AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 44-1613, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO HOUSEHOLD GOODS MOVERS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
2 Section 1. Section 44-1613, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 **44-1613. Unlawful moving practices**

5 A. Except as provided in section 44-1614, after taking possession
6 of a consumer's household goods, a household goods mover may not refuse to
7 deliver or unload a consumer's household goods or enforce, or threaten to
8 enforce, a carrier's lien against a consumer's household goods when **THE**
9 **HOUSEHOLD GOODS MOVER IS** providing household goods moving services for an
10 intrastate move. For the purposes of this subsection, a written estimate
11 or contract that includes disclosure of a carrier's lien does not
12 constitute threatening to enforce a carrier's lien.

13 B. Any advertisement or representation by a household goods mover
14 relating to:

15 1. Insurance, loss or damage must accurately disclose the extent to
16 which the referenced insurance and the household goods mover will cover
17 loss or damage incurred during household goods moving services.

18 2. Fees, charges and rates must accurately disclose all fees,
19 charges and rates.

20 C. An act or practice in violation of this article constitutes an
21 unlawful practice under section 44-1522. The attorney general may
22 investigate and take appropriate action as prescribed by chapter 10,
23 article 7 of this title. In addition to being subject to the enforcement
24 and penalty provisions in chapter 10, article 7 of this title, a household
25 goods mover that violates this article is subject to any other civil or
26 criminal action, remedy and penalty provided by law.
