# **HB 2071**

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 16-547, 16-548 AND 16-551, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES;  
RELATING TO EARLY VOTING.

(TEXT OF BILL BEGINS ON NEXT PAGE)

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:  
2       Section 1. Section 16-547, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4           16-547. Ballot affidavit; form

5       A. The early ballot shall be accompanied by an envelope bearing on  
6 the front the name, official title and post office address of the recorder  
7 or other officer in charge of elections and on the other side a printed  
8 affidavit in substantially the following form:

9           I declare the following under penalty of perjury: I am  
10          a registered voter in \_\_\_\_\_ county Arizona, I have not  
11          voted and will not vote in this election in any other county  
12          or state, I understand that knowingly voting more than once in  
13          any election is a class 5 felony and I voted the enclosed  
14          ballot and signed this affidavit personally unless noted  
15          below.

16          If the voter was assisted by another person in marking  
17          the ballot, complete the following:

18           I declare the following under penalty of perjury: At  
19          the registered voter's request I assisted the voter identified  
20          in this affidavit with marking the voter's ballot, I marked  
21          the ballot as directly instructed by the voter, I provided the  
22          assistance because the voter was physically unable to mark the  
23          ballot solely due to illness, injury or physical limitation  
24          and I understand that there is no power of attorney for voting  
25          and that the voter must be able to make the voter's selection  
26          even if **they THE VOTER** cannot physically mark the ballot.

29       B. The face of each envelope in which a ballot is sent to a federal  
30          postcard applicant or in which a ballot is returned by the applicant to  
31          the recorder or other officer in charge of elections shall be in the form  
32          prescribed in accordance with the uniformed and overseas citizens absentee  
33          voting act ~~of 1986~~ (P.L. 99-410; 52 United States Code section 20301).  
34          Otherwise, the envelopes shall be the same as those used to send ballots  
35          to, or receive ballots from, other early voters.

36       C. The officer charged by law with the duty of preparing ballots at  
37          any election shall ensure that the early ballot is sent in an envelope  
38          that states substantially the following:

39           If the addressee does not reside at this address, mark  
40          the unopened envelope "return to sender" and deposit it in the  
41          United States mail.

42       D. The county recorder or other officer in charge of elections  
43          shall supply printed instructions to early voters that direct them to sign  
44          the affidavit, mark the ballot and return both in the enclosed

1 self-addressed envelope that complies with section 16-545. The  
2 instructions shall include the following statement:

3 In order to be valid and counted, the ballot and  
4 affidavit must be delivered to the office of the county  
5 recorder or other officer in charge of elections or may be  
6 deposited at any polling place in the county ~~to~~ NOT later than  
7 7:00 p.m. on election day. **IF THE BALLOT AND AFFIDAVIT ARE  
8 MAILED TO THE COUNTY RECORDER OR OTHER OFFICER IN CHARGE OF  
9 ELECTIONS AND POSTMARKED ON OR BEFORE THE SIXTH DAY BEFORE  
10 ELECTION DAY, THE BALLOT IS VALID IF RECEIVED NOT LATER THAN  
11 FIVE DAYS AFTER ELECTION DAY.** The ballot will not be counted  
12 without the voter's signature on the envelope.

13 (WARNING – It is a felony to offer or receive any compensation  
14 for a ballot.)

15 Sec. 2. Section 16-548, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
16 read:

17 **16-548. Preparation and transmission of ballot**

18 A. The early voter shall make and sign the affidavit and shall then  
19 mark ~~this~~ THE ballot in such a manner that ~~this~~ THE EARLY VOTER'S vote  
20 cannot be seen. The early voter shall fold the ballot, if a paper ballot,  
21 so as to conceal the vote and deposit the voted ballot in the envelope  
22 provided for that purpose, which shall be securely sealed and, together  
23 with the affidavit, delivered or mailed to the county recorder or other  
24 officer in charge of elections of the political subdivision in which the  
25 elector is registered or deposited by the voter or the voter's agent at  
26 any polling place in the county. In order to be counted and valid, the  
27 ballot must **COMPLY WITH ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:**

28 1. Be received by the county recorder or other officer in charge of  
29 elections ~~or~~ NOT LATER THAN 7:00 P.M. ON ELECTION DAY.

30 2. BE deposited at any polling place in the county ~~to~~ NOT later  
31 than 7:00 p.m. on election day.

32 3. **IF POSTMARKED NOT LATER THAN THE SIXTH DAY BEFORE ELECTION DAY,  
33 BE RECEIVED BY THE COUNTY RECORDER OR OTHER OFFICER IN CHARGE OF ELECTIONS  
34 NOT LATER THAN FIVE DAYS AFTER ELECTION DAY.**

35 B. If the early voter is an overseas citizen, a qualified elector  
36 absent from the United States or in the United States service, a spouse or  
37 dependent residing with the early voter or a qualified elector of a  
38 special district mail ballot election as provided in article 8.1 of this  
39 chapter, the early voter may subscribe to the affidavit before and obtain  
40 the signature and military identification number or passport number, if  
41 available, of any person who is a United States citizen eighteen years of  
42 age or older.

1 Sec. 3. Section 16-551, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
2 read:

3 **16-551. Early election board; violation; classification**

4 A. The board of supervisors or the governing body of the political  
5 subdivision shall appoint one or more early election boards to serve at  
6 places to be designated by the board of supervisors or the governing body  
7 to canvass and tally early election ballots. Members of early election  
8 boards shall be selected in accordance with the provisions for selecting  
9 members of regular election boards as provided in section 16-531.

10 B. If an electronic voting system is in use for early voting, the  
11 early election board shall consist of at least one inspector and two  
12 judges who shall perform the processing requirements in accordance with  
13 the rules issued by the secretary of state. The inspector and judges  
14 shall be appointed in the same manner by party as provided in section  
15 16-531.

16 C. All early ballots received by the county recorder or other  
17 officer in charge of elections before 7:00 p.m. on election day and the  
18 original affidavit of the voter shall be delivered to the early election  
19 boards for processing as provided in the rules of the secretary of  
20 state. MAILED EARLY BALLOTS THAT ARE POSTMARKED NOT LATER THAN THE SIXTH  
21 DAY BEFORE ELECTION DAY AND THAT ARE RECEIVED NOT LATER THAN FIVE DAYS  
22 AFTER ELECTION DAY ARE ELIGIBLE TO BE PROCESSED. The office of the county  
23 recorder or other officer in charge of elections shall remain open until  
24 7:00 p.m. on election day for the purpose of receiving early ballots. ~~in~~  
25 ~~no event shall~~ Partial or complete tallies of the early election board  
26 SHALL NOT be released or divulged before all precincts have reported or  
27 one hour after the closing of the polls on election day, whichever occurs  
28 first. ~~, and~~ Any person who unlawfully releases information regarding vote  
29 tallies or who possesses a tally sheet or summary without authorization  
30 from the recorder or officer in charge of elections is guilty of a class 6  
31 felony.

32 D. The necessary printed blanks for poll lists, tally lists, lists  
33 of voters, ballots, oaths and returns, together with envelopes in which to  
34 enclose the returns, shall be furnished by the board of supervisors or the  
35 governing body of the political subdivision to the early election board  
36 for each election precinct at the expense of the county or the political  
37 subdivision.

39 This act is effective from and after December 31, 2022.
