## AN ACT

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: Section 1. Section 28-101, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended by 2 Laws 2018, chapter 9, section 1, chapter 163, section 1, chapter 166, 3 4 section 1, chapter 306, section 1 and chapter 324, section 1, is amended 5 to read: 6 28-101. <u>Definitions</u> 7 In this title, unless the context otherwise requires: 8 1. "Alcohol" means any substance containing any form of alcohol, 9 including ethanol, methanol, propynol and isopropynol. 10 2. "Alcohol concentration" if expressed as a percentage means 11 either: 12 (a) The number of grams of alcohol per one hundred milliliters of 13 blood. 14 (b) The number of grams of alcohol per two hundred ten liters of 15 breath. 3. "All-terrain vehicle" means either of the following: 16 17 (a) A motor vehicle that satisfies all of the following: 18 (i) Is designed primarily for recreational nonhighway all-terrain 19 travel. 20 (ii) Is fifty or fewer inches in width. 21 (iii) Has an unladen weight of one thousand two hundred pounds or 22 less. 23 (iv) Travels on three or more nonhighway tires. 24 (v) Is operated on a public highway. 25 (b) A recreational off-highway vehicle that satisfies all of the 26 following: 27 (i) Is designed primarily for recreational nonhighway all-terrain 28 travel. 29 (ii) Is eighty or fewer inches in width. 30 (iii) Has an unladen weight of two thousand five hundred pounds or 31 less. 32 (iv) Travels on four or more nonhighway tires. 33 (v) Has a steering wheel for steering control. 34 (vi) Has a rollover protective structure. 35 (vii) Has an occupant retention system. 36 4. "Authorized emergency vehicle" means any of the following: 37 (a) A fire department vehicle. 38 (b) A police vehicle. 39 (c) An ambulance or emergency vehicle of a municipal department or 40 public service corporation that is designated or authorized by the department or a local authority. 41 (d) Any other ambulance, fire truck or rescue vehicle that is 42 43 authorized by the department in its sole discretion and that meets 44 liability insurance requirements prescribed by the department.

5. "Autocycle" means a three-wheeled motorcycle on which the driver and passengers ride in a fully or partially enclosed seating area that is equipped with a roll cage, safety belts for each occupant and antilock brakes and that is designed to be controlled with a steering wheel and pedals.

6. "Aviation fuel" means all flammable liquids composed of a 7 mixture of selected hydrocarbons expressly manufactured and blended for 8 the purpose of effectively and efficiently operating an internal 9 combustion engine for use in an aircraft but does not include fuel for jet 10 or turbine powered aircraft.

11 7. "Bicycle" means a device, including a racing wheelchair, that is 12 propelled by human power and on which a person may ride and that has 13 either:

14 (a) Two tandem wheels, either of which is more than sixteen inches 15 in diameter.

16 (b) Three wheels in contact with the ground, any of which is more 17 than sixteen inches in diameter.

18

8. "Board" means the transportation board.

9. "Bus" means a motor vehicle designed for carrying sixteen or
 more passengers, including the driver.

10. "Business district" means the territory contiguous to and including a highway if there are buildings in use for business or industrial purposes within any six hundred feet along the highway, including hotels, banks or office buildings, railroad stations and public buildings that occupy at least three hundred feet of frontage on one side or three hundred feet collectively on both sides of the highway.

27 11. "Certificate of ownership" means a paper or an electronic
28 record that is issued in another state or a foreign jurisdiction and that
29 indicates ownership of a vehicle.

30 12. "Certificate of title" means a paper document or an electronic 31 record that is issued by the department and that indicates ownership of a 32 vehicle.

13. "Combination of vehicles" means a truck or truck tractor and semitrailer and any trailer that it tows but does not include a forklift designed for the purpose of loading or unloading the truck, trailer or semitrailer.

37 14. "Controlled substance" means a substance so classified under 38 section 102(6) of the controlled substances act (21 United States Code 39 section 802(6)) and includes all substances listed in schedules I through 40 V of 21 Code of Federal Regulations part 1308.

15. "Conviction" means:

42 (a) An unvacated adjudication of guilt or a determination that a
43 person violated or failed to comply with the law in a court of original
44 jurisdiction or by an authorized administrative tribunal.

1 (b) An unvacated forfeiture of bail or collateral deposited to 2 secure the person's appearance in court. (c) A plea of guilty or no contest accepted by the court. 3 4 (d) The payment of a fine or court costs. "County highway" means a public road that is constructed and 5 16. 6 maintained by a county. 7 17. "Dealer" means a person who is engaged in the business of 8 buying, selling or exchanging motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers and 9 who has an established place of business and has paid fees pursuant to 10 section 28-4302. 11 18. "Department" means the department of transportation acting 12 directly or through its duly authorized officers and agents. 19. "Digital network or software application" has the same meaning 13 14 prescribed in section 28-9551. 20. "Director" 15 of means the director the department of 16 transportation. 17 21. "Drive" means to operate or be in actual physical control of a 18 motor vehicle. 19 22. "Driver" means a person who drives or is in actual physical 20 control of a vehicle. 21 "Driver license" means a license that is issued by a state to 23. 22 an individual and that authorizes the individual to drive a motor vehicle. 23 24. "Electric bicycle" means a bicycle or tricycle that is equipped 24 with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than seven 25 hundred fifty watts and that meets the requirements of one of the 26 following classes: 27 (a) "Class 1 electric bicycle" means a bicycle or tricycle that is 28 equipped with an electric motor that provides assistance only when the 29 rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle 30 or tricycle reaches the speed of twenty miles per hour. 31 (b) "Class 2 electric bicycle" means a bicycle or tricycle that is 32 equipped with an electric motor that may be used exclusively to propel the 33 bicycle or tricycle and that is not capable of providing assistance when 34 the bicycle or tricycle reaches the speed of twenty miles per hour. 35 (c) "Class 3 electric bicycle" means a bicycle or tricycle that is 36 equipped with an electric motor that provides assistance only when the 37 rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle 38 or tricycle reaches the speed of twenty-eight miles per hour. 39 "ELECTRIC MINIATURE SCOOTER" MEANS A DEVICE THAT: 25. 40 (a) WEIGHS LESS THAN THIRTY POUNDS. (b) HAS TWO OR THREE WHEELS. 41 42 (c) HAS HANDLEBARS. (d) HAS A FLOORBOARD ON WHICH A PERSON MAY STAND WHILE RIDING. 43 (e) IS POWERED BY AN ELECTRIC MOTOR OR HUMAN POWER, OR BOTH. 44

1	(f) HAS A MAXIMUM SPEED THAT DOES NOT EXCEED TEN MILES PER HOUR,
2	WITH OR WITHOUT HUMAN PROPULSION, ON A PAVED LEVEL SURFACE.
3	<del>25.</del> 26. "Electric personal assistive mobility device" means a
4	self-balancing device with one wheel or two nontandem wheels and an
5	electric propulsion system that limits the maximum speed of the device to
6	fifteen miles per hour or less and that is designed to transport only one
7	person.
8	27. "ELECTRIC STANDUP SCOOTER":
9	(a) MEANS A DEVICE THAT:
10	(i) WEIGHS LESS THAN SEVENTY-FIVE POUNDS.
11	(ii) HAS TWO OR THREE WHEELS.
12	(iii) HAS HANDLEBARS.
13	(iv) HAS A FLOORBOARD ON WHICH A PERSON MAY STAND WHILE RIDING.
14	(v) IS POWERED BY AN ELECTRIC MOTOR OR HUMAN POWER, OR BOTH.
15	(vi) HAS A MAXIMUM SPEED THAT DOES NOT EXCEED TWENTY MILES PER
16	HOUR, WITH OR WITHOUT HUMAN PROPULSION, ON A PAVED LEVEL SURFACE.
17	(b) DOES NOT INCLUDE AN ELECTRIC MINIATURE SCOOTER.
18	<del>26.</del> 28. "Evidence" includes both of the following:
18 19	(a) A display on a wireless communication device of a
20	department-generated driver license, nonoperating identification license,

23 24	(b) An electronic or digital license plate authorized pursuant to
24 25	section 28-364.
25 26	27. 29. "Farm" means any lands primarily used for agriculture
20 27	production.
28	28. 30. "Farm tractor" means a motor vehicle designed and used
20 29	-
29 30	primarily as a farm implement for drawing implements of husbandry. <del>29.</del> 31. "Foreign vehicle" means a motor vehicle, trailer or
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	semitrailer that is brought into this state other than in the ordinary
32	course of business by or through a manufacturer or dealer and that has not
33	been registered in this state.
34	<del>30.</del> 32. "Golf cart" means a motor vehicle that has not less than
35	three wheels in contact with the ground, that has an unladen weight of
36	less than one thousand eight hundred pounds, that is designed to be and is
37	operated at not more than twenty-five miles per hour and that is designed
38	to carry not more than four persons including the driver.
39	31. 33. "Hazardous material" means a material, and its mixtures or
40	solutions, that the United States department of transportation determines
41	under 49 Code of Federal Regulations is, or any quantity of a material
42	listed as a select agent or toxin under 42 Code of Federal Regulations
43	part 73 that is, capable of posing an unreasonable risk to health, safety
44	and property if transported in commerce and that is required to be

1 placarded or marked as required by the department's safety rules 2 prescribed pursuant to chapter 14 of this title.

3 32. 34. "Implement of husbandry" means a vehicle that is designed 4 primarily for agricultural purposes and that is used exclusively in the 5 conduct of agricultural operations, including an implement or vehicle 6 whether self-propelled or otherwise that meets both of the following 7 conditions:

8 (a) Is used solely for agricultural purposes including the 9 preparation or harvesting of cotton, alfalfa, grains and other farm crops.

10 (b) Is only incidentally operated or moved on a highway whether as 11 a trailer or self-propelled unit. For the purposes of this subdivision, 12 "incidentally operated or moved on a highway" means travel between a farm 13 and another part of the same farm, from one farm to another farm or 14 between a farm and a place of repair, supply or storage.

15 33. 35. "Limousine" means a motor vehicle providing prearranged 16 ground transportation service for an individual passenger, or a group of 17 passengers, that is arranged in advance or is operated on a regular route 18 or between specified points and includes ground transportation under a 19 contract or agreement for services that includes a fixed rate or time and 20 is provided in a motor vehicle with a seating capacity not exceeding 21 fifteen passengers including the driver.

34. 36. "Livery vehicle" means a motor vehicle that:

(a) Has a seating capacity not exceeding fifteen passengersincluding the driver.

(b) Provides passenger services for a fare determined by a flat
 rate or flat hourly rate between geographic zones or within a geographic
 area.

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(c) Is available for hire on an exclusive or shared ride basis.

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(d) May do any of the following:

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(i) Operate on a regular route or between specified places.

31 (ii) Offer prearranged ground transportation service as defined in 32 section 28-141.

(iii) Offer on demand ground transportation service pursuant to a
 contract with a public airport, licensed business entity or organization.

35 <del>35.</del> 37. "Local authority" means any county, municipal or other 36 local board or body exercising jurisdiction over highways under the 37 constitution and laws of this state.

38 36. "Manufacturer" means a person engaged in the business of
 39 manufacturing motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers.

40 37. 39. "Moped" means a bicycle, not including an electric 41 bicycle, AN ELECTRIC MINIATURE SCOOTER OR AN ELECTRIC STANDUP SCOOTER, 42 that is equipped with a helper motor if the vehicle has a maximum piston 43 displacement of fifty cubic centimeters or less, a brake horsepower of one 44 and one-half or less and a maximum speed of twenty-five miles per hour or 45 less on a flat surface with less than a one percent grade. 1 38. 40. "Motorcycle" means a motor vehicle that has a seat or 2 saddle for the use of the rider and that is designed to travel on not more 3 than three wheels in contact with the ground but excludes a tractor, an 4 electric bicycle, AN ELECTRIC MINIATURE SCOOTER, AN ELECTRIC STANDUP 5 SCOOTER and a moped.

6 <del>39.</del> 41. "Motor driven cycle" means a motorcycle, including every 7 motor scooter, with a motor that produces not more than five horsepower 8 but does not include an electric bicycle, AN ELECTRIC MINIATURE SCOOTER OR 9 AN ELECTRIC STANDUP SCOOTER.

10 40. 42. "Motorized quadricycle" means a self-propelled motor 11 vehicle to which all of the following apply:

12 (a) The vehicle is self-propelled by an emission-free electric
 13 motor and may include pedals operated by the passengers.

14 (b) The vehicle has at least four wheels in contact with the 15 ground.

16 (c) The vehicle seats at least eight passengers, including the 17 driver.

18 (d) The vehicle is operable on a flat surface using solely the 19 electric motor without assistance from the pedals or passengers.

20 (e) The vehicle is a commercial motor vehicle as defined in section 21 28-5201.

(f) The vehicle is a limousine operating under a vehicle for hirecompany permit issued pursuant to section 28-9503.

24 (g) The vehicle is manufactured by a motor vehicle manufacturer 25 that is licensed pursuant to chapter 10 of this title.

(h) The vehicle complies with the definition and standards for
low-speed vehicles set forth in federal motor vehicle safety standard 500
and 49 Code of Federal Regulations sections 571.3(b) and 571.500,
respectively.

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41. 43. "Motor vehicle":

(a) Means either:

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(i) A self-propelled vehicle.

33 (ii) For the purposes of the laws relating to the imposition of a 34 tax on motor vehicle fuel, a vehicle that is operated on the highways of 35 this state and that is propelled by the use of motor vehicle fuel.

36 (b) Does not include a personal delivery device, a motorized
 37 wheelchair, an electric personal assistive mobility device, an electric
 38 bicycle, AN ELECTRIC MINIATURE SCOOTER, AN ELECTRIC STANDUP SCOOTER or a
 39 motorized skateboard. For the purposes of this subdivision:

40 (i) "Motorized skateboard" means a self-propelled device THAT DOES 41 NOT HAVE HANDLEBARS AND that has a motor, a deck on which a person may 42 ride and at least two tandem wheels in contact with the ground.

43 (ii) "Motorized wheelchair" means a self-propelled wheelchair that44 is used by a person for mobility.

1 42. 44. "Motor vehicle fuel" includes all products that are commonly or commercially known or sold as gasoline, including casinghead 2 gasoline, natural gasoline and all flammable liquids, and that are 3 4 composed of a mixture of selected hydrocarbons expressly manufactured and 5 blended for the purpose of effectively and efficiently operating internal 6 combustion engines. Motor vehicle fuel does not include inflammable 7 liquids that are specifically manufactured for racing motor vehicles and 8 that are distributed for and used by racing motor vehicles at a racetrack, 9 use fuel as defined in section 28-5601, aviation fuel, fuel for jet or 10 turbine powered aircraft or the mixture created at the interface of two 11 different substances being transported through a pipeline, commonly known 12 as transmix.

1343.45."Neighborhood electric vehicle" means a self-propelled14electrically powered motor vehicle to which all of the following apply:

15

(a) The vehicle is emission free.

16 (b) The vehicle has at least four wheels in contact with the 17 ground.

18 (c) The vehicle complies with the definition and standards for 19 low-speed vehicles set forth in federal motor vehicle safety standard 500 20 and 49 Code of Federal Regulations sections 571.3(b) and 571.500, 21 respectively.

22 44. 46. "Nonresident" means a person who is not a resident of this 23 state as defined in section 28-2001.

45. 47. "Off-road recreational motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle that is designed primarily for recreational nonhighway all-terrain travel and that is not operated on a public highway. Off-road recreational motor vehicle does not mean a motor vehicle used for construction, building trade, mining or agricultural purposes.

29 46. 48. "Operator" means a person who drives a motor vehicle on a 30 highway, who is in actual physical control of a motor vehicle on a highway 31 or who is exercising control over or steering a vehicle being towed by a 32 motor vehicle.

33 34 47. 49. "Owner" means:

(a) A person who holds the legal title of a vehicle.

35 (b) If a vehicle is the subject of an agreement for the conditional 36 sale or lease with the right of purchase on performance of the conditions 37 stated in the agreement and with an immediate right of possession vested 38 in the conditional vendee or lessee, the conditional vendee or lessee.

39 (c) If a mortgagor of a vehicle is entitled to possession of the 40 vehicle, the mortgagor.

41 48. 50. "Pedestrian" means any person afoot. A person who uses an 42 electric personal assistive mobility device or a manual or motorized 43 wheelchair is considered a pedestrian unless the manual wheelchair 44 qualifies as a bicycle. For the purposes of this paragraph, "motorized wheelchair" means a self-propelled wheelchair that is used by a person for mobility.

3 49. 51. "Personal delivery device" means an electronically powered 4 device that:

5 (a) Is operated primarily on sidewalks and within crosswalks and 6 that is designed to transport property.

7 (b) Weighs less than two hundred pounds, excluding cargo, unless 8 otherwise authorized by a local authority pursuant to section 28-627.

9 (c) Operates at a maximum speed of seven miles per hour, unless 10 otherwise authorized by a local authority pursuant to section 28-627.

11 (d) Is equipped with technology to allow for the operation of the 12 device with or without the active control or monitoring of a natural 13 person.

14 (e) Is equipped with a braking system that when active or engaged 15 enables the personal delivery device to come to a controlled stop.

16 50. 52. "Power sweeper" means an implement, with or without motive 17 power, that is only incidentally operated or moved on a street or highway 18 and that is designed for the removal of debris, dirt, gravel, litter or 19 sand whether by broom, vacuum or regenerative air system from asphaltic 20 concrete or cement concrete surfaces, including parking lots, highways, 21 streets and warehouses, and a vehicle on which the implement is 22 permanently mounted.

51. 53. "Public transit" means the transportation of passengers on scheduled routes by means of a conveyance on an individual passenger fare-paying basis excluding transportation by a sightseeing bus, school bus or taxi or a vehicle not operated on a scheduled route basis.

27 52. 54. "Reconstructed vehicle" means a vehicle that has been 28 assembled or constructed largely by means of essential parts, new or used, derived from vehicles or makes of vehicles of various names, models and 29 30 types or that, if originally otherwise constructed, has been materially altered by the removal of essential parts or by the addition or 31 32 substitution of essential parts, new or used, derived from other vehicles or makes of vehicles. For the purposes of this paragraph, "essential 33 34 parts" means integral and body parts, the removal, alteration or 35 substitution of which will tend to conceal the identity or substantially 36 alter the appearance of the vehicle.

37 53. 55. "Residence district" means the territory contiguous to and 38 including a highway not comprising a business district if the property on 39 the highway for a distance of three hundred feet or more is in the main 40 improved with residences or residences and buildings in use for business.

41 54. 56. "Right-of-way" when used within the context of the 42 regulation of the movement of traffic on a highway means the privilege of 43 the immediate use of the highway. Right-of-way when used within the 44 context of the real property on which transportation facilities and appurtenances to the facilities are constructed or maintained means the lands or interest in lands within the right-of-way boundaries.

3 55. 57. "School bus" means a motor vehicle that is designed for 4 carrying more than ten passengers and that is either:

5 (a) Owned by any public or governmental agency or other institution 6 and operated for the transportation of children to or from home or school 7 on a regularly scheduled basis.

8 (b) Privately owned and operated for compensation for the 9 transportation of children to or from home or school on a regularly 10 scheduled basis.

11 56. 58. "Semitrailer" means a vehicle that is with or without 12 motive power, other than a pole trailer or single-axle tow dolly, that is 13 designed for carrying persons or property and for being drawn by a motor 14 vehicle and that is constructed so that some part of its weight and that 15 of its load rests on or is carried by another vehicle. For the purposes 16 of this paragraph, "pole trailer" has the same meaning prescribed in 17 section 28-601.

18 57. 59. "Single-axle tow dolly" means a nonvehicle device that is 19 drawn by a motor vehicle, that is designed and used exclusively to 20 transport another motor vehicle and on which the front or rear wheels of 21 the drawn motor vehicle are mounted on the tow dolly while the other 22 wheels of the drawn motor vehicle remain in contact with the ground.

23 58. 60. "State" means a state of the United States and the 24 District of Columbia.

25 59. 61. "State highway" means a state route or portion of a state 26 route that is accepted and designated by the board as a state highway and 27 that is maintained by the state.

28 <del>60.</del> 62. "State route" means a right-of-way whether actually used 29 as a highway or not that is designated by the board as a location for the 30 construction of a state highway.

31 61. 63. "Street" or "highway" means the entire width between the 32 boundary lines of every way if a part of the way is open to the use of the 33 public for purposes of vehicular travel.

34 62. 64. "Taxi" means a motor vehicle that has a seating capacity 35 not exceeding fifteen passengers, including the driver, that provides 36 passenger services and that:

37 (a) Does not primarily operate on a regular route or between38 specified places.

39 (b) Offers local transportation for a fare determined on the basis
40 of the distance traveled or prearranged ground transportation service as
41 defined in section 28-141 for a predetermined fare.

42 63. 65. "Title transfer form" means a paper or an electronic form 43 that is prescribed by the department for the purpose of transferring a 44 certificate of title from one owner to another owner. 1 66. "Traffic survival school" means a school that offers educational sessions to drivers who are required to 2 attend and successfully complete educational sessions pursuant to this title that are 3 4 designed to improve the safety and habits of drivers and that are approved 5 by the department.

6 65. 67. "Trailer" means a vehicle that is with or without motive 7 power, other than a pole trailer or single-axle tow dolly, that is 8 designed for carrying persons or property and for being drawn by a motor 9 vehicle and that is constructed so that no part of its weight rests on the 10 towing vehicle. A semitrailer equipped with an auxiliary front axle 11 commonly known as a dolly is deemed to be a trailer. For the purposes of 12 this paragraph, "pole trailer" has the same meaning prescribed in section 13 28-601.

14 66. 68. "Transportation network company" has the same meaning 15 prescribed in section 28-9551.

16 67. 69. "Transportation network company vehicle" has the same 17 meaning prescribed in section 28-9551.

68. 70. "Transportation network service" has the same meaning 18 19 prescribed in section 28-9551.

20 <del>69.</del> 71. "Truck" means a motor vehicle designed or used primarily 21 for the carrying of property other than the effects of the driver or passengers and includes a motor vehicle to which has been added a box, a 22 23 platform or other equipment for such carrying.

24 70. 72. "Truck tractor" means a motor vehicle that is designed and 25 used primarily for drawing other vehicles and that is not constructed to 26 carry a load other than a part of the weight of the vehicle and load 27 drawn.

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71. 73. "Vehicle":

29 (a) Means a device in, on or by which a person or property is or 30 may be transported or drawn on a public highway. 31

(b) Does not include:

32 (i) Electric bicycles, ELECTRIC MINIATURE SCOOTERS. ELECTRIC 33 STANDUP SCOOTERS and devices moved by human power.

(ii) Devices used exclusively on stationary rails or tracks.

34 35 36

(iii) Personal delivery devices.

72. 74. "Vehicle transporter" means either:

37 (a) A truck tractor capable of carrying a load and drawing a 38 semitrailer.

"Authorized emergency vehicle" means any of the following: 37 38 (a) A fire department vehicle. 39 (b) A police vehicle. 40 (c) An ambulance or emergency vehicle of a municipal department or public service corporation that is designated or authorized by the 41 department or a local authority. 42 (d) Any other ambulance, fire truck or rescue vehicle that is 43 44 authorized by the department in its sole discretion and that meets 45 liability insurance requirements prescribed by the department.

5. "Autocycle" means a three-wheeled motorcycle on which the driver and passengers ride in a fully or partially enclosed seating area that is equipped with a roll cage, safety belts for each occupant and antilock brakes and that is designed to be controlled with a steering wheel and pedals.

H. This section does not grant other powers or benefits to traffic 26 27 investigators to which peace officers of this state are entitled.

9 A. An operator of an electric bicycle OR AN ELECTRIC STANDUP 10 SCOOTER is granted all the rights and privileges and is subject to all of 11 the duties of a person riding a bicycle. Except as otherwise provided in 12 this section OR AS OTHERWISE REGULATED BY A LOCAL AUTHORITY, an electric 13 bicycle OR AN ELECTRIC STANDUP SCOOTER is subject to the same provisions 14 of this title as a bicycle.

15 B. An electric bicycle OR AN ELECTRIC STANDUP SCOOTER is not 16 subject to the provisions of this title relating to certificates of title, 17 registration, vehicle license tax, driver licenses or vehicle insurance.

18 C. Beginning January 1, 2019, manufacturers and distributors of 19 electric bicycles shall apply a label that is permanently affixed, in a 20 prominent location, to each electric bicycle. The label shall contain the 21 classification number, top assisted speed and motor wattage of the 22 electric bicycle and shall be printed in at least nine-point type.

D. A class 1 electric bicycle, or a class 2 electric bicycle OR AN ELECTRIC STANDUP SCOOTER may be used on bicycle and multiuse paths. A local authority or agency of this state having jurisdiction over a bicycle or multiuse path may prohibit the operation of a class 1 electric bicycle, or class 2 electric bicycle OR ELECTRIC STANDUP SCOOTER on the path.

E. A class 3 electric bicycle may not be operated on a bicycle or multiuse path unless it is within or adjacent to a highway or roadway or unless the local authority or agency of this state having jurisdiction over the path allows the operation.

F. AN ELECTRIC STANDUP SCOOTER MUST HAVE A UNIQUE IDENTIFICATION
 THAT CONSISTS OF BOTH LETTERS AND NUMBERS AND THAT IS VISIBLE FROM A
 DISTANCE OF AT LEAST FIVE FEET. THE IDENTIFICATION:
