AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 28-1595, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 28-1595, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 28-1595. Failure to stop or provide driver license or
5 evidence of identity; violation; classification

6 A. The operator of a motor vehicle who knowingly fails or refuses
7 to bring the operator's motor vehicle to a stop after being given a visual
8 or audible signal or instruction by a peace officer or duly authorized
9 agent of a traffic enforcement agency is guilty of a class 2 misdemeanor.

10 B. After stopping as required by subsection A of this section, the
11 operator of a motor vehicle who fails or refuses to exhibit the operator's
12 driver license as required by section 28-3169 or a driver who is not
13 licensed and who fails or refuses to provide evidence of the driver's
14 identity on request is guilty of a class 2 misdemeanor. The evidence of
15 identity that is presented shall contain all of the following information:

- 16 1. The driver's full name.
- 17 2. The driver's date of birth.
- 18 3. The driver's residence address.
- 19 4. A brief physical description of the driver, including the
20 driver's sex, weight, height and eye and hair color.
- 21 5. The driver's signature.

22 C. A person other than the driver of a motor vehicle ~~who fails or~~
23 ~~refuses to~~ SHALL provide ~~evidence of~~ the person's ~~identity~~ FULL NAME, DATE
24 OF BIRTH AND RESIDENCE ADDRESS to a peace officer or a duly authorized
25 agent of a traffic enforcement agency on request, when such officer or
26 agent has reasonable cause to believe the person has committed a violation
27 of this title. ~~;~~ A PERSON WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THIS SUBSECTION is
28 guilty of a class 2 misdemeanor.

29 D. A peace officer or duly authorized agent of a traffic
30 enforcement agency may give the signal or instruction required by
31 subsection A of this section by hand, emergency light, voice, whistle or
32 siren.

33 E. A person shall not be convicted of a violation of subsection B
34 of this section if the person provided evidence of identity required by
35 subsection B, paragraphs 1 through 5 of this section and produces to the
36 court a legible driver license or an authorized duplicate of the license
37 that is issued to the person and that was valid at the time the violation
38 of subsection B of this section occurred.
