AMENDING SECTION 15-808, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO SCHOOL ATTENDANCE.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 15-808, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 3 read: 4 15-808. Arizona online instruction; reports; definitions 5 A. Arizona online instruction shall be instituted to meet the needs 6 of **pupils** STUDENTS in the information age. The state board of education 7 select district public schools and state-approved shall charter 8 authorizers shall sponsor charter schools to be online course providers or 9 online schools. The state board of education and state-approved charter authorizers shall develop standards for the approval of online course 10 11 providers and online schools based on the following criteria: 12 1. The depth and breadth of curriculum choices. 13 2. The variety of educational methodologies employed by the school and the means of addressing the unique needs and learning styles of 14 targeted **pupil** STUDENT populations, including computer-assisted learning 15 16 systems, virtual classrooms, virtual laboratories, electronic field trips, 17 e-mail EMAIL, virtual tutoring, online help desk, group chat sessions and 18 noncomputer-based activities performed under the direction of а 19 certificated teacher. 20 3. The availability of an intranet or private network to safeguard 21 pupils STUDENTS against predatory and pornographic elements of the 22 internet. 4. The availability of filtered research access to the internet. 23 24 5. The availability of private individual e-mail EMAIL between 25 pupils STUDENTS, teachers, administrators and parents in order to protect 26 the confidentiality of pupil STUDENT records and information. 27 6. The availability of faculty members who are experienced with 28 computer networks, the internet and computer animation. 29 7. The extent to which the school intends to develop partnerships 30 with universities, community colleges and private businesses. 31 8. The services offered to populations with developmental 32 disabilities. 9. The grade levels that will be served. 33 Each new school that provides online instruction shall provide 34 Β. online instruction on a probationary status. After a new school that 35 36 provides online instruction has clearly demonstrated the academic 37 integrity of its instruction through the actual improvement of the academic performance of its students, the school may apply to be removed 38 39 from probationary status. The state board of education or the 40 state-approved charter authorizer that sponsored the charter school shall 41 remove from Arizona online instruction any probationary school that fails 42 to clearly demonstrate improvement in academic performance within three 43 years measured against goals in the approved application and the state's accountability system. All pupils STUDENTS who participate in Arizona 44 45 online instruction shall reside in this state. Pupils STUDENTS who

1 participate in Arizona online instruction are subject to the testing 2 requirements prescribed in chapter 7, article 3 of this title. On 3 enrollment, the school shall notify the parents or guardians of the pupil 4 STUDENT of the state testing requirements. If a pupil STUDENT fails to 5 comply with the testing requirements and the school administers the tests 6 pursuant to this subsection to less than ninety-five percent of the pupils 7 STUDENTS in Arizona online instruction, the pupil STUDENT shall not be 8 allowed to participate in Arizona online instruction.

9 C. The state board of education and state-approved charter 10 authorizers shall develop annual reporting mechanisms for schools that 11 participate in Arizona online instruction. ONLINE COURSE PROVIDERS AND 12 ONLINE SCHOOLS SHALL REPORT THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF 13 EDUCATION:

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1. THE TOTAL NUMBER OF COURSES TAKEN BY ALL STUDENTS.

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2. THE TOTAL NUMBER OF COURSES COMPLETED.

16 3. THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS ENROLLED WHO DID NOT COMPLETE A SINGLE 17 COURSE.

18 4. THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS WHO ARE ENROLLED IN A COURSE THAT
19 INCLUDES END-OF-COURSE TESTING PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-741 OR WHO COMPLETED
20 A COURSE THAT INCLUDED END-OF-COURSE TESTING PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-741 AS
21 OF THE FALL, SPRING AND SUMMER TESTING WINDOWS.

5. THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS TAKING THE END-OF-COURSE EXAMINATION FOR
 EACH COURSE THAT INCLUDES END-OF-COURSE TESTING PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-741
 DURING THE FALL, SPRING AND SUMMER TESTING WINDOWS.

25 6. THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS WHO WERE EXCLUDED FROM ARIZONA ONLINE
 26 INSTRUCTION FOR FAILING TO TAKE THE STATEWIDE ASSESSMENT ADOPTED PURSUANT
 27 TO SECTION 15-741.

28 7. THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS WHO PASSED THE END-OF-COURSE EXAMINATIONS29 IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS AND MATHEMATICS PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-741.

30 8. THE NUMBER OF FULL-TIME STUDENTS ENROLLED AND THE AVERAGE NUMBER
 31 OF COURSES THAT THESE STUDENTS PASSED.

32 9. THE NUMBER OF PART-TIME STUDENTS ENROLLED AND THE AVERAGE NUMBER33 OF COURSES THAT THESE STUDENTS PASSED.

D. The department of education shall compile the information submitted in the annual reports by schools participating in Arizona online instruction. The department of education shall submit the compiled report to the governor, the speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the senate by November 15 of each year.

E. Each school selected for Arizona online instruction shall ensure that a daily log is maintained for each pupil STUDENT who participates in Arizona online instruction. The daily log shall describe the amount of time spent by each pupil STUDENT participating in Arizona online instruction pursuant to this section on academic tasks. The daily log shall be used by the school district or charter school to qualify the pupils STUDENTS who participate in Arizona online instruction in the school's average daily attendance calculations pursuant to subsection F of this section.

3 F. If a **pupil** STUDENT is enrolled in a school district or charter 4 school and also participates in Arizona online instruction, the sum of the 5 average daily membership, which includes enrollment as prescribed in 6 section 15-901, subsection A, paragraph 1, subdivisions (a) and (b) and 7 daily attendance as prescribed in section 15-901, subsection A, paragraph 8 5, for that pupil STUDENT in the school district or charter school and in 9 Arizona online instruction shall not exceed 1.0. If the pupil STUDENT is enrolled in a school district or a charter school and also participates in 10 11 Arizona online instruction and the sum of the daily membership or daily 12 attendance for that pupil STUDENT is greater than 1.0, the sum shall be 13 reduced to 1.0 and shall be apportioned between the school district, unless the school district is a career technical education district 14 subject to the apportionment requirements of section 15-393, or charter 15 16 school and Arizona online instruction based on the percentage of total 17 time that the pupil STUDENT is enrolled or in attendance in the school 18 district or charter school and Arizona online instruction. The uniform system of financial records shall include guidelines for the apportionment 19 20 of the pupil STUDENT enrollment and attendance as provided in this 21 subsection. Pupils STUDENTS in Arizona online instruction do not incur 22 absences for purposes of this subsection and may generate an average daily attendance of 1.0 for attendance hours during any hour of the day, during 23 24 any day of the week and at any time between July 1 and June 30 of each 25 fiscal year. For kindergarten programs and grades one through eight, 26 average daily membership shall be calculated by dividing the instructional 27 hours as reported in the daily log required in subsection E of this section by the applicable hourly requirements prescribed in section 28 29 15-901. For grades nine through twelve, average daily membership shall be calculated by dividing the instructional hours as reported in the daily 30 31 log required in subsection E of this section by nine hundred. The average daily membership of a pupil STUDENT who participates in online instruction 32 33 shall not exceed 1.0. Average daily membership shall not be calculated on 34 the one hundredth day of instruction for the purposes of this 35 section. Funding shall be determined as follows:

36 A pupil STUDENT who is enrolled full-time in Arizona online 1. instruction shall be funded for online instruction at ninety-five percent 37 of the base support level that would be calculated for that pupil STUDENT 38 39 if that pupil STUDENT were enrolled as a full-time student in a school 40 district or charter school that does not participate in Arizona online 41 instruction. Charter additional assistance and district additional 42 assistance shall be calculated in the same manner they would be calculated 43 if the student were enrolled in a district or charter school that does not 44 participate in Arizona online instruction.

1 2. A pupil STUDENT who is enrolled part-time in Arizona online 2 instruction shall be funded for online instruction at eighty-five percent 3 of the base support level that would be calculated for that pupil STUDENT 4 if that **pupil** STUDENT were enrolled as a part-time student in a school 5 district or charter school that does not participate in Arizona online 6 instruction. Charter additional assistance and district additional 7 assistance shall be calculated in the same manner they would be calculated 8 if the student were enrolled in a district or charter school that does not 9 participate in Arizona online instruction.

G. If the academic achievement of a pupil STUDENT declines while the pupil STUDENT is participating in Arizona online instruction, the pupil's STUDENT'S parents, the pupil's STUDENT'S teachers and the principal or head teacher of the school shall confer to evaluate whether the pupil STUDENT should be allowed to continue to participate in Arizona online instruction.

16 Η. To ensure the academic integrity of pupils STUDENTS who 17 participate in online instruction, Arizona online instruction shall 18 include multiple diverse assessment measures and the proctored 19 administration of required state standardized tests.

20 I. A school district or charter school may not charge a fee to a 21 pupil STUDENT who takes an examination in a particular course to obtain 22 academic credit, pursuant to section 15-701.01, subsection I, from the school district or charter school if the academic credit for a course was 23 24 previously earned in an Arizona online instruction course or at any public school in this state. Any test administered pursuant to this subsection 25 26 shall be an assessment that is aligned to the course-relevant state 27 academic standards.

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J. For the purposes of this section:

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1. "Full-time student" means:

(a) A student who is at least five years of age before September 1
 of a school year and who is enrolled in a school kindergarten program that
 meets at least three hundred forty-six hours during the school year.

(b) A student who is at least six years of age before September 1 of a school year, who has not graduated from the highest grade taught in the school and who is regularly enrolled in a course of study required by the state board of education. For first, second and third grade students, the instructional program shall meet at least seven hundred twelve hours. For fourth, fifth and sixth grade students, the instructional program shall meet at least eight hundred ninety hours during the school year.

40 (c) Seventh and eighth grade students or ungraded students who are 41 at least twelve, but under fourteen, years of age on or before September 1 42 and who are enrolled in an instructional program of courses that meets at 43 least one thousand sixty-eight hours during the school year.

44 (d) For high schools, a student who has not graduated from the 45 highest grade taught in the school district, or an ungraded student who is at least fourteen years of age on or before September 1, and who is enrolled in at least four courses throughout the year that meet at least nine hundred hours during the school year. A full-time student shall not be counted more than once for computation of average daily membership.

5 2. "Online course provider" means a school other than an online 6 school that is selected by the state board of education or a 7 state-approved charter authorizer to participate in Arizona online 8 instruction pursuant to this section and that provides at least one online 9 academic course that is approved by the state board of education.

3. "Online school" means a school that provides at least four online academic courses or one or more online courses for the equivalent of at least five hours each day for one hundred eighty school days and that is a charter school that is sponsored by a state-approved charter authorizer or a district public school that is selected by the state board of education to participate in Arizona online instruction.

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4. "Part-time student" means:

17 (a) Any student who is enrolled in a program that does not meet the 18 definition in paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be funded at 19 eighty-five percent of the base support level that would be calculated for 20 that pupil STUDENT if that pupil STUDENT were enrolled as a part-time 21 student in a school district or charter school that does not participate 22 in Arizona online instruction.

23 (b) A part-time student of seventy-five percent average daily 24 membership shall be enrolled in at least three subjects throughout the year that offer for first, second and third grade students at least five 25 26 hundred thirty-four instructional hours in a school year and for fourth, 27 fifth and sixth grade students at least six hundred sixty-eight instructional hours in a school year. A part-time student of fifty 28 29 percent average daily membership shall be enrolled in at least two subjects throughout the year that offer for first, second and third grade 30 31 students at least three hundred fifty-six instructional hours in a school year and for fourth, fifth and sixth grade students at least four hundred 32 33 forty-five instructional hours in a school year. A part-time student of 34 twenty-five percent average daily membership shall be enrolled in at least 35 one subject throughout the year that offers for first, second and third 36 grade students at least one hundred seventy-eight instructional hours in a 37 school year and for fourth, fifth and sixth grade students at least two 38 hundred twenty-three instructional hours in a school year.

(c) For seventh and eighth grade students, a part-time student of seventy-five percent average daily membership shall be enrolled in at least three subjects throughout the year that offer at least eight hundred one instructional hours in a school year. A part-time student of fifty percent average daily membership shall be enrolled in at least two subjects throughout the year that offer at least five hundred thirty-four instructional hours in a school year. A part-time student of twenty-five 1 percent average daily membership shall be enrolled in at least one subject 2 throughout the year that offers at least two hundred sixty-seven 3 instructional hours in a school year.

(d) For high school students, a part-time student of seventy-five 4 5 percent average daily membership shall be enrolled in at least three subjects throughout the year that offer at least six hundred seventy-five 6 7 instructional hours in a school year. A part-time student of fifty percent average daily membership shall be enrolled in at least two 8 9 subjects throughout the year that offer at least four hundred fifty 10 instructional hours in a school year. A part-time student of twenty-five 11 percent average daily membership shall be enrolled in at least one subject 12 throughout the year that offers at least two hundred twenty-five 13 instructional hours in a school year.

14 5. "State-approved charter authorizer" means any charter school 15 sponsor authorized pursuant to section 15-183.
