## AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 15-393, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, AS AMENDED BY LAWS 2021, CHAPTER 252, SECTION 1 AND CHAPTER 404, SECTION 14; REPEALING SECTION 15-393, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, AS AMENDED BY LAWS 2021, CHAPTER 252, SECTION 1 AND CHAPTER 416, SECTION 2; AMENDING SECTION 15-393.01, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION DISTRICTS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 15-393, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended by  
3 Laws 2021, chapter 252, section 1 and chapter 404, section 14, is amended  
4 to read:

5 15-393. Career technical education district governing board;  
6 report; definitions

7 A. The management and control of a career technical education  
8 district are vested in the career technical education district governing  
9 board, including the content and quality of the courses offered by the  
10 district, the quality of teachers who provide instruction on behalf of the  
11 district, the salaries of teachers who provide instruction on behalf of  
12 the district and the reimbursement of other entities for the facilities  
13 used by the district. This section does not restrict a school district  
14 from offering any career and technical education course that does not  
15 qualify for funding as a career technical education course or career  
16 technical education district program. Unless the governing boards of the  
17 school districts participating in the formation of the career technical  
18 education district vote to implement an alternative election system as  
19 provided in subsection B of this section, the career technical education  
20 board consists of five members elected from five single member districts  
21 formed within the career technical education district. The single member  
22 district election system shall be submitted as part of the plan for the  
23 career technical education district pursuant to section 15-392 and shall  
24 be established in the plan as follows:

25 1. The governing boards of the school districts participating in  
26 the formation of the career technical education district shall define the  
27 boundaries of the single member districts so that the single member  
28 districts are as nearly equal in population as is practicable, except that  
29 if the career technical education district lies in part in each of two or  
30 more counties, at least one single member district may be entirely within  
31 each of the counties comprising the career technical education district if  
32 this district design is consistent with the obligation to equalize the  
33 population among single member districts.

34 2. The boundaries of each single member district shall follow  
35 election precinct boundary lines, as far as practicable, in order to avoid  
36 further segmentation of the precincts.

37 3. A person who is a registered voter of this state and who has  
38 been a resident of the single member district for at least one year  
39 immediately preceding the date of the election is eligible for election to  
40 the office of career technical education board member from the single  
41 member district. The terms of office of the members of the career  
42 technical education board shall be as prescribed in section 15-427,  
43 subsection B. An employee of a career technical education district or the  
44 spouse of an employee shall not hold membership on a governing board of a  
45 career technical education district by which the employee is employed. A

1 member of one school district governing board or career technical  
2 education district governing board is ineligible to be a candidate for  
3 nomination or election to or serve simultaneously as a member of any other  
4 governing board, except that a member of a governing board may be a  
5 candidate for nomination or election for any other governing board if the  
6 member is serving in the last year of a term of office. A member of a  
7 governing board shall resign the member's seat on the governing board  
8 before becoming a candidate for nomination or election to the governing  
9 board of any other school district or career technical education district,  
10 unless the member of the governing board is serving in the last year of a  
11 term of office. Members of a career technical education district  
12 governing board are subject to the conflict of interest requirements  
13 prescribed in section 38-503.

14 4. Nominating petitions shall be signed by the number of qualified  
15 electors of the single member district as provided in section 16-322.

16 B. The governing boards of the school districts participating in  
17 the formation of the career technical education district may vote to  
18 implement any other alternative election system for the election of career  
19 technical education district board members. If an alternative election  
20 system is selected, it shall be submitted as part of the plan for the  
21 career technical education district pursuant to section 15-392, and the  
22 implementation of the system shall be as approved by the United States  
23 justice department.

24 C. Career technical education districts are subject to the  
25 following provisions of this title:

- 26 1. Chapter 1, articles 1 through 6.
- 27 2. Sections 15-208, 15-210, 15-213 and 15-234.
- 28 3. Articles 2, 3 and 5 of this chapter.
- 29 4. Section 15-361.
- 30 5. Chapter 4, articles 1, 2 and 5.
- 31 6. Chapter 5, articles 1 and 3.
- 32 7. Sections 15-701.01, 15-722, 15-723, 15-724, 15-727, 15-728,  
33 15-729 and 15-730.
- 34 8. Chapter 7, article 5.
- 35 9. Chapter 8, articles 1, 3 and 4.
- 36 10. Sections 15-828 and 15-829.
- 37 11. Chapter 9, article 1, article 6, except for section 15-995, and  
38 article 7.
- 39 12. Sections 15-941, 15-943.01, 15-952, 15-953 and 15-973.
- 40 13. Sections 15-1101 and 15-1104.
- 41 14. Chapter 10, articles 2, 3, 4 and 8.

42 D. Notwithstanding subsection C of this section, the following  
43 apply to a career technical education district:

1           1. A career technical education district may issue bonds for the  
2 purposes specified in section 15-1021 and in chapter 4, article 5 of this  
3 title to an amount in the aggregate, including the existing indebtedness,  
4 not exceeding one percent of the net assessed value of the full cash value  
5 of the property within the career technical education district. For the  
6 purposes of this paragraph, "full cash value" and "net assessed value"  
7 have the same meanings prescribed in section 42-11001.

8           2. The number of governing board members for a career technical  
9 education district shall be as prescribed in subsection A of this section.

10          3. The student count for the first year of operation of a career  
11 technical education district as provided in this article shall be  
12 determined as follows:

13           (a) Determine the estimated student count for career technical  
14 education district classes that will operate in the first year of  
15 operation. This estimate shall be based on actual registration of pupils  
16 as of March 30 scheduled to attend classes that will be operated by the  
17 career technical education district. The student count for the school  
18 district of residence of the pupils registered at the career technical  
19 education district shall be adjusted. The adjustment shall cause the  
20 school district of residence to reduce the student count for the pupil to  
21 reflect the courses to be taken at the career technical education  
22 district. The school district of residence shall review and approve the  
23 adjustment of its own student count as provided in this subdivision before  
24 the pupils from the school district can be added to the student count of  
25 the career technical education district.

26           (b) The student count for the new career technical education  
27 district shall be the student count as determined in subdivision (a) of  
28 this paragraph.

29           (c) For the first year of operation, the career technical education  
30 district shall revise the student count to the actual average daily  
31 membership as prescribed in section 15-901, subsection A, paragraph 1 for  
32 students attending classes in the career technical education district. A  
33 career technical education district shall revise its student count, the  
34 base support level as provided in section 15-943.02, the revenue control  
35 limit as provided in section 15-944.01 and the district additional  
36 assistance as provided in section 15-962.01 before May 15. A career  
37 technical education district that overestimated its student count shall  
38 revise its budget before May 15. A career technical education district  
39 that underestimated its student count may revise its budget before May 15.

40           (d) After March 15 of the first year of operation, the school  
41 district of residence shall adjust its student count by reducing it to  
42 reflect the courses actually taken at the career technical education  
43 district. The school district of residence shall revise its student  
44 count, the base support level as provided in section 15-943, the revenue  
45 control limit as provided in section 15-944 and the district additional

1 assistance as provided in section 15-962.01 prior to May 15. A district  
2 that underestimated the student count for students attending the career  
3 technical education district shall revise its budget before May 15. A  
4 district that overestimated the student count for students attending the  
5 career technical education district may revise its budget before May 15.

6 (e) The procedures for implementing this paragraph shall be as  
7 prescribed in the uniform system of financial records.

8 For the purposes of this paragraph, "school district of residence" means  
9 the school district that included the pupil in its average daily  
10 membership for the year before the first year of operation of the career  
11 technical education district and that would have included the pupil in its  
12 student count for the purposes of computing its base support level for the  
13 fiscal year of the first year of operation of the career technical  
14 education district if the pupil had not enrolled in the career technical  
15 education district.

16 4. A student includes any person enrolled in the career technical  
17 education district without regard to the person's age or high school  
18 graduation status, except that:

19 (a) A student in a kindergarten program or in any of grades one  
20 through eight who enrolls in courses offered by the career technical  
21 education district shall not be included in the career technical education  
22 district's student count or average daily membership.

23 (b) A student in a kindergarten program or in any of grades one  
24 through eight who is enrolled in career and technical education courses  
25 shall not be funded in whole or in part with monies provided by a career  
26 technical education district, except that a pupil in grade eight may be  
27 funded with monies generated by the \$.05 qualifying tax rate authorized in  
28 subsection F of this section.

29 (c) A student who has graduated from high school or received a  
30 general equivalency diploma or who is over twenty-one years of age shall  
31 not be included in the student count of the career technical education  
32 district for the purposes of chapter 9, articles 3, 4 and 5 of this title.

33 5. A career technical education district may operate for more than  
34 one hundred eighty days per year, **OR LESS**, with ~~expanded hours of service~~  
35 **THE EQUIVALENT NUMBER OF HOURS OF INSTRUCTION**.

36 6. A career technical education district may use the carryforward  
37 provisions of section 15-943.01.

38 7. A school district that is part of a career technical education  
39 district shall use any monies received pursuant to this article to  
40 supplement and not supplant base year career and technical education  
41 courses, and directly related equipment and facilities, except that a  
42 school district that is part of a career technical education district and  
43 that has used monies received pursuant to this article to supplant career  
44 and technical education courses that were offered before the first year  
45 that the school district participated in the career technical education

1 district or the first year that the school district used monies received  
2 pursuant to this article or that used the monies for purposes other than  
3 for career and technical education courses shall use one hundred percent  
4 of the monies received pursuant to this article to supplement and not  
5 supplant base year career and technical education courses. Each  
6 applicable school district shall provide a report to the career technical  
7 education board and the department of education outlining the required  
8 maintenance of effort and how monies were used to supplement and not  
9 supplant base year career and technical education courses and directly  
10 related equipment and facilities.

11 8. A career technical education district shall use any monies  
12 received pursuant to this article to enhance and not supplant career and  
13 technical education courses and directly related equipment and facilities.

14 9. A career technical education district or a school district that  
15 is part of a career technical education district or a charter school shall  
16 only include pupils in grades nine through twelve and pupils in the school  
17 year immediately following graduation in the calculation of student count  
18 or average daily membership if the pupils are enrolled in courses that are  
19 approved jointly by the governing board of the career technical education  
20 district and each participating school district or charter school for  
21 satellite courses taught within the participating school district or  
22 charter school, or approved solely by the career technical education  
23 district for centrally located courses. Funding may be provided for not  
24 more than four years for the same student. Student count and average  
25 daily membership from courses that are not part of an approved program for  
26 career and technical education shall not be included in student count and  
27 average daily membership of a career technical education district.

28 E. The career technical education board shall appoint a  
29 superintendent as the executive officer of the career technical education  
30 district.

31 F. Taxes may be levied for the support of the career technical  
32 education district as prescribed in chapter 9, article 6 of this title,  
33 except that a career technical education district shall not levy a  
34 property tax pursuant to law that exceeds \$.05 per \$100 assessed valuation  
35 except for bond monies pursuant to subsection D, paragraph 1 of this  
36 section. Except for the taxes levied pursuant to section 15-994, such  
37 taxes shall be obtained from a levy of taxes on the taxable property used  
38 for secondary tax purposes.

39 G. The schools in the career technical education district are  
40 available to all persons who reside in the career technical education  
41 district and to pupils whose school district of residence within this  
42 state is paying tuition on behalf of the pupils to a district of  
43 attendance that is a member of the career technical education district,  
44 subject to the rules for admission prescribed by the career technical  
45 education board.

1 H. The career technical education board may collect tuition for  
2 adult students and the attendance of pupils who are residents of school  
3 districts that are not participating in the career technical education  
4 district pursuant to arrangements made between the governing board of the  
5 school district and the career technical education board.

6 I. The career technical education board may accept gifts, grants,  
7 federal monies, tuition and other allocations of monies to erect, repair  
8 and equip buildings and for the cost of operating the schools of the  
9 career technical education district.

10 J. One member of the career technical education board shall be  
11 selected chairman. The chairman shall be selected annually on a rotation  
12 basis from among the participating school districts. The chairman of the  
13 career technical education board shall be a voting member.

14 K. A career technical education board and a community college  
15 district may enter into agreements to provide for administrative,  
16 operational and educational services and facilities.

17 L. Any agreement between the governing board of a career technical  
18 education district and another career technical education district, a  
19 school district, a charter school or a community college district shall be  
20 in the form of an intergovernmental agreement or other written contract.  
21 The auditor general shall modify the uniform system of financial records  
22 and budget forms in accordance with this subsection. The  
23 intergovernmental agreement or other written contract shall completely and  
24 accurately specify each of the following:

25 1. The financial provisions of the intergovernmental agreement or  
26 other written contract and the format for the billing of all services.

27 2. The accountability provisions of the intergovernmental agreement  
28 or other written contract.

29 3. The responsibilities of each career technical education  
30 district, each school district, each charter school and each community  
31 college district that is a party to the intergovernmental agreement or  
32 other written contract.

33 4. The type of instruction that will be provided under the  
34 intergovernmental agreement or other written contract, including  
35 individualized education programs pursuant to section 15-763.

36 5. The quality of the instruction that will be provided under the  
37 intergovernmental agreement or other written contract.

38 6. The transportation services that will be provided under the  
39 intergovernmental agreement or other written contract and the manner in  
40 which transportation costs will be paid.

41 7. The amount that the career technical education district will  
42 contribute to a course and the amount of support required by the school  
43 district, the charter school or the community college.

1           8. That the services provided by the career technical education  
2 district, the school district, the charter school or the community college  
3 district be proportionally calculated in the cost of delivering the  
4 service.

5           9. That the payment for services shall not exceed the cost of the  
6 services provided.

7           10. That the career technical education district will provide the  
8 following minimum services for all member districts:

9           (a) Professional development of career and technical teachers in  
10 the career technical education district who are teaching programs or  
11 courses at a satellite campus.

12           (b) Ongoing evaluation and support of satellite campus programs and  
13 courses to ensure quality and compliance.

14           11. An itemized listing of other goods and services that are  
15 provided to the member district and that are paid for by the retention of  
16 satellite campus student funding.

17           M. A member school district or charter school may not submit  
18 requests to approve or add satellite campus career technical education  
19 district programs or courses directly to the career and technical  
20 education division of the department of education, but shall submit all  
21 appropriate application documentation and materials for programs or  
22 courses to the career technical education district. On approval from the  
23 career technical education board, a career technical education district  
24 shall only submit requests to approve or add satellite campus career  
25 technical education district programs or courses directly to the career  
26 and technical education division of the department of education, which  
27 shall determine whether the criteria prescribed in section 15-391,  
28 paragraphs 2 and 4 have been met. If the career and technical education  
29 division of the department of education determines that a course does not  
30 meet the criteria for approval as a career technical education course, the  
31 governing board of the career technical education district may appeal this  
32 decision to the state board of education acting as the state board of  
33 vocational education.

34           N. Notwithstanding any other law, the average daily membership for  
35 a pupil who is enrolled in a career technical education course and who  
36 does not meet the criteria specified in subsection P, ~~OR~~ Q OR R of this  
37 section shall be 0.25 for each course, except the sum of the average daily  
38 membership shall not exceed the limits prescribed by subsection D, P, ~~OR~~ Q  
39 OR R of this section, as applicable.

40           O. If a career and technical education course or program is  
41 provided on a satellite campus, the sum of the average daily membership,  
42 as provided in section 15-901, subsection A, paragraph 1, for that pupil  
43 in the school district or charter school and career technical education  
44 district shall not exceed 1.25. The school district or charter school and  
45 the career technical education district shall determine the apportionment



1 of the average daily membership for that pupil between the school district  
 2 or charter school and the career technical education district. A pupil  
 3 who attends a course or program at a satellite campus and who is not  
 4 enrolled in the school district or charter school where the satellite  
 5 campus is located may generate the average daily membership OF UP TO 0.25  
 6 FOR ONE HUNDRED FIFTY HOURS OF INSTRUCTION RECEIVED DURING ANY HOUR OF THE  
 7 DAY, DURING ANY DAY OF THE WEEK AND AT ANY TIME BETWEEN JULY 1 AND JUNE 30  
 8 OF EACH FISCAL YEAR pursuant to this subsection if the pupil is enrolled  
 9 in a school district that is a member district in the same career  
 10 technical education district.

11 P. The sum of the average daily membership of a pupil who is  
 12 enrolled in both the school district and career technical education course  
 13 or career technical education program provided by a community college  
 14 pursuant to subsection K of this section or at a centralized campus shall  
 15 not exceed 1.75. THE AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP FOR A PUPIL WHO IS ENROLLED  
 16 IN A CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION COURSE OR CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION  
 17 PROGRAM PROVIDED BY A COMMUNITY COLLEGE SHALL BE 0.25 FOR THE ACCUMULATION  
 18 OF EVERY THREE COMMUNITY COLLEGE CREDITS FOR WHICH A STUDENT IS ENROLLED  
 19 IN CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION COURSES. The member school district and the  
 20 career technical education district shall determine the apportionment of  
 21 the average daily membership and student enrollment for that pupil between  
 22 the member school district and the career technical education district,  
 23 except that the amount apportioned shall not exceed 1.0 for either entity.  
 24 Notwithstanding any other law, the average daily membership for a pupil  
 25 who is in grade nine, ten, eleven or twelve or in the school year  
 26 immediately following graduation and who is enrolled in a course that  
 27 meets for at least one hundred fifty minutes per class period at a  
 28 centralized campus shall be 0.75. ~~Students in an approved career~~  
 29 ~~technical education district centralized campus program may generate an~~  
 30 ~~average daily membership during any day of the week and at any time~~  
 31 ~~between July 1 and June 30 of each fiscal year.~~ To qualify for funding  
 32 pursuant to this subsection, a centralized campus shall offer programs and  
 33 courses to all eligible students in each member district of the career  
 34 technical education district. STUDENTS IN AN APPROVED CAREER TECHNICAL  
 35 EDUCATION PROGRAM MAY GENERATE AN AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP OF UP TO 1.75  
 36 FOR INSTRUCTION RECEIVED DURING ANY HOUR OF THE DAY, DURING ANY DAY OF THE  
 37 WEEK AND AT ANY TIME BETWEEN JULY 1 AND JUNE 30 OF EACH FISCAL  
 38 YEAR. AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP SHALL NOT BE CALCULATED ON THE ONE  
 39 HUNDREDTH DAY OF INSTRUCTION FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION. AVERAGE  
 40 DAILY MEMBERSHIP SHALL BE CALCULATED BY DIVIDING THE INSTRUCTIONAL HOURS  
 41 OF ENROLLMENT BY SIX HUNDRED HOURS, EXCEPT THAT:

- 42 1. AT LEAST ONE HUNDRED FIFTY HOURS AND LESS THAN THREE HUNDRED
- 43 HOURS EQUALS 0.25 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.
- 44 2. AT LEAST THREE HUNDRED HOURS AND LESS THAN FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY
- 45 HOURS EQUALS 0.5 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

1           3. AT LEAST FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY HOURS AND LESS THAN SIX HUNDRED  
2 HOURS EQUALS 0.75 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

3           4. AT LEAST SIX HUNDRED HOURS EQUALS 1.0 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

4           Q. The average daily membership for a pupil who is in grade nine,  
5 ten, eleven or twelve or in the school year immediately following  
6 graduation and who is enrolled in a course that meets for at least one  
7 hundred fifty minutes per class period at a leased centralized campus  
8 shall not exceed 0.75. ~~Students in an approved career technical education~~  
9 ~~district leased campus centralized program may generate an average daily~~  
10 ~~membership during any day of the week and at any time between July 1 and~~  
11 ~~June 30 of each fiscal year.~~ STUDENTS IN AN APPROVED CAREER TECHNICAL  
12 EDUCATION PROGRAM PROVIDED BY A LEASED CENTRALIZED CAMPUS MAY GENERATE AN  
13 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP FOR INSTRUCTION RECEIVED DURING ANY HOUR OF THE  
14 DAY, DURING ANY DAY OF THE WEEK AND AT ANY TIME BETWEEN JULY 1 AND JUNE 30  
15 OF EACH FISCAL YEAR. AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP SHALL BE CALCULATED BY  
16 DIVIDING THE INSTRUCTIONAL HOURS OF ENROLLMENT BY SIX HUNDRED HOURS,  
17 EXCEPT THAT:

18           1. AT LEAST ONE HUNDRED FIFTY HOURS AND LESS THAN THREE HUNDRED  
19 HOURS EQUALS 0.25 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

20           2. AT LEAST THREE HUNDRED HOURS AND LESS THAN FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY  
21 HOURS EQUALS 0.5 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

22           3. AT LEAST FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY HOURS AND LESS THAN SIX HUNDRED  
23 HOURS EQUALS 0.75 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

24           4. AT LEAST SIX HUNDRED HOURS EQUALS 1.0 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

25           R. The sum of the average daily membership, as provided in section  
26 15-901, subsection A, paragraph 1, of a pupil who is enrolled in both the  
27 school district and in career technical education courses provided at a  
28 leased centralized campus shall not exceed 1.75 if all of the following  
29 conditions are met:

30           1. The course qualifies as a career technical education course.

31           2. The course is offered to all eligible students in each member  
32 district of the career technical education district and enrolls students  
33 from multiple high schools.

34           3. The career technical education district program in which the  
35 course is included addresses a specific industry need and has been  
36 developed in cooperation with that industry, or the leased facility is a  
37 state or federal asset that would otherwise be unused or underutilized.

38           4. The lease is established at fair market value if the lease is  
39 executed for a facility located on the site of a member district and was  
40 approved by the joint committee on capital review, except that a lease  
41 that was executed or renewed before December 31, 2012 is not subject to  
42 approval by the joint committee on capital review.

43           ~~R.~~ S. A student who is enrolled in an accommodation school may be  
44 treated as a student of the school district in which the student  
45 physically resides for the purposes of enrollment in a career technical

1 education district and shall be included in the calculation of average  
2 daily membership for either the career technical education district or the  
3 accommodation school, or both.

4 ~~S.~~ T. Notwithstanding any other law, the student count for a  
5 career technical education district shall be equivalent to the career  
6 technical education district's average daily membership. STUDENTS IN AN  
7 APPROVED CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM PROVIDED BY A SATELLITE  
8 CAMPUS, CENTRALIZED CAMPUS OR LEASED CENTRALIZED CAMPUS MAY GENERATE AN  
9 AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP OF UP TO 1.75 FOR INSTRUCTION RECEIVED DURING ANY  
10 HOUR OF THE DAY, DURING ANY DAY OF THE WEEK AND AT ANY TIME BETWEEN JULY 1  
11 AND JUNE 30 OF EACH FISCAL YEAR. AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP SHALL NOT BE  
12 CALCULATED ON THE ONE HUNDREDTH DAY OF INSTRUCTION FOR THE PURPOSES OF  
13 THIS SECTION. THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT RESTRICT THE INSTRUCTIONAL TIME BY  
14 LIMITING THE PARTICULAR DAYS OF THE WEEK OR TIME OF THE FISCAL YEAR FOR  
15 INSTRUCTION TO OCCUR.

16 ~~F.~~ U. A school district or charter school may not prohibit or  
17 discourage students who are enrolled in that school district or charter  
18 school from attending courses offered by a career technical education  
19 district, including requiring students to generate a full 1.0 average  
20 daily membership or to enroll in more courses than are needed to graduate  
21 before enrolling in and attending programs or courses offered by a career  
22 technical education district.

10 review of the career and technical education division pursuant to section  
11 15-393, subsection W.

12 7. A listing of any programs or courses that were continued by  
13 review of the career and technical education division pursuant to section  
14 15-393, subsection W.

15 8. A listing of any programs or courses that were added by the  
16 career and technical education division.

17 9. For applicable school districts, the required maintenance of  
18 effort and how monies were used to supplement and not supplant base year  
19 career and technical education courses, including expenditures related to  
20 personnel, equipment and facilities.

21 10. For students who meet the requirements to receive funding  
22 pursuant to section 15-393, subsection ~~W~~ X, students enrolled in an  
23 internship course and students enrolled in the year immediately following  
24 graduation, a separate listing of the following information for each  
25 district:

26 (a) Average daily membership.

27 (b) The actual student count.

28 (c) Enrollment by course or program and persistence at each grade  
29 level toward completion of the program.

30 (d) The percentage of students who completed each program.

31 (e) The number of certifications and licenses earned by students  
32 delineated by those who attended a satellite program and those who  
33 attended a centralized campus.

34 11. Any other data or information deemed necessary by the  
35 department of education.

36 D. The office of the auditor general, in consultation with the  
37 department of education, shall develop and establish uniform cost  
38 reporting guidelines, policies and procedures for career technical  
39 education district programs. Any guideline, policy or procedure shall  
40 allow for the effective comparison of cost between career technical  
41 education district programs.
