AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 28-2470.17, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO SPECIAL PLATES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
2 Section 1. Section 28-2470.17, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended
3 to read:

4 28-2470.17. Arizona beekeepers special plates; fund

5 A. If, by December 31, ~~2022~~ 2024, a person pays \$32,000 to the
6 department for the implementation of this section, the department shall
7 issue Arizona beekeepers special plates. The person that provides the
8 \$32,000 shall design the Arizona beekeepers special plates. The design
9 and color of the Arizona beekeepers special plates are subject to the
10 approval of the department. The director may allow a request for Arizona
11 beekeepers special plates to be combined with a request for personalized
12 special plates. If the director allows such a combination, the request
13 shall be in a form prescribed by the director and is subject to the fees
14 for the personalized special plates in addition to the fees required for
15 the Arizona beekeepers special plates.

16 B. Of the \$25 fee required by section 28-2402 for the original
17 special plates and for renewal of special plates, \$8 is a special plate
18 administration fee and \$17 is an annual donation.

19 C. The department shall deposit, pursuant to sections 35-146 and
20 35-147, all special plate administration fees in the state highway fund
21 established by section 28-6991 and all donations collected pursuant to
22 this section in the Arizona beekeepers special plate fund established by
23 this section.

24 D. The Arizona beekeepers special plate fund is established
25 consisting of monies deposited pursuant to this section. The director
26 shall administer the fund. The first \$32,000 in the fund shall be
27 reimbursed to the person that paid the implementation fee to the
28 department pursuant to subsection A of this section. Not more than ten
29 percent of monies deposited in the fund annually shall be used for the
30 cost of administering the fund. Monies in the fund are continuously
31 appropriated.

32 E. The director shall annually allocate monies from the fund to an
33 entity that is a charitable organization that is qualified under section
34 501(c)(3) of the United States internal revenue code for federal income
35 tax purposes. The entity must:

36 1. Be located in this state.

37 2. Have been in existence since 2017.

38 3. Have a mission to teach and encourage better methods among
39 beekeepers in this state, to promote cooperation and sharing, to reach a
40 common understanding regarding beekeeper problems and solutions and to
41 stimulate the interest of the general public in the advantages and
42 benefits of beekeeping.

43 4. Encourage the study of and research in apiculture with an
44 emphasis on better methodology, increased production, public safety and
45 improved marketing.

1 5. Participate in outreach activities, including special events and
2 visits to schools, to teach and inform the general public about honeybees
3 and the beekeeping industry.

4 Sec. 2. Retroactivity

5 This act applies retroactively to from and after December 30, 2022.
