AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 36-2236, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO EMERGENCY
MEDICAL SERVICES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 36-2236, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 36-2236. Nature of certificates of necessity; transfer;
5 suspension; service area

6 A. A certificate of necessity issued pursuant to this article is
7 not a franchise, may be revoked by the director and does not confer a
8 property right on its holder.

9 B. A certificate of necessity shall not be assigned or otherwise
10 transferred without the written approval of the director. When any
11 certificate is assigned or transferred, the director shall issue to the
12 assignee or transferee a new certificate **THAT IS** valid only for the
13 unexpired term of the transferred or assigned certificate.

14 C. In case of emergency, the director may suspend a certificate of
15 necessity as provided in section 36-2234.

16 D. If a certificate of necessity issued pursuant to this article
17 includes any city, town or other political subdivision of this state, the
18 service area shall be all the ~~geographical~~ **GEOGRAPHIC** area lying within
19 the city, town, or political subdivision, unless the certificate issued by
20 the director specifically excludes a portion of the city, town, or
21 political subdivision. This subsection does not affect the validity of
22 any previously granted certificate for an unincorporated area lying within
23 the boundaries of a city.
