A RESOLUTION

ON THE DEATH OF ROBERT STEPHEN LYNCH.

1 Robert "Bob" Stephen Lynch passed away peacefully on August 29, 2021
2 at the age of 82. Known as "Smiley" by his Marine Corps Sergeant,
3 "Godfather of Western Water Law" by his colleagues and "14th Avenue
4 Sommelier" by his neighbors, Bob was loved by many and, most of all, by
5 his devoted family.

6 Bob earned his Bachelor of Arts and Juris Doctor degrees from the
7 University of Arizona and a Master of Laws degree with a specialization in
8 natural resources law from George Washington University. He spent nearly
9 six decades as a water and water rights lawyer but liked to refer to
10 himself as a "simple country lawyer." He belonged to the Arizona,
11 Maricopa County and Federal Bar Associations and was a member of the
12 District of Columbia Bar. A brilliant attorney and skillful litigator,
13 Bob is credited with helping to shape Western water and hydropower
14 policies for the last four decades.

15 Bob served on the Advisory Committee of the American Public Power
16 Association (APPA) and was the 2003 recipient of APPA's Kramer-Preston
17 Personal Service Award. He also served on the North American Electric
18 Reliability Corporation's Legal Advisory Committee, as chairperson and
19 member, respectively, of the Water and Property Rights and the Energy
20 Issues Committees of the National Water Resources Association and as
21 President and Chairman of the Board of the Central Arizona Project
22 Association.

23 Bob had many hobbies, including cooking, gardening, hosting soirees
24 in his front yard, sampling Arizona wines and making cheese. A loving and
25 devoted husband, father and grandfather, Bob will be greatly missed by his
26 wife of 52 years, Anne, his three daughters, Betsy, Caroline and
27 Stephanie, his sons-in-law, Scott and Edward, and his four grandchildren,
28 Teagan, Declan, Alexander and Eleanor.
