**CHAPTER 209**  
**SENATE BILL 1327**

AN ACT

REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO ESTABLISH AN ALTERNATIVE  
ASSESSMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Alternative assessment advisory committee;  
3 membership; duties; annual update; delayed  
4 repeal

5 A. The department of education shall establish an alternative  
6 assessment advisory committee consisting of the superintendent of public  
7 instruction or the superintendent's designee and at least the following  
8 members who are appointed by the department in coordination with the state  
9 board of education:

- 10 1. A special education director.
- 11 2. A special education teacher.
- 12 3. A representative of a charter school in this state.
- 13 4. A rural representative.
- 14 5. A tribal community representative.
- 15 6. A school district superintendent.
- 16 7. A parent.
- 17 8. A representative of a nonprofit organization that strengthens  
18 families and systems of care to improve outcomes for children with  
19 disabilities and special health care needs.

20 9. A representative of the special education advisory committee  
21 established by section 15-235, subsection F, Arizona Revised Statutes.

22 B. The advisory committee shall do all of the following:

- 23 1. Consider the findings, conclusions and recommendations of the  
24 alternative assessment study committee established by Laws 2021,  
25 chapter 57.
- 26 2. Consider any item relating to alternative assessments and  
27 special education as the advisory committee deems necessary.
- 28 3. On or before June 30, 2022, provide an update on the alternative  
29 assessment advisory committee's progress to the alternative assessment  
30 study committee established by Laws 2021, chapter 57 in a public hearing.

31 C. The advisory committee shall provide an annual update on its  
32 progress to the senate education committee or the house of representatives  
33 education committee, or the respective successor committee, in a public  
34 hearing.

35 D. This section is repealed from and after June 30, 2025.

36 Sec. 2. Retroactivity

37 This act applies retroactively to from and after November 22, 2021.

38 Sec. 3. Emergency

39 This act is an emergency measure that is necessary to preserve the  
40 public peace, health or safety and is operative immediately as provided by  
41 law.
