CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

HB 2011 - liquefied petroleum gas containers; penalties- DO PASS

Joshua Spears, Public Safety Committee Intern, explained HB 2011.

Barry Aarons, Lobbyist, Arizona Propane Gas Association, testified in support of HB 2011.

Senator Melvin noted the individuals who registered their position on the bill. (Attachment A).

Senator Melvin moved HB 2011 be returned with a DO PASS recommendation. The motion CARRIED with a roll call vote of 6-0-1 (Attachment 1).

HB 2065 - community based residential treatment; placement- DO PASS

Joshua Spears, Public Safety Committee Intern, explained HB 2065.

Representative Heather Carter, bill sponsor, further explained the bill and answered questions posed by the Committee.

Charles Flanagan, Director, Arizona Department of Juvenile Corrections, distributed a handout entitled "Just the Facts" (Attachment B), testified in support of HB 2065 and answered questions posed by the Committee.

Senator Melvin noted the individuals who registered their position on the bill. (Attachment A).

Senator Melvin moved HB 2065 be returned with a DO PASS recommendation. The motion CARRIED with a roll call vote of 6-0-1 (Attachment 2).

HB 2317 - fingerprint clearance card; expired use- DO PASS
