**CHAPTER 261**  
**HOUSE BILL 2787**

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 12-116.01, 13-610, 13-2314.01, 13-3967, 38-886.01 AND 41-191.09, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; REPEALING LAWS 2006, CHAPTER 348, SECTION 4; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; RELATING TO CRIMINAL JUSTICE BUDGET RECONCILIATION; PROVIDING FOR CONDITIONAL ENACTMENT.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 12-116.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4 12-116.01. Assessments; fund deposits

5 A. In addition to any other penalty assessment provided by law, a  
6 penalty assessment shall be levied in an amount of forty-seven per cent on  
7 every fine, penalty and forfeiture imposed and collected by the courts for  
8 criminal offenses and any civil penalty imposed and collected for a civil  
9 traffic violation and fine, penalty or forfeiture for a violation of the  
10 motor vehicle statutes, for any local ordinance relating to the stopping,  
11 standing or operation of a vehicle or for a violation of the game and fish  
12 statutes in title 17.

13 B. In addition to any other penalty assessment provided by law, an  
14 additional penalty assessment shall be levied in an amount of seven per cent  
15 on every fine, penalty and forfeiture imposed and collected by the courts for  
16 criminal offenses and any civil penalty imposed and collected for a civil  
17 traffic violation and fine, penalty or forfeiture for a violation of the  
18 motor vehicle statutes, for any local ordinance relating to the stopping,  
19 standing or operation of a vehicle or for a violation of the game and fish  
20 statutes in title 17.

21 C. In addition to any other penalty assessment provided by law, an  
22 additional penalty assessment shall be levied ~~THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2011~~ in an  
23 amount of ~~three~~ SEVEN per cent, AND BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2012 IN AN AMOUNT OF  
24 SIX PER CENT, on every fine, penalty and forfeiture imposed and collected by  
25 the courts for criminal offenses and any civil penalty imposed and collected  
26 for a civil traffic violation and fine, penalty or forfeiture for a violation  
27 of the motor vehicle statutes, for any local ordinance relating to the  
28 stopping, standing or operation of a vehicle or for a violation of the game  
29 and fish statutes in title 17.

30 D. If any deposit of bail or bond or deposit for an alleged civil  
31 traffic violation is to be made for a violation, the court shall require a  
32 sufficient amount to include the assessment prescribed in this section for  
33 forfeited bail, bond or deposit. If bail, bond or deposit is forfeited, the  
34 court shall transmit the amount of the assessment pursuant to subsection G of  
35 this section. If bail, bond or deposit is returned, the assessment made  
36 pursuant to this article shall also be returned.

37 E. After addition of the penalty assessment, the courts may round the  
38 total amount due to the nearest one-quarter dollar.

39 F. The judge may waive all or part of the civil penalty, fine,  
40 forfeiture and penalty assessment, except for mandatory civil penalties and  
41 fines, the payment of which would work a hardship on the persons convicted or  
42 adjudicated or on their immediate families. If a fine or civil penalty is  
43 mandatory, the judge may waive only all or part of the penalty assessments  
44 prescribed by subsections A, B and C of this section and section  
45 12-116.02. If a fine or civil penalty is not mandatory and if a portion of  
46 the civil penalty, fine, forfeiture and penalty assessment is waived or

1 suspended, the amount assessed must be divided according to the proportion  
2 that the civil penalty, fine, bail or bond and the penalty assessment  
3 represent of the total amount due.

4 G. After a determination by the court of the amount due, the court  
5 shall transmit, on the last day of each month, the assessments collected  
6 pursuant to subsections A, B, C and D of this section and a remittance report  
7 of the fines, civil penalties and assessments collected pursuant to  
8 subsections A, B, C and D of this section to the county treasurer, except  
9 that municipal courts shall transmit the assessments and the remittance  
10 report of the fines, civil penalties and assessments to the city treasurer.

11 H. The appropriate authorities specified in subsection G of this  
12 section shall transmit the forty-seven per cent penalty assessment prescribed  
13 in subsection A of this section and the remittance report as required in  
14 subsection G of this section to the state treasurer on or before the  
15 fifteenth day of each month for deposit in the criminal justice enhancement  
16 fund established by section 41-2401.

17 I. The appropriate authorities specified in subsection G of this  
18 section shall transmit the seven per cent penalty assessment prescribed in  
19 subsection B of this section and the remittance report as required in  
20 subsection G of this section to the state treasurer on or before the  
21 fifteenth day of each month for allocation pursuant to section 41-2421,  
22 subsection J.

23 J. The appropriate authorities specified in subsection G of this  
24 section shall transmit the ~~three per cent~~ penalty assessment prescribed in  
25 subsection C of this section and the remittance report as required in  
26 subsection G of this section to the state treasurer on or before the  
27 fifteenth day of each month for deposit in the Arizona deoxyribonucleic acid  
28 identification system fund established by section 41-2419.

29 K. Partial payments of the amount due shall be transmitted as  
30 prescribed in subsections G, H, I and J of this section and shall be divided  
31 according to the proportion that the civil penalty, fine, bail or bond and  
32 the penalty assessment represent of the total amount due.

33 Sec. 2. Section 13-610, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

34 13-610. Deoxyribonucleic acid testing; exception

35 A. Within thirty days after a person is sentenced to the state  
36 department of corrections or a person who is accepted under the interstate  
37 compact for the supervision of parolees and probationers arrives in this  
38 state, the state department of corrections shall secure a sufficient sample  
39 of blood or other bodily substances for deoxyribonucleic acid testing and  
40 extraction from the person if the person was convicted of an offense listed  
41 in this section and was sentenced to a term of imprisonment or was convicted  
42 of any offense that was committed in another jurisdiction that if committed  
43 in this state would be a violation of any offense listed in this section and  
44 the person is under the supervision of the state department of  
45 corrections. The state department of corrections shall transmit the sample  
46 to the department of public safety.

1           B. Within thirty days after a person is placed on probation and  
2 sentenced to a term of incarceration in a county jail detention facility or  
3 is detained in a county juvenile detention facility, the county detention  
4 facility shall secure a sufficient sample of blood or other bodily substances  
5 for deoxyribonucleic acid testing and extraction from the person if the  
6 person was convicted of or adjudicated delinquent for an offense listed in  
7 this section. The county detention facility shall transmit the sample to the  
8 department of public safety.

9           C. Within thirty days after a person is convicted and placed on  
10 probation without a term of incarceration or adjudicated delinquent and  
11 placed on probation, the county probation department shall secure a  
12 sufficient sample of blood or other bodily substances for deoxyribonucleic  
13 acid testing and extraction from the person if the person was convicted of or  
14 adjudicated delinquent for an offense listed in this section. The county  
15 probation department shall transmit the sample to the department of public  
16 safety.

17           D. Within thirty days after the arrival of a person who is accepted  
18 under the interstate compact for the supervision of parolees and probationers  
19 and who is under the supervision of a county probation department, the county  
20 probation department shall secure a sufficient sample of blood or other  
21 bodily substances for deoxyribonucleic acid testing and extraction from the  
22 person if the person was convicted of an offense that was committed in  
23 another jurisdiction that if committed in this state would be a violation of  
24 any offense listed in this section and was sentenced to a term of  
25 probation. The county probation department shall transmit the sample to the  
26 department of public safety.

27           E. Within thirty days after a juvenile is committed to the department  
28 of juvenile corrections, the department of juvenile corrections shall secure  
29 a sufficient sample of blood or other bodily substances for deoxyribonucleic  
30 acid testing and extraction from the youth if the youth was adjudicated  
31 delinquent for an offense listed in this section and was committed to a  
32 secure care facility. The department of juvenile corrections shall transmit  
33 the sample to the department of public safety.

34           F. Within thirty days after the arrival in this state of a juvenile  
35 who is accepted by the department of juvenile corrections pursuant to the  
36 interstate compact on juveniles and who was adjudicated for an offense that  
37 was committed in another jurisdiction that if committed in this state would  
38 be a violation of any offense listed in this section, the compact  
39 administrator shall request that the sending state impose as a condition of  
40 supervision that the juvenile submit a sufficient sample of blood or other  
41 bodily substances for deoxyribonucleic acid testing. If the sending state  
42 does not impose that condition, the department of juvenile corrections shall  
43 request a sufficient sample of blood or other bodily substances for  
44 deoxyribonucleic acid testing within thirty days after the juvenile's arrival  
45 in this state. The department of juvenile corrections shall transmit the  
46 sample to the department of public safety.

1 G. Notwithstanding subsections A through F of this section, the agency  
2 that is responsible for securing a sample pursuant to this section shall not  
3 secure the sample if the scientific criminal analysis section of the  
4 department of public safety has previously received and maintains a sample  
5 sufficient for deoxyribonucleic acid testing.

6 H. The department of public safety shall do all of the following:

7 1. Conduct or oversee through mutual agreement an analysis of the  
8 samples that it receives pursuant to ~~subsection N, paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of~~  
9 ~~this section and subsection O, paragraphs 1 and 2~~ SUBSECTIONS K, L AND O of  
10 this section.

11 ~~2. Store the samples it receives pursuant to subsection N, paragraphs~~  
12 ~~4 and 5 of this section and subsection O, paragraphs 3 and 4 of this section~~  
13 ~~and conduct an analysis of the samples on receipt of the funding necessary~~  
14 ~~for this purpose.~~

15 ~~3.~~ 2. Make and maintain a report of the results of each  
16 deoxyribonucleic acid analysis.

17 ~~4.~~ 3. Maintain samples of blood and other bodily substances for at  
18 least thirty-five years.

19 I. Any sample and the result of any test that is obtained pursuant to  
20 this section may be used only as follows:

21 1. For law enforcement identification purposes.

22 2. In a proceeding in a criminal prosecution or juvenile adjudication.

23 3. In a proceeding under title 36, chapter 37.

24 J. If the conviction of a person who is subject to this section is  
25 overturned on appeal or postconviction relief and a final mandate has been  
26 issued, on petition of the person to the superior court in the county in  
27 which the conviction occurred, the court shall order that the person's  
28 deoxyribonucleic acid profile resulting from that conviction be expunged from  
29 the Arizona deoxyribonucleic acid identification system established by  
30 section 41-2418 unless the person has been convicted of another offense that  
31 would require the person to submit to deoxyribonucleic acid testing pursuant  
32 to this section.

33 ~~K. If the conviction of a person who is subject to this section is~~  
34 ~~classified as a misdemeanor pursuant to section 13-702, on petition of the~~  
35 ~~person to the superior court in the county in which the conviction occurred,~~  
36 ~~the court shall order that the person's deoxyribonucleic acid profile~~  
37 ~~resulting from that conviction be expunged from the Arizona deoxyribonucleic~~  
38 ~~acid identification system unless the person has been convicted of another~~  
39 ~~offense that would require the person to submit to deoxyribonucleic acid~~  
40 ~~testing pursuant to this section.~~

41 ~~L. A person who was convicted or adjudicated delinquent before the~~  
42 ~~applicable date provided in this section for any offense for which a~~  
43 ~~sufficient sample of blood or other bodily substance for deoxyribonucleic~~  
44 ~~acid testing and extraction is required to be secured shall have a sample~~  
45 ~~secured if the person is in the custody of the state department of~~  
46 ~~corrections, the department of juvenile corrections or a county jail~~

~~1 detention facility or is under the supervision of a probation department on  
2 the applicable date listed in subsection N or O of this section. The sample  
3 shall be secured within one hundred eighty days after the applicable date  
4 listed in subsection N or O of this section.~~

5 K. IF A PERSON IS ARRESTED FOR ANY OFFENSE LISTED IN SUBSECTION O,  
6 PARAGRAPH 3 OF THIS SECTION AND IS TRANSFERRED BY THE ARRESTING AUTHORITY TO  
7 A STATE, COUNTY OR LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY OR JAIL, THE ARRESTING  
8 AUTHORITY OR ITS DESIGNEE SHALL SECURE A SUFFICIENT SAMPLE OF BUCCAL CELLS OR  
9 OTHER BODILY SUBSTANCES FOR DEOXYRIBONUCLEIC ACID TESTING AND EXTRACTION FROM  
10 THE PERSON FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING IDENTIFICATION CHARACTERISTICS.  
11 THE ARRESTING AUTHORITY OR ITS DESIGNEE SHALL TRANSMIT THE SAMPLE TO THE  
12 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

13 L. IF A JUDICIAL OFFICER AS DEFINED IN SECTION 13-3967 RELEASES A  
14 PERSON ON THE PERSON'S OWN RECOGNIZANCE OR ON BAIL, THE JUDICIAL OFFICER  
15 SHALL ORDER THE PERSON TO REPORT, WITHIN FIVE DAYS, IF THE PERSON IS CHARGED  
16 WITH A FELONY OR MISDEMEANOR OFFENSE LISTED IN SUBSECTION O, PARAGRAPH 3 OF  
17 THIS SECTION TO THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY THAT ARRESTED THE PERSON OR ITS  
18 DESIGNEE AND SUBMIT A SUFFICIENT SAMPLE OF BUCCAL CELLS OR OTHER BODILY  
19 SUBSTANCES FOR DEOXYRIBONUCLEIC ACID TESTING AND EXTRACTION. THE ARRESTING  
20 AUTHORITY OR ITS DESIGNEE SHALL TRANSMIT THE SAMPLE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
21 PUBLIC SAFETY. IF A PERSON DOES NOT COMPLY WITH AN ORDER MADE PURSUANT TO  
22 THIS SUBSECTION, THE COURT SHALL REVOKE THE PERSON'S RELEASE.

23 M. A PERSON WHO IS SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION K OR L OF THIS SECTION MAY  
24 PETITION THE SUPERIOR COURT IN THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE ARREST OCCURRED OR THE  
25 CRIMINAL CHARGE WAS FILED TO ORDER THAT THE PERSON'S DEOXYRIBONUCLEIC ACID  
26 PROFILE AND SAMPLE BE EXPUNGED FROM THE ARIZONA DEOXYRIBONUCLEIC ACID  
27 IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM, UNLESS THE PERSON HAS BEEN ARRESTED OR CHARGED WITH OR  
28 CONVICTED OF ANOTHER OFFENSE THAT WOULD REQUIRE THE PERSON TO SUBMIT TO  
29 DEOXYRIBONUCLEIC ACID TESTING PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION, IF ANY OF THE  
30 FOLLOWING APPLIES:

31 1. THE CRIMINAL CHARGES ARE NOT FILED WITHIN THE APPLICABLE PERIOD  
32 PRESCRIBED BY SECTION 13-107.

33 2. THE CRIMINAL CHARGES ARE DISMISSED.

34 3. THE PERSON IS ACQUITTED AT TRIAL.

36 safety under this section is found to be unacceptable for analysis and use or  
37 cannot be used by the department, the department shall require that another  
38 sample of blood or other bodily substances be secured pursuant to this

30          Sec. 3. Section 13-2314.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
31 read:

32          13-2314.01. Anti-racketeering revolving fund; use of fund;  
33                  reports

34          A. There is established an anti-racketeering revolving fund to be  
35 administered by the attorney general under the conditions and for the  
36 purposes provided by this section. Monies in the fund are exempt from the  
37 lapsing provisions of section 35-190.

38          B. Any prosecution and investigation costs, including ~~attorney's~~  
39 ATTORNEY fees, recovered for the state by the attorney general as a result of  
40 enforcement of civil and criminal statutes pertaining to any offense included  
41 in the definition of racketeering in section 13-2301, subsection D, paragraph  
42 4 or section 13-2312, whether by final judgment, settlement or otherwise,  
43 shall be deposited in the fund established by this section.

44          C. Any monies received by any department or agency of this state or  
45 any political subdivision of this state from any department or agency of the  
46 United States or another state as a result of participation in any

1 investigation or prosecution, whether by final judgment, settlement or  
2 otherwise, shall be deposited in the fund established by this section or, if  
3 the recipient is a political subdivision of this state, may be deposited in  
4 the fund established by section 13-2314.03.

5 D. Any monies obtained as a result of a forfeiture by any department  
6 or agency of this state under this title or under federal law shall be  
7 deposited in the fund established by this section. Any monies or other  
8 property obtained as a result of a forfeiture by any political subdivision of  
9 this state or the federal government may be deposited in the fund established  
10 by this section. Monies deposited in the fund pursuant to this section or  
11 section 13-4315 shall accrue interest and shall be held for the benefit of  
12 the agency or agencies responsible for the seizure or forfeiture to the  
13 extent of their contribution. Except as provided in subsections F and G of  
14 this section the monies and interest shall be distributed within thirty days  
15 of application to the agency or agencies responsible for the seizure or  
16 forfeiture. **MONIES IN THE FUND USED BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL FOR CAPITAL  
17 PROJECTS IN EXCESS OF ONE MILLION DOLLARS ARE SUBJECT TO REVIEW BY THE JOINT  
18 COMMITTEE ON CAPITAL REVIEW.**

19 E. Monies in the fund may be used for the funding of gang prevention  
20 programs, substance abuse prevention programs, substance abuse education  
21 programs and witness protection pursuant to section 41-196 or for any purpose  
22 permitted by federal law relating to the disposition of any property that is  
23 transferred to a law enforcement agency. ~~Monies in the fund may be  
24 transmitted by the attorney general on behalf of a department or agency of  
25 this state or any political subdivision of this state to the Arizona drug and  
26 gang policy council for the funding of gang prevention programs, substance  
27 abuse prevention programs and substance abuse education programs.~~ Monies in  
28 the fund may be used for the investigation and prosecution of any offense  
29 included in the definition of racketeering in section 13-2301, subsection D,  
30 paragraph 4 or section 13-2312, including civil enforcement.

31 F. On or before January 15, April 15, July 15 and October 15 of each  
32 year, each department or agency of this state receiving monies pursuant to  
33 this section or section 13-2314.03 or 13-4315 or from any department or  
34 agency of the United States or another state as a result of participation in  
35 any investigation or prosecution shall file with the attorney general a  
36 report for the previous calendar quarter. The report shall be in a form that  
37 is prescribed by the Arizona criminal justice commission and approved by the  
38 director of the joint legislative budget committee. The report shall set  
39 forth the sources of all monies and all expenditures. The report shall not  
40 include any identifying information about specific investigations. If a  
41 department or agency of this state fails to file a report within forty-five  
42 days after the report is due and there is no good cause as determined by the  
43 Arizona criminal justice commission, the attorney general shall make no  
44 expenditures from the fund for the benefit of the department or agency until  
45 the report is filed. The attorney general is responsible for collecting all  
46 reports from departments and agencies of this state and transmitting the



1 reports to the Arizona criminal justice commission at the time that the  
2 report required pursuant to subsection ~~H~~ G of this section is submitted.

3 G. On or before January 25, April 25, July 25 and October 25 of each  
4 year, the attorney general shall ~~cause to be filed~~ FILE with the Arizona  
5 criminal justice commission a report for the previous calendar quarter. The  
6 report shall be in a form that is prescribed by the Arizona criminal justice  
7 commission and approved by the director of the joint legislative budget  
8 committee. The report shall set forth the sources of all monies and all  
9 expenditures. The report shall not include any identifying information about  
10 specific investigations. If the attorney general fails to file a report  
11 within sixty days after the report is due and there is no good cause as  
12 determined by the Arizona criminal justice commission, the attorney general  
13 shall make no expenditures from the fund for the benefit of the attorney  
14 general until the report is filed. If a political subdivision of this state  
15 fails to file a report with the county attorney pursuant to section  
16 13-2314.03 within forty-five days after the report is due and there is no  
17 good cause as determined by the Arizona criminal justice commission, the  
18 attorney general shall make no expenditures from the fund for the benefit of  
19 the political subdivision until the report is filed.

20 H. On or before January 30, April 30, July 30 and October 30 of each  
21 year, the Arizona criminal justice commission shall compile the attorney  
22 general report and the reports of all departments and agencies of this state  
23 into a single comprehensive report and shall submit a copy of the report to  
24 the governor, with copies to the director of the department of  
25 administration, the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of  
26 representatives and the director of the joint legislative budget committee.

27 Sec. 4. Section 13-3967, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:  
28 13-3967. Release on bailable offenses before trial; definition

29 A. At his appearance before a judicial officer, any person who is  
30 charged with a public offense that is bailable as a matter of right shall be  
31 ordered released pending trial on his own recognizance or on the execution of  
32 bail in an amount specified by the judicial officer.

33 B. In determining the method of release or the amount of bail, the  
34 judicial officer, on the basis of available information, shall take into  
35 account all of the following:

- 36 1. The views of the victim.
- 37 2. The nature and circumstances of the offense charged.
- 38 3. The weight of evidence against the accused.
- 39 4. The accused's family ties, employment, financial resources,  
40 character and mental condition.
- 41 5. The results of any drug test submitted to the court.
- 42 6. Whether the accused is using any substance if its possession or use  
43 is illegal pursuant to chapter 34 of this title.
- 44 7. Whether the accused violated section 13-3407, subsection A,  
45 paragraph 2, 3, 4 or 7 involving methamphetamine or section 13-3407.01.
- 46 8. The length of residence in the community.

- 1           9. The accused's record of arrests and convictions.  
2           10. The accused's record of appearance at court proceedings or of  
3 flight to avoid prosecution or failure to appear at court proceedings.  
4           11. Whether the accused has entered or remained in the United States  
5 illegally.  
6           12. Whether the accused's residence is in this state, in another state  
7 or outside the United States.
- 8           C. If a judicial officer orders the release of a defendant who is  
9 charged with a felony either on his own recognizance or on bail, the judicial  
10 officer shall condition the defendant's release on the defendant's good  
11 behavior while so released. On a showing of probable cause that the  
12 defendant committed any offense during the period of release, a judicial  
13 officer may revoke the defendant's release pursuant to section 13-3968.
- 14           D. After providing notice to the victim pursuant to section 13-4406, a  
15 judicial officer may impose any of the following conditions on a person who  
16 is released on his own recognizance or on bail:
- 17           1. Place the person in the custody of a designated person or  
18 organization agreeing to supervise him.  
19           2. Place restrictions on the person's travel, associates or place of  
20 abode during the period of release.  
21           3. Require the deposit with the clerk of the court of cash or other  
22 security, such deposit to be returned on the performance of the conditions of  
23 release.  
24           4. Prohibit the person from possessing any dangerous weapon or  
25 engaging in certain described activities or indulging in intoxicating liquors  
26 or certain drugs.  
27           5. Require the person to report regularly to and remain under the  
28 supervision of an officer of the court.  
29           6. Impose any other conditions deemed reasonably necessary to assure  
30 appearance as required including a condition requiring that the person return  
31 to custody after specified hours.
- 32           E. In addition to any of the conditions a judicial officer may impose  
33 pursuant to subsection D of this section, the judicial officer shall impose  
34 both of the following conditions on a person who is charged with a felony  
35 violation of chapter 14 or 35.1 of this title and who is released on his own  
36 recognizance or on bail:
- 37           1. Electronic monitoring where available.  
38           2. A condition prohibiting the person from having any contact with the  
39 victim.
- 40           F. The judicial officer who authorizes the release of the person  
41 charged on his own recognizance or on bail shall do all of the following:
- 42           1. Issue an appropriate order containing statements of the conditions  
43 imposed.  
44           2. Inform the person of the penalties that apply to any violation of  
45 the conditions of release.

1           3. Advise the person that a warrant for his arrest may be issued  
2 immediately on any violation of the conditions of release, INCLUDING THE  
3 FAILURE TO SUBMIT TO DEOXYRIBONUCLEIC ACID TESTING ORDERED PURSUANT TO  
4 PARAGRAPH 4 OF THIS SUBSECTION.

5           4. IF THE PERSON IS CHARGED WITH A FELONY OR MISDEMEANOR OFFENSE  
6 LISTED IN SECTION 13-610, SUBSECTION 0, PARAGRAPH 3, ORDER THE PERSON TO  
7 REPORT WITHIN FIVE DAYS TO THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY THAT ARRESTED THE  
8 PERSON OR TO THE AGENCY'S DESIGNEE AND SUBMIT A SUFFICIENT SAMPLE OF BUCCAL  
9 CELLS OR OTHER BODILY SUBSTANCES FOR DEOXYRIBONUCLEIC ACID TESTING AND  
10 EXTRACTION.

11           G. At any time after providing notice to the victim pursuant to  
12 section 13-4406, the judicial officer who orders the release of a person on  
13 any condition specified in this section or the court in which a prosecution  
14 is pending may amend the order to employ additional or different conditions  
15 of release, including either an increase or reduction in the amount of  
16 bail. On application, the defendant shall be entitled to have the conditions  
17 of release reviewed by the judicial officer who imposed them or by the court  
18 in which the prosecution is pending. Reasonable notice of the application  
19 shall be given to the county attorney and the victim.

20           H. Any information that is stated or offered in connection with any  
21 order pursuant to this section need not conform to the rules pertaining to

31           K. For the purposes of this section and section 13-3968, "judicial  
32 officer" means any person or court authorized pursuant to the constitution or  
33 laws of this state to bail or otherwise release a person before trial or  
34 sentencing or pending appeal.

35           Sec. 5. Section 38-886.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to

37           38-886.01. Ordinary disability retirement; qualifications;

40           A. ~~Full-time dispatchers who are employed by an employer of an~~  
41 ~~eligible group as defined in section 38-842~~ A MEMBER may retire and receive  
42 an ordinary disability pension if the local board finds that all of the  
43 following conditions occur:

44           1. An application for disability retirement is filed with the  
45 retirement plan or the local board by either the member or the member's

14 DISABILITY PENSION IS EQUAL TO A FRACTION TIMES THE MEMBER'S NORMAL  
15 RETIREMENT PENSION THAT IS COMPUTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 38-885, SUBSECTION C  
16 AS IF THE MEMBER HAD TWENTY YEARS OF CREDITED SERVICE. THE FRACTION IS THE  
17 RESULT OBTAINED BY DIVIDING THE MEMBER'S ACTUAL YEARS OF CREDITED SERVICE,

19           Sec. 8. Private prison bed contracting  
20           A. Notwithstanding the repeal of Laws 2006, chapter 348, section 4,  
21 the department of administration, in consultation with the state department  
22 of corrections, shall revise the request for proposals developed pursuant to  
23 Laws 2006, chapter 348, section 4 to eliminate the state department of  
24 corrections as an eligible bidder and to eliminate any opening date  
25 requirements. Notwithstanding section 41-1609.01, subsections G and K and  
26 section 41-1609.02, subsection B, Arizona Revised Statutes, the department of  
27 administration shall reissue the revised request for proposals to contract
