A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENACTING AND ORDERING THE SUBMISSION TO THE PEOPLE OF A MEASURE RELATING
TO INDIVIDUAL INCOME TAX.

1 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Arizona,
2 the Senate concurring:

3 1. Under the power of the referendum, as vested in the Legislature,
4 the following measure, relating to individual income tax, is enacted to
5 become valid as a law if approved by the voters and on proclamation of the
6 Governor:

7 AN ACT

8 REPEALING TITLE 43, CHAPTER 10, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES;
9 RELATING TO INDIVIDUAL INCOME TAX.

10 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of
11 Arizona:

12 Section 1. Repeal

13 Title 43, chapter 10, Arizona Revised Statutes, is
14 repealed.

15 Sec. 2. Conforming legislation

16 The legislative council staff shall prepare proposed
17 legislation conforming the Arizona Revised Statutes to the
18 provisions of this act for consideration in the fifty-seventh
19 legislature, first regular session.

20 Sec. 3. Voter findings and intent

21 A. The voters of the state of Arizona find that:

22 1. The government has failed to use the voters'
23 hard-earned tax money in ways that are as beneficial as if the
24 money were kept in the voters' own pocket.

25 2. The personal income tax has historically constituted
26 only a minority of this state's revenue and that this state
27 has numerous additional revenue streams such that it is not
28 necessary to take the voters' hard-earned money to run a lean
29 and efficient government.

30 B. It is the intent of the voters of the state of
31 Arizona to abolish the personal income tax.

32 Sec. 4. Applicability

33 This act applies to taxable years beginning from or
34 after December 31, 2024.

35 2. The Secretary of State shall submit this proposition to the
36 voters at the next general election as provided by article IV, part 1,
37 section 1, Constitution of Arizona.
