AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 23-352 AND 38-612, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO WITHHOLDING OF WAGES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
2 Section 1. Section 23-352, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 23-352. Withholding of wages

5 A. No employer may withhold or divert any portion of an employee's
6 wages unless one of the following applies:

7 1. The employer is required or empowered to do so by state or federal
8 law.

9 2. EXCEPT AS PROVIDED BY SUBSECTION B, the employer has prior written
10 authorization from the employee.

11 3. There is a reasonable good faith dispute as to the amount of wages
12 due, including the amount of any counterclaim or any claim of debt,
13 reimbursement, recoupment or set-off asserted by the employer against the
14 employee.

15 B. THIS STATE AND ANY COUNTY, MUNICIPALITY, SCHOOL DISTRICT OR OTHER
16 POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THIS STATE MAY NOT WITHHOLD OR DIVERT ANY PORTION OF
17 AN EMPLOYEE'S WAGES TO PAY FOR LABOR ORGANIZATION DUES.

18 Sec. 2. Section 38-612, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

19 38-612. Administration of payroll salary deductions

20 A. There shall be no payroll salary deductions from the compensation
21 of state officers or employees except as specifically authorized by federal
22 law or regulation or by a statute of this state. No administrative agency of
23 this state may authorize any other deduction.

24 B. In addition to those payroll salary deductions required by federal
25 law or regulation or by statute, state officers or employees may authorize
26 deductions to be made from their salaries or wages for the payment of:

27 1. Premiums on any health benefits, disability plans or group life
28 plans provided for by statute and any existing insurance programs already
29 provided by payroll deduction.

30 2. Shares or obligations to any state or federally chartered credit
31 union established primarily for the purpose of serving state officers and
32 employees and their families.

33 3. ~~Dues in a recognized association comprised principally of employees
34 and former employees of agencies of this state, subject to the following
35 criteria:~~

36 (a) ~~When comprised of at least one thousand state employees other than
37 employees of the state universities, the department of public safety and
38 academic personnel of the Arizona state schools for the deaf and the blind.~~

39 (b) ~~When comprised of at least twenty-five per cent of the academic
40 personnel or of the nonacademic employees of any state university.~~

41 (c) ~~When comprised of at least twenty-five per cent of the academic
42 personnel of the Arizona state schools for the deaf and the blind.~~

43 (d) ~~When comprised of at least five hundred state employees who are
44 certified as peace officers by the Arizona peace officer standards and
45 training board established by section 41-1821.~~

1 ~~4.~~ 3. Deferred compensation or tax sheltered annuity salary
2 reductions when made under approved plans.

3 ~~5.~~ 4. Federal savings bond plans.

4 ~~6.~~ 5. Recurrent fees, charges or other payments payable to a state
5 agency under a collection plan approved by the director of the department of
6 administration.

7 ~~7.~~ 6. Contributions made to a charitable organization:

8 (a) Organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and
9 selected by the presidents of the state universities. Employees of the state
10 universities shall be advised by form of the charitable organizations to
11 which they may contribute through payroll salary deductions. The advisory
12 provided under this subdivision shall be substantially similar to the
13 following and prominently printed:

14 "You may contribute to any charitable organization registered under
15 internal revenue code section 501(c)(3), tax exempt status.

17 Charitable organization name"

18 This subdivision applies only to academic personnel and nonacademic
19 employees of the state universities.

20 (b) Organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes,
21 provided a fund drive by such an organization shall be applicable to all
22 state agencies except the state universities covered under subdivision (a) of
23 this paragraph and no state officer or employee of state agencies subject to
24 this subdivision may authorize more than one deduction for charitable
25 purposes to be in effect at the same time. This subdivision applies to all
26 state agencies except the universities covered under subdivision (a) of this
27 paragraph.

28 ~~8.~~ 7. Contributions made for the purpose of contributing to a fund
29 raising campaign for a university or a club for faculty or staff, or both,
30 ~~which~~ THAT is recognized by the university president and authorized by the
31 Arizona board of regents. This paragraph applies only to academic personnel
32 and nonacademic employees of the state universities.

33 ~~9.~~ 8. Charges payable for transportation expenses pursuant to section
34 41-786.

35 ~~10.~~ 9. Payments ordered by courts of competent jurisdiction within
36 this state.

37 ~~11.~~ 10. Automobile or homeowner's insurance premiums.

38 ~~12.~~ 11. Premiums for the following state sponsored group benefits that
39 are established primarily for the purpose of serving state officers and
40 employees and their families:

41 (a) Long-term care insurance.

42 (b) Critical care insurance.

43 (c) Prepaid legal services.

44 (d) Identity theft protection services.

1 **13.** 12. A computer system as defined in section 13-2301 for personal
2 use.

3 **C.** ~~In order for the department of administration to establish and~~
4 ~~maintain a dues deduction pursuant to subsection B, paragraph 3 of this~~
5 ~~section, the department of administration may establish and maintain the~~
6 ~~deduction without the appropriation of any additional monies or technological~~
7 ~~improvements. The department of administration shall track all personnel~~
8 ~~hours dedicated to dues deduction. The department of administration may~~
9 ~~charge a fee to a recognized association that qualifies under subsection B,~~
10 ~~paragraph 3 of this section for establishing the automatic dues deduction and~~
11 ~~anytime changes are needed in the automatic dues deduction system as a result~~
12 ~~of an increase or decrease in association dues. If the membership criteria~~
13 ~~of a recognized association falls below the criteria set forth in subsection~~
14 ~~B, paragraph 3 of this section, the recognized association shall be on~~
15 ~~probation for one year. If the membership of a recognized association falls~~
16 ~~below the criteria set forth in subsection B, paragraph 3 of this section for~~
17 ~~more than one year, or if the members of the association engage in a work~~
18 ~~slowdown or work stoppage, the dues deduction authorized by this section~~
19 ~~shall immediately be discontinued.~~

20 **D.** C. For those state officers and employees under payroll systems
21 ~~which THAT~~ are under the direction of the director of the department of
22 administration, the director shall provide for the administration of payroll
23 deductions for the purposes set forth in this section. For all other state
24 officers and employees and for persons receiving allowances or benefits under
25 other state payroll and retirement systems, the appropriate state officer
26 shall provide for such administration of payroll deductions. Such
27 administration shall operate without cost or contribution from the state
28 other than the incidental expense of making the deductions and remittances to
29 the payees. If any payee requests additional services, the director of the
30 department of administration or any other appropriate state officer may
31 require payment for the additional cost of providing such services.

32 **E.** D. As a means of readily identifying the employee from whom
33 payroll deductions are to be made, the state officer administering payroll
34 deductions may request an employee to enter such employee's social security
35 identification number on the payroll deduction authorization. Such number
36 shall not be used for any other purpose.

37 **F.** E. The state, the director of the department of administration or
38 any other appropriate state officer shall be relieved of any liability to
39 employees authorizing deductions or organizations receiving deductions that
40 may result from authorizations pursuant to this section.
