# **SENATE BILL 1374**

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 32-1974, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO PHARMACISTS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 32-1974, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4       32-1974. Pharmacists; administration of immunizations,  
5                   vaccines and emergency medications; certification;  
6                   reporting requirements; advisory committee;  
7                   definition

8       A. Except as prescribed pursuant to subsection ~~I - H~~ of this  
9 section, a pharmacist who is licensed pursuant to this chapter and who  
10 meets the requirements of this section may ORDER AND administer ALL OF the  
11 following ~~to adults without a prescription order pursuant to rules and~~  
12 ~~protocols adopted by the board pursuant to this section:~~

13           1. Immunizations or vaccines recommended ~~for adults~~ by the United  
14 States centers for disease control and prevention PREVENTION'S ADVISORY  
15 COMMITTEE ON IMMUNIZATION PRACTICES TO A PERSON WHO IS AT LEAST SIX YEARS  
16 OF AGE.

17           2. Immunizations or vaccines recommended by the United States  
18 centers for disease control and prevention's ~~health information~~ ADVISORY  
19 COMMITTEE ON IMMUNIZATION PRACTICES for international travel TO A PERSON  
20 WHO IS AT LEAST EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE.

21           ~~B. A pharmacist who is licensed pursuant to this chapter and who~~  
22 ~~meets the requirements of this section may administer the following to~~  
23 ~~minors without a prescription order pursuant to rules and protocols~~  
24 ~~adopted by the board pursuant to this section:~~

25           ~~1. 3. Influenza~~ Immunizations or vaccines FOR INFLUENZA  
26 RECOMMENDED BY THE UNITED STATES CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND  
27 PREVENTION'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON IMMUNIZATION PRACTICES to a person who  
28 is at least three years of age.

29           ~~2. Booster doses for the primary adolescent series as recommended~~  
30 ~~by the United States centers for disease control and prevention.~~

31           ~~3. Immunizations or vaccines recommended by the United States~~  
32 ~~centers for disease control and prevention to a person who is at least~~  
33 ~~thirteen years of age.~~

34           ~~C. Except as prescribed in subsection B of this section, a~~  
35 ~~pharmacist who is licensed pursuant to this chapter and who meets the~~  
36 ~~requirements of this section may administer immunizations and vaccines,~~  
37 ~~including the first dose for the primary adolescent series, to a person~~  
38 ~~who is at least six years of age but under thirteen years of age only with~~  
39 ~~a prescription order and pursuant to rules and protocols adopted by the~~  
40 ~~board pursuant to this section.~~

41       B. EXCEPT AS PRESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION A OF THIS SECTION, A  
42 PHARMACIST WHO IS LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS CHAPTER AND WHO MEETS THE  
43 REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION MAY ADMINISTER IMMUNIZATIONS AND VACCINES TO  
44 A PERSON WHO IS AT LEAST THREE YEARS OF AGE ONLY PURSUANT TO A  
45 PRESCRIPTION ORDER OR UNDER A COLLABORATIVE PRACTICE AGREEMENT.

1       **D.** C. A pharmacist who wishes to ORDER AND administer  
2 immunizations and vaccines pursuant to this section must ~~be certified to~~  
3 ~~do so by~~ UPDATE THE PHARMACIST'S ONLINE PROFILE WITH the board. ~~The board~~  
4 ~~shall issue a certificate to a pharmacist~~ INDICATING THAT THE PHARMACIST  
5 IS AN ACTIVE IMMUNIZER who meets ~~board~~ requirements ~~for certification~~ as  
6 prescribed by the board by rule.

7       **E.** D. A pharmacist who is ~~certified~~ AUTHORIZED to ORDER AND  
8 administer immunizations and vaccines pursuant to this section may ORDER  
9 ~~AND administer without a prescription order:~~

10      1. Emergency medication to manage an acute allergic reaction to an  
11 immunization, vaccine or medication in accordance with GUIDELINES FROM the  
12 United States centers for disease control and ~~prevention immunization~~  
13 ~~guidelines~~ PREVENTION'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON IMMUNIZATION PRACTICES FOR  
14 ADULTS AND THE AMERICAN ACADEMY OF PEDIATRICS FOR MINORS.

15      2. Immunizations or vaccines to any person regardless of age during  
16 a public health emergency response of this state pursuant to section  
17 36-787.

18       **F.** E. A pharmacist who administers an immunization, vaccine or  
19 emergency medication pursuant to this section must:

20      1. ~~Report the administration to~~ NOTIFY the person's identified  
21 primary care provider or physician within forty-eight hours after  
22 administering the immunization, vaccine or emergency medication and as  
23 prescribed by the board by rule. The pharmacist shall make a reasonable  
24 effort to identify the person's primary care provider or physician by one  
25 or more of the following methods:

26       (a) Checking ~~any adult~~ THE ARIZONA STATE immunization information  
27 system ~~or vaccine registry~~ established by the department of health  
28 services.

29       (b) Checking pharmacy records.

30       (c) Requesting the information from the person or, in the case of a  
31 minor, the person's parent or guardian.

32      2. Report information to ~~any adult~~ THE ARIZONA STATE immunization  
33 information system ~~or vaccine registry~~ established by the department of  
34 health services.

35      3. Maintain a record of the immunization pursuant to title 12,  
36 chapter 13, article 7.1 and as prescribed by the board by rule.

37      4. ~~Report to~~ NOTIFY the person's identified primary care provider  
38 or physician, within twenty-four hours ~~of~~ AFTER occurrence, any adverse  
39 reaction that is reported to or witnessed by the pharmacist and that is  
40 listed by the vaccine manufacturer as a contraindication to further doses  
41 of the vaccine.

42      5. ~~Participate in any federal~~ NOTIFY THE vaccine adverse event  
43 reporting system ~~or successor database~~ IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE UNITED  
44 STATES CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE  
45 RECOMMENDATIONS.

1       6. PROVIDE VACCINE INFORMATION MATERIALS TO THOSE REQUESTING  
2 IMMUNIZATIONS OR VACCINES AND, FOR PERSONS UNDER EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE,  
3 PROVIDE EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS TO THE PERSON'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN ABOUT THE  
4 IMPORTANCE OF PEDIATRIC PREVENTIVE HEALTH CARE VISITS AS RECOMMENDED BY  
5 THE AMERICAN ACADEMY OF PEDIATRICS.

6       7. FOLLOW THE STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES ADOPTED BY THE PHARMACY  
7 OR OTHER INSTITUTION WHERE THE IMMUNIZATION, VACCINE OR EMERGENCY  
8 MEDICATION IS ADMINISTERED THAT ARE BASED ON THE VACCINE ADMINISTRATION  
9 PROTOCOLS AND IMMUNIZATION PRACTICES PUBLISHED IN THE UNITED STATES  
10 CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION'S MORBIDITY AND MORTALITY  
11 WEEKLY REPORT. THE STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES SHALL INCLUDE ALL OF THE  
12 FOLLOWING:

13       (a) PATIENT SCREENING REQUIREMENTS FOR RELEVANT HEALTH CONDITION  
14 INFORMATION BEFORE ADMINISTERING A VACCINE.

15       (b) A REQUIREMENT TO REVIEW THE VACCINE INFORMATION, THE ARIZONA  
16 STATE IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION SYSTEM AND ANY OTHER PATIENT INFORMATION ON  
17 RECORD TO DETERMINE THE PERSON'S PAST IMMUNIZATIONS AND ADVERSE REACTIONS  
18 BEFORE ADMINISTERING A VACCINE.

19       (c) EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES.

20       ~~G.~~ F. This section does not establish a cause of action against a  
21 patient's primary care provider or physician for any adverse reaction,  
22 complication or negative outcome arising from the administration of any  
23 immunization, vaccine or emergency medication by a pharmacist to the  
24 patient pursuant to this section if it is administered without a  
25 prescription order written by the patient's primary care provider or  
26 physician.

27       ~~H.~~ G. The board shall adopt rules for ~~the administration of~~  
28 ORDERING AND ADMINISTERING vaccines, ~~or~~ immunizations AND EMERGENCY  
29 MEDICATIONS pursuant to this section regarding:

30       ~~1. Protocols that are based on protocols approved by the United~~  
31 ~~States centers for disease control and prevention and any advisory~~  
32 ~~committee appointed by the board for the purpose of recommending~~  
33 ~~protocols.~~

34       ~~2. Recordkeeping and reporting requirements.~~

35       ~~3. Requirements and qualifications for pharmacist certification~~  
36 AUTHORIZATION pursuant to this section.

37       ~~4. Vaccine information and educational materials for those~~  
38 ~~requesting vaccines and immunizations.~~

39       ~~5. The administration of emergency medication pursuant to this~~  
40 ~~section.~~

41       ~~I.~~ H. The department of health services, by rule, shall establish  
42 and maintain a list of immunizations or vaccines that may be administered  
43 ~~to adults~~ by a pharmacist only pursuant to a prescription order. In  
44 adopting and maintaining this list, the department is exempt from the  
45 rulemaking requirements of title 41, chapter 6. ~~The department shall~~

1 ~~adopt its initial rules within six months after receipt of the~~  
2 ~~recommendations of the advisory committee appointed by the board and shall~~  
3 ~~hold one public hearing before implementing the rules and any amendments~~  
4 ~~to the rules.~~ The list shall include those immunizations or vaccines  
5 ~~listed in the United States centers for disease control and prevention's~~  
6 ~~recommended adult immunization schedule or~~ recommended by the United  
7 States centers for disease control and prevention's health information for  
8 international travel that have adverse reactions that could cause  
9 significant harm to a patient's health. A pharmacist may not administer  
10 immunizations or vaccines without a prescription order pursuant to this  
11 section before the department has established the list pursuant to this  
12 subsection. The board may not authorize a pharmacist to administer new  
13 immunizations or vaccines without a prescription order pursuant to this  
14 section until the department reviews the new immunizations and vaccines to  
15 determine if they should be added to the list established pursuant to this  
16 subsection.

17 ~~J.~~ I. The board may appoint an advisory committee to assist the  
18 board in adopting and amending rules and developing protocols relating to  
19 ~~the administration of~~ ORDERING AND ADMINISTERING immunizations, vaccines  
20 and emergency medications and ~~certification~~ TRAINING requirements.

21 ~~K.~~ J. A pharmacy intern who is ~~certified by the board~~ TRAINED to  
22 administer immunizations and vaccines pursuant to this section may do so  
23 only in the presence and under the ~~immediate personal~~ supervision of a  
24 pharmacist who is ~~certified~~ AUTHORIZED as prescribed in this section.

25 ~~L.~~ K. This section does not prevent a pharmacist who administers  
26 an immunization or vaccine from participating in the federal vaccines for  
27 children program.

28 ~~M.~~ L. A pharmacist may not administer an immunization or vaccine  
29 to a minor without the consent of the minor's parent or guardian.

30 ~~N.~~ M. For the purposes of this section, ~~-~~

31 ~~1.~~ "Emergency medication" means emergency epinephrine,  
32 CORTICOSTEROIDS, ALBUTEROL, OXYGEN and antihistamines in accordance with  
33 GUIDELINES FROM the United States centers for disease control and  
34 ~~prevention immunization guidelines~~ PREVENTION'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON  
35 IMMUNIZATION PRACTICES FOR ADULTS AND THE AMERICAN ACADEMY OF PEDIATRICS  
36 FOR MINORS.

37 ~~2.~~ "Primary adolescent series" means those immunizations or  
38 vaccines recommended by the United States centers for disease control and  
39 prevention for children starting at age eleven or twelve.
