AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 12-1178, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; APPROPRIATING MONIES;
RELATING TO EVICTIONS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
2 Section 1. Section 12-1178, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 12-1178. Judgment; writ of restitution; limitation on
5 issuance and enforcement; criminal violation;
6 notice

7 A. If the defendant is found guilty of forcible entry and detainer
8 or forcible detainer, the court shall give judgment for the plaintiff for
9 restitution of the premises, for all charges stated in the rental
10 agreement and for damages, attorney fees, court and other costs and, at
11 the plaintiff's option, all rent found to be due and unpaid through the
12 periodic rental period, as described in section 33-1314, subsection C, as
13 provided for in the rental agreement, and shall grant a writ of
14 restitution. The person designated by the judge to prepare the judgment
15 shall ensure that the defendant's social security number is not contained
16 on the judgment.

17 B. If the defendant is found not guilty of forcible entry and
18 detainer or forcible detainer, judgment shall be given for the defendant
19 against the plaintiff for damages, attorney fees and court and other
20 costs, and if it appears that the plaintiff has acquired possession of the
21 premises since commencement of the action, a writ of restitution shall
22 issue in favor of the defendant.

23 C. No writ of restitution shall issue until the expiration of five
24 calendar days after the rendition of judgment. The writ of restitution
25 shall NOT be enforced ~~as promptly and expeditiously as possible UNTIL AT~~
~~LEAST SEVEN CALENDAR DAYS AFTER THE DATE THAT THE WRIT OF RESTITUTION IS~~
~~ISSUED~~. The issuance or enforcement of a writ of restitution shall not be
26 suspended, delayed or otherwise affected by the filing of a motion to set
27 aside or vacate the judgment or similar motion unless a judge finds good
28 cause.

29 D. A defendant who is lawfully served with a writ of restitution
30 and who remains in or returns to the dwelling unit, as defined in section
31 33-1310, or remains on or returns to the mobile home space, as defined in
32 section 33-1409, or the recreational vehicle space, as defined in section
33 33-2102, without the express permission of the owner of the property or
34 the person with lawful control of the property commits criminal trespass
35 in the third degree pursuant to section 13-1502.

36 E. If the defendant is found guilty of forcible entry and detainer
37 or forcible detainer, the court shall give the defendant notice that a
38 defendant who is lawfully served with a writ of restitution and who
39 remains in or returns to the dwelling unit or remains on or returns to the
40 mobile home space or the recreational vehicle space without the express
41 permission of the owner of the property or the person with lawful control
42 of the property commits criminal trespass in the third degree pursuant to
43 section 13-1502.

1 Sec. 2. Appropriation: department of economic security:
2 rental assistance; exemption

3 A. The sum of \$290,000,000 is appropriated from the state general
4 fund in fiscal year 2022-2023 to the department of economic security to
5 distribute for rental assistance. The department shall allocate at least
6 \$10,000,000 of the amount appropriated pursuant to this section to
7 distribute for rental assistance to persons who are at least sixty-five
8 years of age.

9 B. The appropriation made in subsection A of this section is exempt
10 from the provisions of section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating
11 to lapsing of appropriations.
