## **SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1016**

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

MAKING APPLICATION TO CONGRESS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES.

1       Whereas, the founders of the Constitution of the United States  
2 empowered state legislators to be guardians of liberty against future abuses  
3 of power by the federal government; and

4       Whereas, the federal government has created a crushing national debt  
5 through improper and imprudent spending; and

6       Whereas, the federal government has invaded the legitimate role of the  
7 states through the manipulative process of federal mandates, most of which  
8 are unfunded to a great extent; and

9       Whereas, the federal government has ceased to live under a proper  
10 interpretation of the Constitution of the United States; and

11      Whereas, it is the solemn duty of the states to protect the liberty of  
12 our people, particularly for the generations to come, and to propose  
13 amendments to the Constitution of the United States through a convention of  
14 the states under Article V to place clear restraints on these and related  
15 abuses of power.

16 Therefore

17 Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Arizona, the House of  
18 Representatives concurring:

19      1. That, pursuant to Article V of the Constitution of the United  
20 States, the Legislature of the State of Arizona formally applies to the  
21 Congress of the United States to call a convention for the purpose of  
22 proposing amendments to the Constitution of the United States that will  
23 impose fiscal restraints on the federal government, limit the power and  
24 jurisdiction of the federal government and limit the terms of office for  
25 officials of the federal government.

26      2. That this application constitutes a continuing application in  
27 accordance with Article V of the Constitution of the United States until at  
28 least two-thirds of the legislatures of the several states have made  
29 application on the same subjects.

30      3. That the Secretary of State of the State of Arizona transmit a copy  
31 of this Resolution to the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker  
32 of the United States House of Representatives, each Member of Congress from  
33 the State of Arizona and the presiding officers of each house of the several  
34 state legislatures, requesting their cooperation in applying for the  
35 amendments convention limited to the subject matter contemplated by this  
36 application.
