There is a top bar with the selections for Overview, Bill Status, videos, Sponsor/Keyword/Sections, and RTS Current Bill Position. Overview still gives details in order. Bill Status still allows you to view either the House or Senate information separately. Videos are all videos archived that relate to the selected bill. Sponsor/Keyword/Section gives the same

valuable information found under this tab in the old Bill Status Inquiry program. *The change noted above is where you will find the Documents option, which has been added to this bar.*

The RTS Current Bill Position, gives the most current position someone has entered on that bill.



RTS Committee Position

is the position the person entered at the time of the

committee meeting. This position does not change even if the person later changes his or her mind. If a change is entered it goes under RTS Current Position and is the position seen when a bill is viewed outside of the committee.

RTS Current Position

is the position the person currently has. A position may change based on amendments and personal

opinion. This allows a person to change his or her position, but does not change the Committee Position.

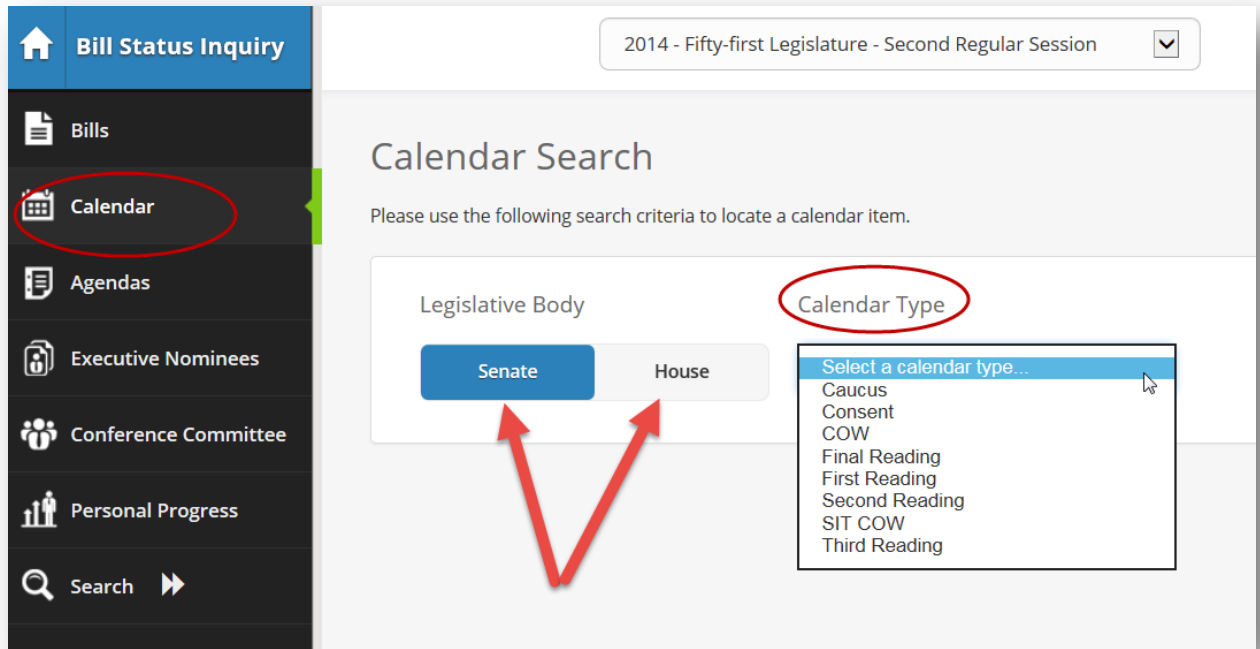
If the Committee Position does not change it will be shown in the Current Position as well.

Calendars

In this window

The Calendar screen allows the following options:

1. Select House or Senate Calendars
2. Choose the Calendar type desired



These options are available when Calendar Type is selected:

1. Caucus – Caucuses provide the political parties in each house with a forum for discussing and, if possible, achieving party consensus on legislation and various other issues such as the state budget and, in the Senate only, the Governor’s nominations to state agencies, boards and commissions.
2. Consent – A Consent Calendar (called a “Unanimous Consent Calendar” in the Senate) consisting of unamended bills reported out of all assigned committees.
3. COW – Committee of the Whole (short for Committee of the Whole House or Committee of the Whole Senate, usually referred to simply as “COW”) is made up of the entire membership of the House or the Senate.
4. Final Reading – The roll call vote taken on a measure on the floor of each house after all amendments and committee reports have been adopted and incorporated into the measure.
5. First Reading – The initial formal recitation on the chamber floor of a bill, resolution or memorial by number and sections by the reader in either house.

6. Second Reading – The second of the three formal readings of a measure introduced in each house required by the Constitution of Arizona.
7. SIT COW – Occasionally an issue that requires attention or correction is discovered after a bill has already been “COWed.” Normally, a bill once COWed cannot be further amended in that body. No amendments are allowed in third reading. However, the Senate and House Rules allow each body to address these matters by “sitting as in” Committee of the Whole (“sit COW”). The process basically returns the bill to an Active Calendar for amendment. Since sit COW breaks the routine order of business, it is allowed by leadership only in extraordinary circumstances and for limited corrective purposes.
8. Third Reading – The third formal reading of a measure on the floor of the House or Senate, taken after all committee work on the measure is completed and all adopted amendments have been engrossed.

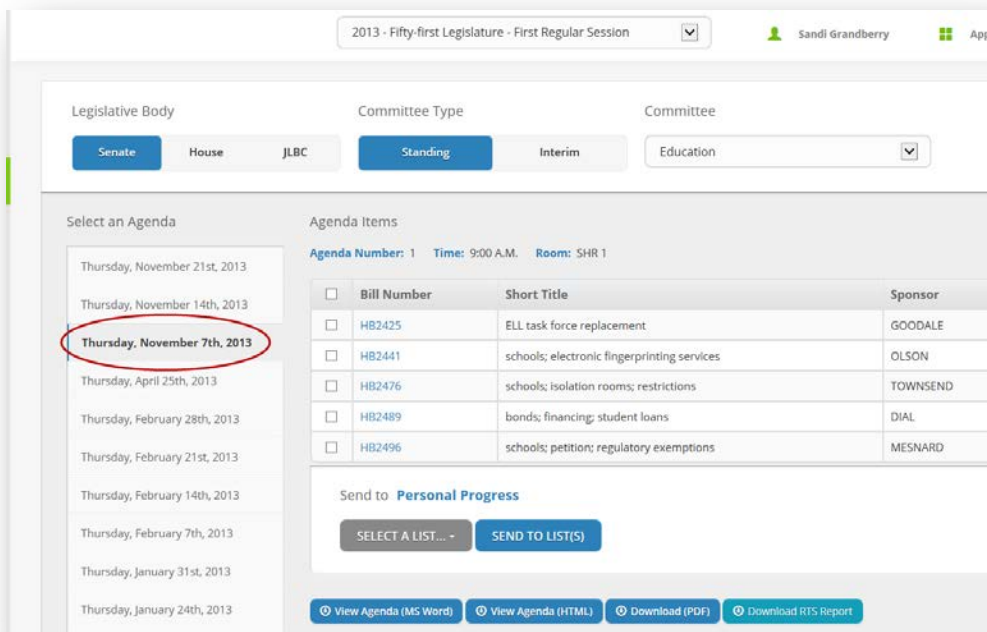
Agendas

3. Then Select the committee you want from the drop-down menu.



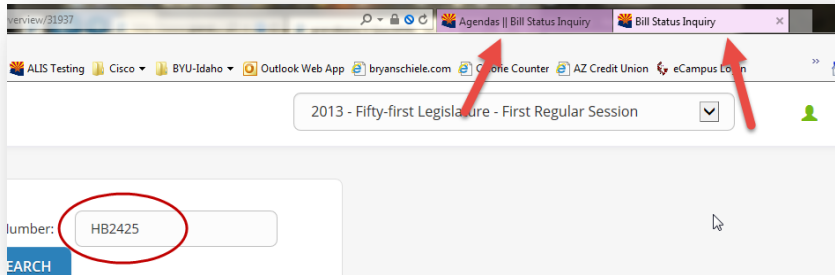

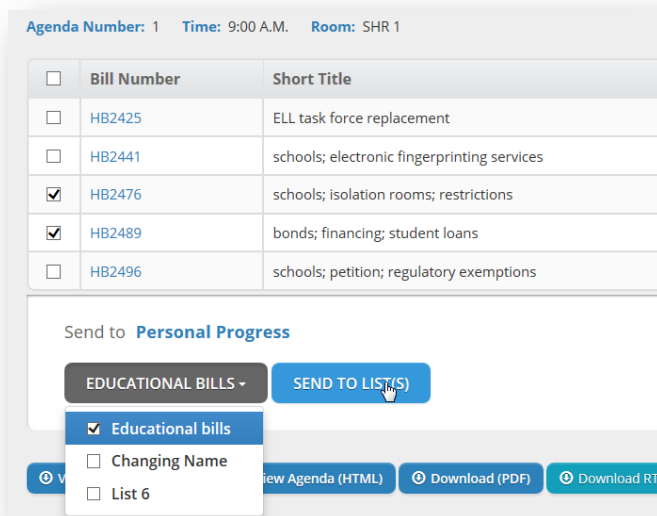
Once you select the Agenda the bills on the Agenda will appear in the box on the right.

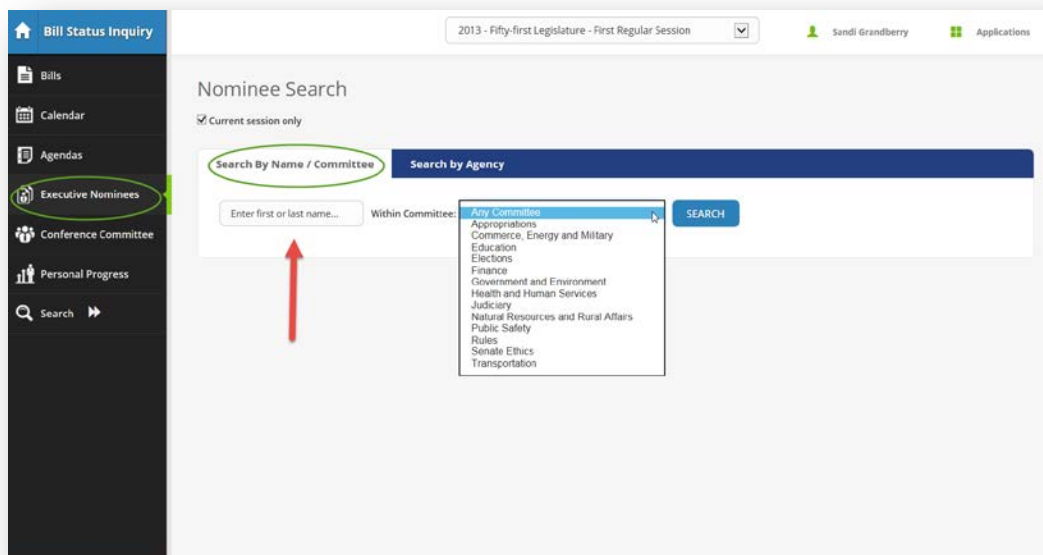
Executive Nominees

Among the checks and balances that the Legislature possesses is the power of the Senate to confirm, or reject, gubernatorial appointments to certain executive branch offices. There are hundreds of government offices in the executive branch that are filled by appointment by the Governor. These offices include department heads and members of boards, commissions and study committees, and many are required by law to be approved by a majority vote of the Senate before the appointment officially becomes effective.

SEARCH BY NAME

To find information on Executive Nominees enter the first or last name of the person for whom you are searching. Narrow the search to a specific committee or search all committees.

Select : **Search By Name/Committee**








SEARCH BY AGENCY

Sometimes an Agency will have more than one person serving as an Executive Nominee. When that happens a search can be done for all members of a specific agency.

Select: **Search by Agency**

Conference Committee

Conference committees are appointed when a bill passed in one house is amended by the other house. When this happens the two houses can concur that the changes are accepted. If they do not a Conference Committee is formed. Conference committees are made up of an equal number of members from both the House and the Senate.

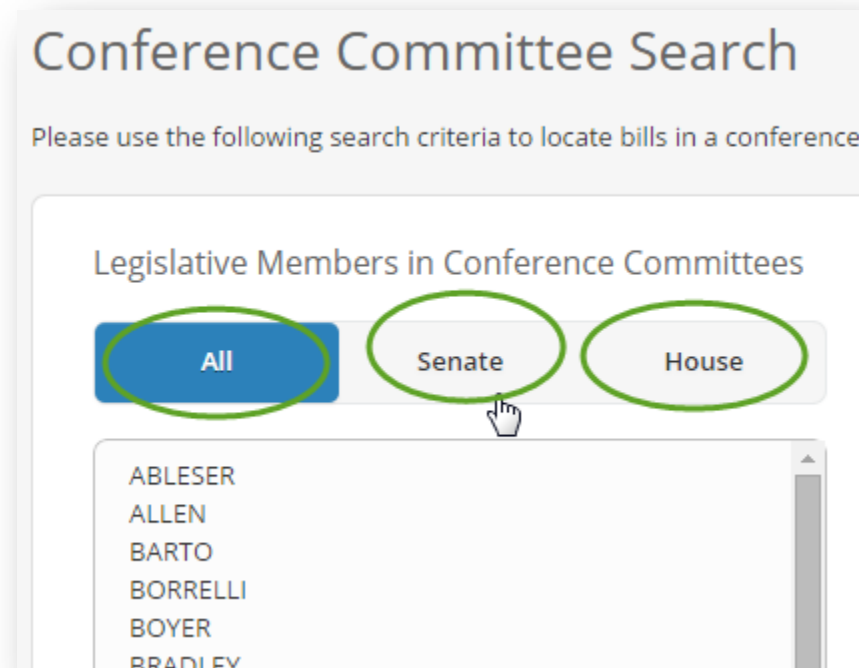
There are two types of conference committees:

- ❏ A simple conference committee must limit its actions to only those areas where differences exist between the House and Senate versions of a bill and may only remove language from those versions or choose one or the other version.
- ❏ A free conference committee may consider entirely new provisions in addition to the provisions in the House and Senate versions, but it may not adopt a “strike everything” amendment, and the adopted amendments must be constitutional and germane to the bill.

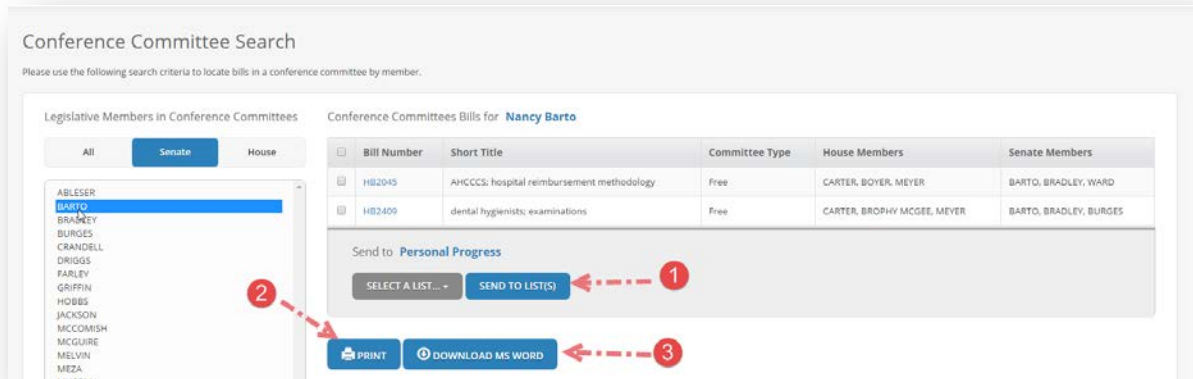

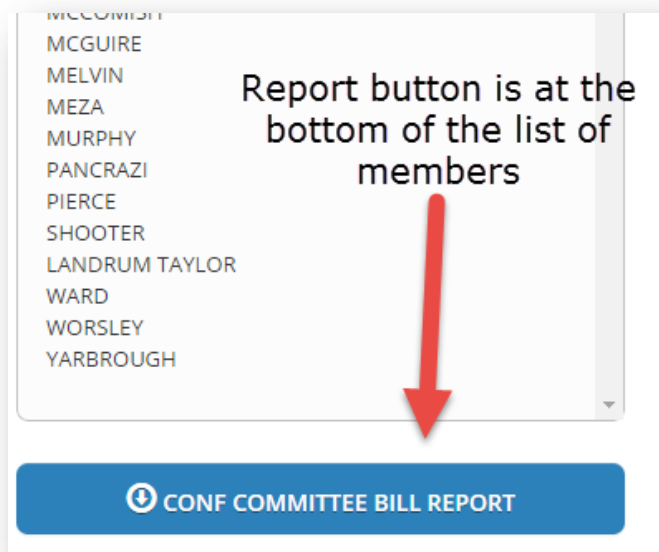

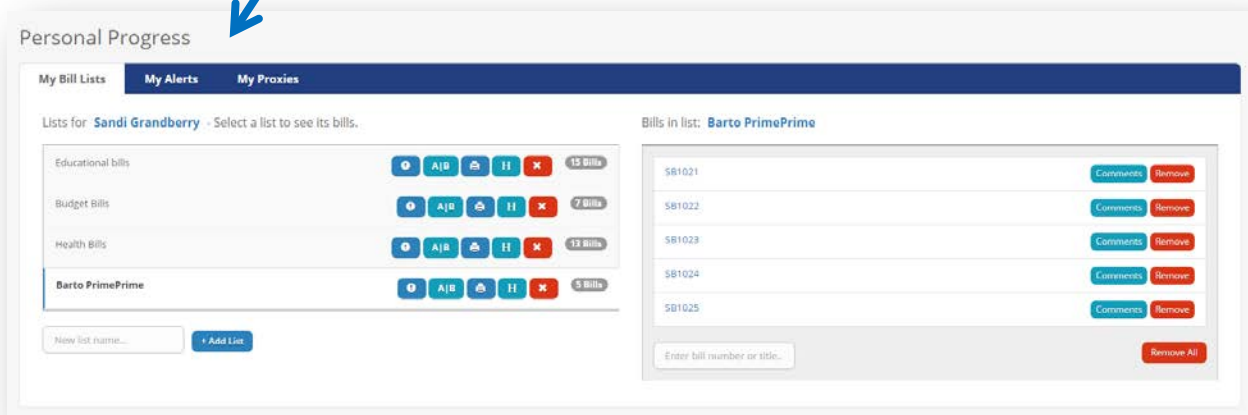
Personal Progress

Clicking on the Constitution search option will open a new tab and take you to the Arizona Constitution web page where you can enter key words to search the Constitution. When you are finished with a search, simply click back on the Bill Status Inquiry tab to return to your searches.

FINAL DISPOSITION

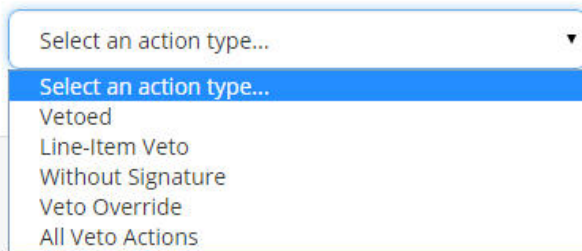

As with all other areas, the bills can be clicked on and you will be taken directly to the bill status information, you can add any bills listed to a Personal Progress list, print or download the list to a Word document.



GOVERNOR'S ACTION

Select the action you want to search as shown below:

Governor's Actions



1. Vetoed – An official act of the Governor disapproving a bill passed by the Legislature and nullifying the bill unless the Legislature subsequently overrides the veto.
2. Line-Item Veto – The power of the Governor to veto specified items from an appropriation while signing the remainder of the bill into law.
3. Without Signature – The Governor also has the option to not sign the bill without vetoing it allowing it to become law.
4. Veto Override – To enact a bill after it has been vetoed by the Governor. The Legislature must muster a supermajority vote to override a veto.
5. All Vetoed Actions – This will show all of the vetoed actions for the currently selected session.

When you select an action the bills meeting that criteria will show up on the right side, like this:

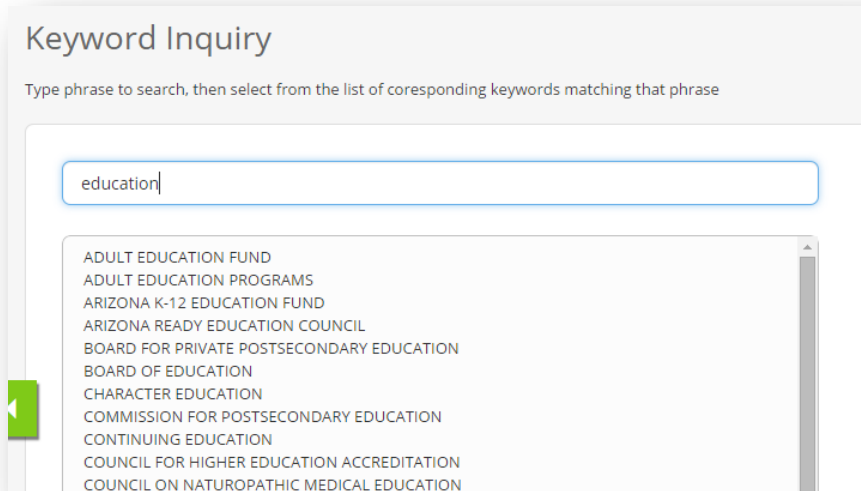

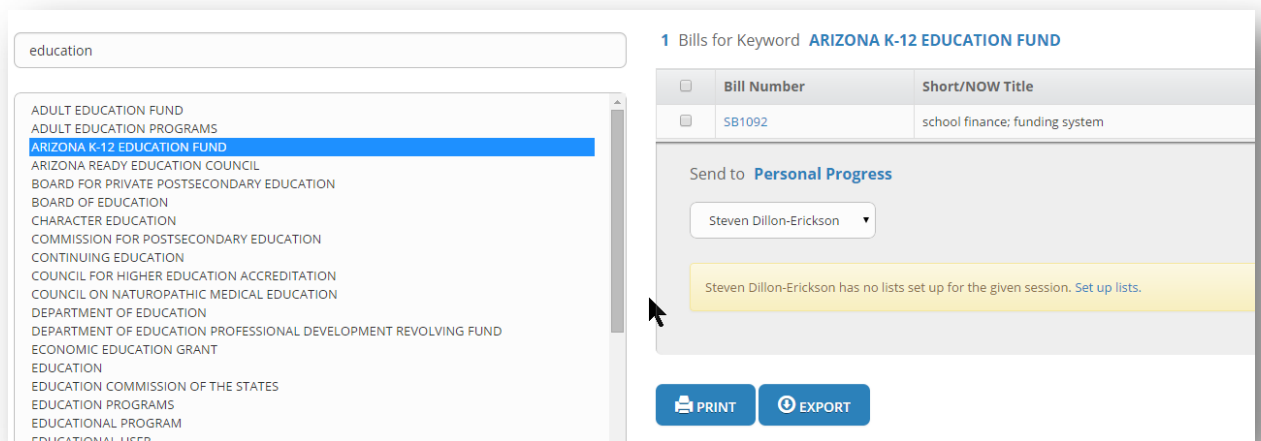

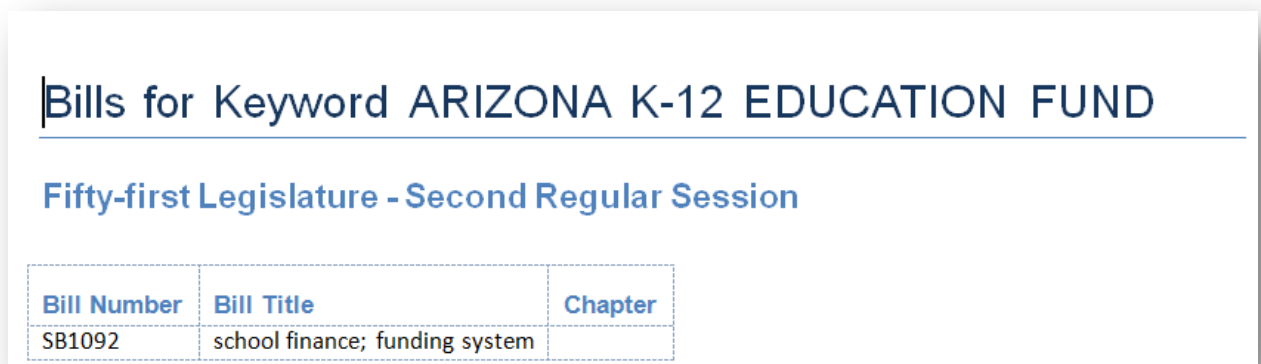

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

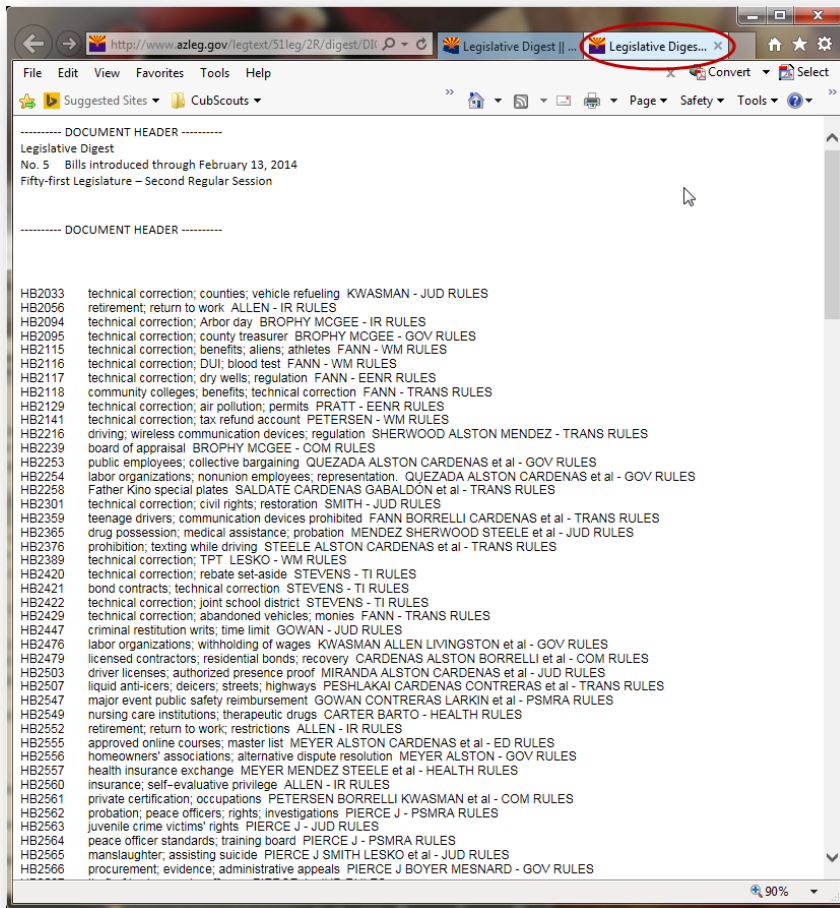



SEARCH

- Short Title – Also known as Reference Title is a short title of each bill, resolution and memorial that is placed in the upper right-hand corner of the first page. It gives a brief idea of the nature of the measure and aids in indexing, but it is not a part of the substantive law of the measure.
- Previous Now Title – Also known as “Now” Title is a revised reference title of a measure after a strike everything amendment has been adopted to reflect the new provisions of the measure and distinguish the current version of the measure from its original version.
- Pending Title – A Strike Everything amendment that will be or has been through a committee, but not through COW. This is a suggested title to be placed on agendas before the official title is decided upon. (This section will not be available to the public.)

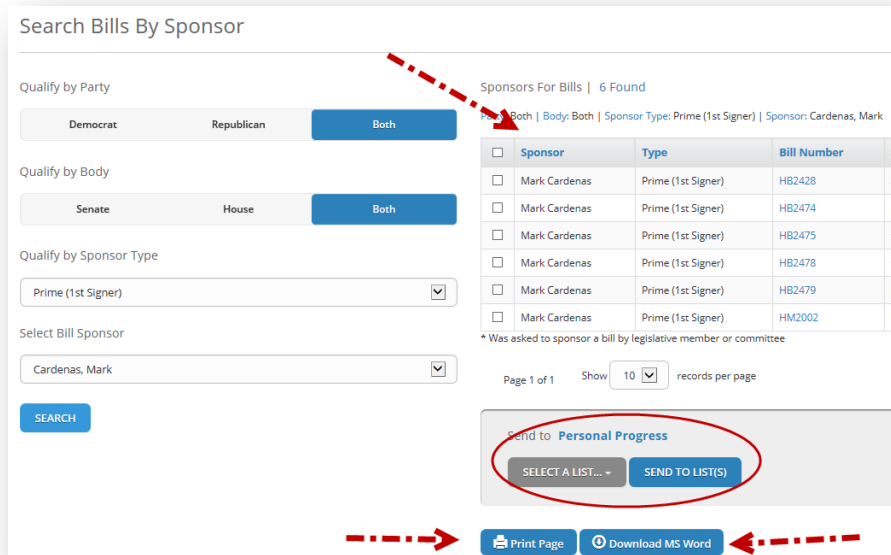

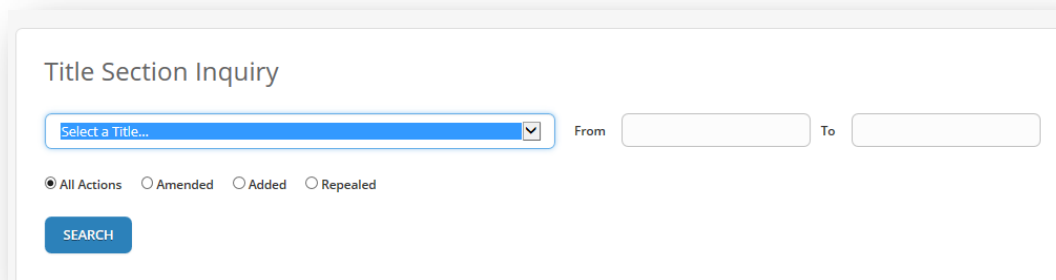
