED IN THE STATE OF ARIZONA.
  - D. CITIZENSHIP OF THE STATE OF ARIZONA SHALL NOT CONFER UPON THE PERSON THEREOF ANY RIGHT, PRIVILEGE, IMMUNITY OR BENEFIT UNDER LAW.
