CHAPTER 402
SENATE BILL 1851

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 36-217, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO THE ARIZONA STATE HOSPITAL.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 36-217, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 36-217. State hospital; annual report

5 A. On or before January 1 of each year, the director shall submit
6 to the governor, the speaker of the house of representatives and the
7 president of the senate a financial and programmatic report on the state
8 hospital for the preceding fiscal year. IN ADDITION TO INFORMATION THAT
9 THE DEPARTMENT DEEMS RELEVANT, this report shall include ALL OF THE
10 FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

11 1. All revenues and expenditures of the state hospital, including
12 specific identification of administrative costs for and the number of
13 ~~persons~~ PATIENTS served at the state hospital.

14 2. A BREAKDOWN OF THE PATIENTS SERVED AT EACH FACILITY AT THE STATE
15 HOSPITAL, INCLUDING INFORMATION ON THE FOLLOWING:

16 (a) GENDER.

17 (b) RACE.

18 (c) AGE.

19 (d) LEGAL STATUS.

20 (e) COUNTY OF ORIGIN.

21 (f) PROGRAM TYPE.

22 (g) CENSUS BY UNIT.

23 (h) PRIMARY DIAGNOSIS OF EACH BY CATEGORY.

24 (i) LENGTH OF STAY.

25 3. ADMISSIONS BY CIVIL COMMITMENT, INCLUDING THE NUMBER OF
26 ADMISSIONS AND DISCHARGES, THE TIME BETWEEN THE REQUEST FOR EACH ADMISSION
27 AND THE DATE OF THE ADMISSION OR DENIAL OF THE ADMISSION AND AGGREGATE
28 DATA FOR REASON OF DENIAL BY CATEGORY.

29 4. DATA COLLECTED FROM THE STATE HOSPITAL'S SAFETY PLAN, INCLUDING
30 ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

31 (a) THE NUMBER AND TYPE OF ALL ASSAULTS BY CATEGORY, WITH SEXUAL
32 ASSAULTS REPORTED AS A SEPARATE CATEGORY.

33 (b) THE NUMBER OF ASSAULTS REPORTED TO LAW ENFORCEMENT, REGULATORY
34 AGENCIES AND ACCREDITATION AGENCIES.

35 (c) THE NUMBER OF TIMES LAW ENFORCEMENT WAS CALLED TO THE STATE
36 HOSPITAL IN RESPONSE TO AN ASSAULT.

37 5. AN UPDATE ON THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A PSYCHIATRIC CENTER OF
38 EXCELLENCE.

39 B. THIS SECTION DOES NOT REQUIRE THE RELEASE OF INDIVIDUALLY
40 IDENTIFIABLE HEALTH INFORMATION OF ANY SPECIFIC PATIENT.

41 Sec. 2. Request for information: Arizona state hospital
42 surveillance system

43 On or before October 1, 2021, the department of health services in
44 coordination with the department of administration shall issue a request
45 for information for a surveillance system for the state hospital that

1 includes both audio and video capability and adequate storage of the audio
2 and visual files. The storage requirements should be consistent with
3 other hospitals serving similar populations. The request for information
4 may include the requirements for the civil and forensic units separately.

5 Sec. 3. Joint legislative psychiatric hospital review
6 council; members; duties; reports; delayed repeal

7 A. The joint legislative psychiatric hospital review council is
8 established consisting of the following members:

9 1. Two members of the house of representatives who are not members
10 of the same political party and who are appointed by the speaker of the
11 house of representatives. The speaker of the house of representatives
12 shall designate one of these members to serve as cochairperson of the
13 committee.

14 2. Two members of the senate who are not members of the same
15 political party and who are appointed by the president of the senate. The
16 president of the senate shall designate one of these members to serve as
17 cochairperson of the committee.

18 3. The director of the Arizona health care cost containment system
19 or the director's designee.

20 4. The director of the department of health services or the
21 director's designee.

22 5. A judge of a superior court in which cases involving persons
23 with serious mental illness are routinely adjudicated who is appointed by
24 the speaker of the house of representatives.

25 6. A person who provides legal representation to and advocates on
26 behalf of persons with serious mental illness who is appointed by the
27 president of the senate.

28 7. A family member of a person with serious mental illness who is
29 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.

30 8. A psychiatrist who specializes in treating persons with serious
31 mental illness and who is appointed by the president of the senate.

32 B. Review council members are not eligible to receive compensation
33 but are eligible for reimbursement of expenses under title 38, chapter 4,
34 article 2, Arizona Revised Statutes.

35 C. The review council shall review, analyze and make
36 recommendations regarding at least the following:

37 1. Psychiatric hospital capacity in this state, including the bed
38 capacity at the Arizona state hospital and other public facilities.

39 2. The role of private facilities in addressing psychiatric
40 treatment needs.

41 3. Innovative programs to ensure public safety while providing
42 clinically appropriate treatment in the most integrated setting.

43 4. Legal barriers.

44 5. Current waiting lists.

45 6. Barriers to accessing appropriate inpatient care.

1 7. Licensing barriers.

2 8. Any other issues related to inpatient psychiatric treatment.

3 D. The cochairpersons of the review council shall invite subject
4 matter experts from the fields of law, behavioral health and behavioral
5 health system development to advise the review council.

6 E. On or before December 31, 2021 and December 31, 2022, the review
7 council shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the
8 speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate and
9 the governor and shall provide a copy of the reports to the secretary of
10 state.

11 F. This section is repealed from and after August 31, 2023.
