REPEALING SECTION 15-249.08, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING SECTION 15-249.09, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; APPROPRIATING MONIES; RELATING TO EDUCATION FINANCE.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Repeal

3 Section 15-249.08, Arizona Revised Statutes, is repealed.

4 Sec. 2. Section 15-249.09, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
5 read:

6 15-249.09. Early literacy program fund; report; definitions

7 A. The early literacy program fund is established to provide
8 support to improve reading skills, literacy and proficiency for
9 PREKINDERGARTEN STUDENTS AND students in kindergarten programs and grades
10 one, two and three in addition to monies received pursuant to section
11 15-211. The fund shall be administered by the department of education.
12 The state board of education shall develop policies and procedures to be
13 administered by the department of education.

14 B. Subject to review and approval by the state board of education,
15 the department of education shall award monies to eligible schools based
16 on available monies on a per pupil basis. The per pupil amount shall be
17 calculated using the student count for pupils in kindergarten programs and
18 grades one, two and three.

19 C. Eligible schools that receive monies pursuant to this section
20 shall submit data on expenditures and results and other information
21 required by subsection E of this section.

22 D. Eligible schools may use monies for eligible expenses to
23 increase the reading proficiency of PREKINDERGARTEN STUDENTS AND students
24 in kindergarten programs and grades one, two and three. Eligible schools
25 may also use monies to provide a full-day kindergarten program that is
26 structured to increase reading proficiency. Monies must be used to
27 expand, enhance and support the components included in a school's reading
28 program plan submitted pursuant to section 15-211.

29 E. Subject to review and approval by the state board of education,
30 the department of education shall include a report on the early literacy
31 program in the K-3 reading program plan required by section 15-211. The
32 report shall contain the following:

33 1. A description of the monies awarded each year.

34 2. A summary of the funded activities.

35 3. Information on the recipient schools' progress toward
36 achievement goals.

37 4. Specific findings on strategies and activities and their level
38 of effectiveness in improving reading proficiency in the recipient
39 schools.

40 F. IN ADDITION TO THE DISTRIBUTION OF MONIES PRESCRIBED IN
41 SUBSECTION B OF THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL DISTRIBUTE
42 GRANTS TO ELIGIBLE SCHOOLS FOR PREKINDERGARTEN STUDENTS FOR THE PURPOSES
43 PRESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION.

1 ~~F.~~ G. For the purposes of this section:

2 1. "Eligible expenses" means expenses for evidence-based strategies
3 and interventions designed to improve the reading proficiency of
4 **PREKINDERGARTEN STUDENTS AND** students in kindergarten programs and grades
5 one, two and three pursuant to sections 15-211 and 15-704, including
6 literacy coaches and literacy specialists, reading curricula, kindergarten
7 readiness assessments, summer programs or tutoring programs.

8 2. "Eligible school" means a public school with at least ninety
9 percent of students who are eligible for free and reduced-priced lunches
10 under the national school lunch and child nutrition acts (42 United States
11 Code sections 1751 through ~~1785~~ 1793).

12 3. "Student count" means the average daily membership for pupils in
13 kindergarten programs and grades one, two and three, as prescribed in
14 section 15-901 for the current year.

15 Sec. 3. Appropriation: early childhood development and health
16 fund

17 The sum of \$68,600,000 is appropriated from the state general fund
18 in fiscal year 2022-2023 to the early childhood development and health
19 fund established by section 8-1181, Arizona Revised Statutes.

20 Sec. 4. Intent

21 The legislature intends that the \$68,600,000 appropriation in the
22 baseline budget dedicated to results-based funding instead be redirected
23 to the early childhood development and health fund established by section
24 8-1181, Arizona Revised Statutes, to provide additional opportunities for
25 children to receive a high quality early education.
