AN ACT

AMENDING LAWS 2022, CHAPTER 218, SECTION 1; MAKING CAPITAL OUTLAY APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE DIFFERENT DEPARTMENTS OF THE STATE AND FOR STATE INSTITUTIONS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
2 Section 1. Laws 2022, chapter 218, section 1 is amended to read:
3 Section 1. Appropriation; department of transportation;
4 Interstate 10; widening; exemption
5 A. The sum of \$400,000,000 is appropriated from the state ~~general~~
6 HIGHWAY fund ESTABLISHED BY SECTION 28-6991, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, in
7 fiscal year 2022-2023 to the department of transportation to widen
8 Interstate 10 between Chandler and Casa Grande. The department shall use
9 the monies for construction-related activities, including drawing down
10 federal matching monies for the project.
11 B. The appropriation made in subsection A of this section is exempt
12 from the provisions of section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating
13 to lapsing of appropriations.
14 Building Renewal
15 Sec. 2. Capital outlay appropriations; major maintenance and
16 repair of state buildings
17 A. Notwithstanding section 41-793.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, the
18 amounts appropriated in this section are appropriated for fiscal year
19 2022-2023 to be used by the applicable agency for major maintenance and
20 repair activities for state buildings in accordance with title 41, chapter
21 4, article 7, Arizona Revised Statutes.
22 B. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION \$53,594,200

25 Capital outlay stabilization fund \$16,000,000
26 The department of administration shall allocate the monies to state
27 agencies for necessary building renewal. If monies in the capital outlay
28 stabilization fund established by section 41-792.01, Arizona Revised
29 Statutes, are insufficient to fund the appropriation to the department of
30 administration for building renewal, the appropriation to the department
31 of administration is reduced by the difference between the amount
32 appropriated to the department of administration from the capital outlay
33 stabilization fund and the balance in the capital outlay stabilization
34 fund. Notwithstanding title 41, chapter 4, article 7, Arizona Revised
35 Statutes, the department of administration may use monies appropriated for
36 building renewal in fiscal year 2022-2023 for building projects related to

21 A. The following amounts are appropriated from the state general
22 fund in fiscal year 2022-2023 to the department of administration for the
23 following capital projects:

25 The department shall distribute the monies to a nonprofit
26 organization that is designated as an international dark sky discovery
27 center and that is focused on dark sky preservation in Arizona.

- 28 2. Northern Arizona observatory \$ 5,000,000

29 The department shall distribute the monies to a nonprofit
30 organization that operates an astronomy center and observatory that is
31 open to the public in northern Arizona.

- 32 3. Homeless veterans housing \$ 2,386,600

33 The department of administration shall distribute the monies to a
34 nonprofit organization in northern Arizona that partners with the United
35 States department of veterans affairs to provide affordable housing units
36 to homeless and at-risk veterans on a historical military campus.

11 4. Diné college student center \$ 8,000,000

15 The department of administration shall distribute the monies to the
16 Navajo Nation for costs associated with site preparation for the Teesto
17 multipurpose community center.

18 6. Dilkon center improvements \$ 3,000,000

19 The department of administration shall distribute the monies to the
20 Navajo Nation for costs associated with improvements to the Dilkon center.

21 7. Kayenta judicial complex \$ 2,000,000

22 The department of administration shall distribute the monies to the
23 Navajo Nation for costs associated with improvements to the Kayenta
24 judicial complex.

25 B. Notwithstanding section 41-1252, Arizona Revised Statutes, the
26 appropriations made in this section are not subject to review by the joint
27 committee on capital review.

1 B. The Arizona state parks board may use up to ten percent of the
2 monies from any project listed in subsection A of this section to pay for
3 costs associated with another project listed in subsection A of this
4 section. After review by the joint committee on capital review, the
5 Arizona state parks board may use more than ten percent of the monies
6 appropriated for a project in subsection A of this section to pay for
7 costs associated with another project listed in subsection A of this
8 section.

9 C. Before the Arizona state parks board spends any monies in the
10 smartphone application line item, the Arizona strategic enterprise
11 technology office shall submit, on behalf of the Arizona state parks
12 board, an expenditure plan to the joint legislative budget committee for
13 review. The expenditure plan shall include the project cost,
14 deliverables, timeline for completion and method of procurement consistent
15 with the department's prior reports for its appropriation from the
16 automation projects fund pursuant to section 41-714, Arizona Revised
17 Statutes.

18 D. The Arizona state parks board shall report promptly to the joint
19 committee on capital review and the governor's office of strategic
20 planning and budgeting if the board revises the plan for any project for
21 which monies are appropriated by this section because the board receives
22 land and water conservation grant funding.

23 Sec. 7. Appropriations; Arizona board of regents; capital
24 project; exemption

25 A. The sum of \$12,000,000 is appropriated from the state general
26 fund in fiscal year 2022-2023 to the Arizona board of regents to
27 distribute to the university of Arizona for capital improvements to the
28 mining, mineral and natural resources educational museum.

29 B. Notwithstanding section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, the
30 appropriation made in this section that is unexpended on June 30, 2024
31 reverts to the fund from which the monies were appropriated.

32 Department of Transportation Statewide Highway Construction

33 Sec. 8. Appropriations; department of transportation; highway
34 construction; intent; reports; exemption; lapsing

35 A. The following amounts are appropriated from the state highway
36 fund established by section 28-6991, Arizona Revised Statutes, in fiscal
37 year 2022-2023 to the department of transportation for the following
38 highway projects:

- 39 1. Design and construct additional vehicle
40 lanes, separated by a lighted median,
41 on Interstate 10 between State Route 85
42 and Citrus Road \$64,200,000

1 The legislature intends that:

2 (a) Not more than one hundred twenty days after the effective date
3 of this section, the city of Buckeye contribute \$3,000,000 to the project
4 described in this paragraph.

5 (b) The Maricopa association of governments collect and contribute

39 E. The appropriations made in subsection A of this section do not

 41 accomplished or abandoned or the appropriations stand for a full fiscal
 42 year without an expenditure or encumbrance.

36 A. The sum of \$25,000,000 is appropriated from the state general
37 fund in fiscal year 2022-2023 to the department of transportation for the
38 Loop 101 slip ramp access project.

39 B. Notwithstanding section 41-1252, Arizona Revised Statutes, the
40 appropriation made in this section is not subject to review by the joint
41 committee on capital review.

1 amount for each of fiscal years 2023-2024, 2024-2025, 2025-2026 and
2 2026-2027 to the directors of the joint legislative budget committee and
3 the governor's office of strategic planning and budgeting. This report
4 shall include state highway fund statewide construction bonds, Arizona

35 department of administration is exempt from the provisions of section
36 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating to lapsing of appropriations,
37 until June 30, 2023.

38 B. Notwithstanding section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, and
39 Laws 2021, chapter 406, section 35, the \$50,000,000 appropriated to the
40 department of transportation by Laws 2021, chapter 406, section 35 in
41 fiscal year 2020-2021 to widen Interstate 10 between Phoenix and Casa

1 Sec. 22. Use of appropriations: limitation

2 A. The department of administration may spend up to five percent of
3 the amounts appropriated to the department in this section, excluding
4 amounts to be distributed to nonstate agencies, for expenditures for
5 project management of building renewal and capital projects. All other
6 monies appropriated to the department in this section may not be spent for
7 personal services or employee-related expenditures or for maintenance
8 contracts on building components and equipment without review by the joint
9 committee on capital review.

10 B. Except as provided in subsection A of this section, the monies
11 appropriated in this act may not be spent for personal services or
12 employee-related expenditures of state employees, excluding any services
13 provided as part of the inmate construction program for correctional
14 facilities.
