## AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 41-511.15, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO THE ARIZONA STATE PARKS BOARD.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:  
2       Section 1. Section 41-511.15, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended  
3 to read:

4           41-511.15. Arizona trail; fund; definition

5       A. The Arizona trail is designated as a state scenic trail to  
6 memorialize former United States congressman Bob Stump for his significant  
7 contributions to the trails and people of this state.

8       B. The Arizona state parks board shall:

9           1. Participate in planning, establishing, developing, maintaining  
10 and preserving the trail.

11           2. Provide information to any person involved in planning,  
12 establishing, developing or maintaining the trail regarding the design,  
13 corridors, signs, interpretive markers highlighting special areas and  
14 historic uses and any other aspect of the trail to promote uniformity of  
15 development, maintenance and preservation.

16           3. Encourage counties, cities and towns to adapt their general and  
17 comprehensive plans to preserve the trail right-of-way and to acquire  
18 property or legal interests in property to ensure the trail's continued  
19 existence in a permanent location.

20           4. In cooperation with federal and state land management agencies,  
21 prepare a trail management plan and a plan for interpretive markers for  
22 the trail.

23           5. Coordinate the board's trail plan with federal, state and local  
24 activities and land uses that may affect the trail and with private  
25 nonprofit support organizations to assist in planning, developing,  
26 promoting and preserving the trail.

27           6. Accept gifts and grants of private and public monies for the  
28 purposes of this section. Monies received pursuant to this paragraph  
29 shall be deposited in the Arizona trail fund.

30           C. The trail shall be planned and designed for all nonmotorized  
31 recreational uses, including hiking, biking, horseback and pack stock use,  
32 cross country skiing, snowshoeing and camping.

33           D. An agency of this state or of a county, city or town may not  
34 refuse to permit construction of the trail on property or rights-of-way  
35 owned or managed by the agency if the trail does not conflict with  
36 existing or proposed uses of the property. Each such agency shall:

37           1. Support the construction of the trail in the agency's long-term  
38 plans for its property.

39           2. Support the designation of the trail as a part of the national  
40 trail system.

41           3. Accommodate facilities for the safe trail crossing of highway  
42 rights-of-way.

1       4. Not infringe on existing land uses, such as cattle grazing or  
2 mineral development, that are near to or adjoin the trail. This paragraph  
3 does not authorize any person using public lands under a permit or lease  
4 to interfere with the use, maintenance or operation of the Arizona trail.

5       E. The Arizona trail fund is established consisting of legislative  
6 appropriations and donations to the fund. The Arizona state parks board  
7 shall administer the fund. The monies in the fund are continuously  
8 appropriated for the ~~sole purpose~~ PURPOSES of CONSTRUCTING, maintaining  
9 and preserving the Arizona trail, INCLUDING CONSTRUCTING, MAINTAINING AND  
10 IMPROVING WATER SOURCES, SIGNS, GATES AND PUBLIC ACCESS.

11      F. For the purposes of this section, "Arizona trail" means a state  
12 scenic trail that extends approximately eight hundred miles between the  
13 southern border and the northern border of this state.
