# **SENATE BILL 1400**

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 15-1410 AND 15-1466.01, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES;  
RELATING TO COMMUNITY COLLEGES.

(TEXT OF BILL BEGINS ON NEXT PAGE)

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:  
2       Section 1. Section 15-1410, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4           15-1410. Credit and noncredit courses

5       A. ~~Courses~~ A COURSE THAT IS offered for credit shall satisfy at  
6 least one of the following ~~purposes and requirements~~:

7           1. ~~Credit courses shall~~ Satisfy one or more of the following  
8 purposes:

9           (a) Qualify students for a community college certificate or degree.  
10          (b) Be acceptable for transfer to a regionally accredited public or  
11 private college or university.

12          (c) Prepare students with skills to seek entry-level jobs in the  
13 field of specialization.

14          (d) Improve the student's job skills or prepare the student for  
15 promotion in fields of employment.

16          (e) Provide skills necessary for success in other college courses.

17          (f) Provide continuing education and lifelong learning.

18           2. ~~A credit course shall~~ Satisfy all of the following requirements:

19           (a) Have a formal course outline that defines the objectives and  
20 content of the course on file and available for audit.

21           (b) Evaluate and grade students based on their mastery of the  
22 objectives and content of the course.

23           (c) Require faculty teaching the course to meet the standards set  
24 by the district to teach in the subject area of the course.

25           (d) Base the ~~credits~~ CREDIT HOURS OR CONTACT HOURS awarded for  
26 completion of the course on the effort required of, and the competencies  
27 gained by, the students in accordance with policies adopted by the  
28 district governing board.

29           (e) Require students, before enrollment in the course, to achieve  
30 prerequisite competencies as defined in the syllabus or approved course  
31 guidelines.

32           (f) Be developed using the district's formal curriculum review  
33 procedure.

34           (g) Have an evaluation component, the results of which are used for  
35 the purposes of formative and summative evaluation by the institution.

36           (h) Meet other requirements adopted pursuant to district governing  
37 board policies, including national standardized examinations and credit by  
38 evaluation or examination.

39       B. A NONCREDIT WORKFORCE TRAINING OR CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION  
40 COURSE THAT MEETS THE CRITERIA ESTABLISHED IN SUBSECTION A OF THIS SECTION  
41 AND THAT IS OFFERED FOR CONTACT HOURS INSTEAD OF CREDIT HOURS SHALL  
42 SATISFY ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING:

43           1. BE CONSISTENT WITH THE CARL D. PERKINS CAREER AND TECHNICAL  
44 EDUCATION IMPROVEMENT ACT OF 2006, AS AMENDED BY THE STRENGTHENING CAREER  
45 AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION FOR THE 21ST CENTURY ACT.

1       2. BE INCLUDED ON THE ELIGIBLE TRAINING PROVIDER LIST MAINTAINED  
2 PURSUANT TO THE WORKFORCE INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT.

3       3. BE REQUESTED BY A BUSINESS OR INDUSTRY.

4       **B.** C. ~~Noncredit courses~~ Courses that do not meet the criteria  
5 established in subsection A OR B of this section. ~~Noncredit courses~~ are  
6 the financial responsibility of the district.

7       **C.** D. A community college under the jurisdiction of a community  
8 college district governing board may not offer a course with a  
9 prerequisite for enrollment that requires a student to be a member of a  
10 labor organization, a trade organization, or a trade guild or to  
11 participate in an industry apprenticeship program.

12      Sec. 2. Section 15-1466.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
13 read:

14      15-1466.01. Calculation of full-time equivalent student  
15           enrollment; report; definition

16      A. In determining state aid under sections 15-1464 and 15-1466, the  
17 number of full-time equivalent students shall be calculated in the  
18 following manner:

19      1. For the basic actual full-time equivalent student enrollment,  
20 add the number of full-time equivalent students enrolled as of forty-five  
21 days after classes begin in the fall semester to the number of full-time  
22 equivalent students enrolled as of forty-five days after classes begin in  
23 the spring semester, not including additional short-term classes, and  
24 divide the sum by two.

25      2. For the additional short-term and open entry, open exit  
26 full-time equivalent student enrollments:

27       (a) Determine the total number of credit units for students enrolled  
28 in additional short-term and open entry, open exit classes for the fiscal  
29 year.

30       (b) Determine the total number of credit units for students who have  
31 completed the additional short-term and open entry, open exit classes for  
32 the fiscal year. Any student who has not completed the class by June 30  
33 of each fiscal year ~~shall~~ IS not ~~be~~ eligible to be counted for state aid  
34 purposes until the following year.

35       (c) Add the amounts in subdivisions (a) and (b) of this paragraph.

36       (d) Divide the amount determined in subdivision (c) of this  
37 paragraph by two.

38       (e) Divide the quotient obtained in subdivision (d) of this  
39 paragraph by thirty.

40       (f) The result in subdivision (e) of this paragraph is the  
41 additional short-term and open entry, open exit full-time equivalent  
42 student enrollments for the fiscal year.

43      3. For the skill center, ~~and~~ adult basic education courses AND  
44 NONCREDIT WORKFORCE TRAINING full-time equivalent student enrollment,  
45 divide by six hundred forty the total class attended clock hours OR

1      **CONTACT HOURS** of persons who complete vocational training. Any student  
2      who does not complete vocational training programs by June 30 of each  
3      fiscal year ~~shall~~ **IS** not ~~be~~ eligible to be counted for state aid purposes  
4      until the following year.

5      4. The total of basic actual, additional short-term and open entry,  
6      open exit, ~~and~~ skill center **AND NONCREDIT WORKFORCE TRAINING** full-time  
7      equivalent student enrollment shall be the basis of providing state aid.

8      5. For a student who takes a course for which credit is awarded by  
9      both a community college and a high school, in which the instructor is an  
10     employee of the high school and in which the class is being taught on the  
11     high school campus during the normal high school operating hours, the  
12     amount of state aid that the community college would otherwise receive for  
13     that student shall be reduced by fifty percent.

14     B. For the purposes of calculating the district expenditure  
15     limitation prescribed in article IX, section 21, Constitution of Arizona,  
16     and pursuant to section 41-563, the number of full-time equivalent  
17     students shall be calculated in the following manner:

18     1. Determine the total of basic actual, additional short-term and  
19     open entry, open exit, ~~and~~ skill center **AND NONCREDIT WORKFORCE TRAINING**  
20     full-time equivalent students as prescribed in subsection A of this  
21     section.

22     2. Determine the number of full-time equivalent students included  
23     in paragraph 1 of this subsection who were enrolled in career and  
24     technical education courses that have been approved by the department of  
25     education in accordance with the Carl D. Perkins career and technical  
26     education improvement act of 2006, **AS AMENDED BY THE STRENGTHENING CAREER**  
27     **AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION FOR THE 21ST CENTURY ACT.**

28     3. Multiply the amount determined in paragraph 2 of this subsection  
29     by 0.3.

30     4. Add the amounts in paragraphs 1 and 3 of this subsection. This  
31     sum is the full-time equivalent student enrollment for the purpose of the  
32     **DISTRICT** expenditure limitation.

33     C. The full-time equivalent student enrollment reported by each  
34     district for all basic actual, additional short-term and open entry, open  
35     exit classes, ~~and~~ skill center and adult basic education courses **AND**  
36     **NONCREDIT WORKFORCE TRAINING COURSES** pursuant to subsection A of this  
37     section shall be audited annually by the auditor general. The auditor  
38     general shall audit separately any full-time equivalent student enrollment  
39     in which a student is enrolled in a course for both high school and  
40     college credit simultaneously, except for credit received at a private  
41     college or a college that is owned, operated or chartered by an Indian  
42     tribe, taking into consideration any relevant law, regulation or rule.  
43     ~~Beginning with the audit for the year ending June 30, 2016,~~ The auditor  
44     general shall audit separately the calculation of full-time equivalent  
45     student enrollment in subsection B of this section for the purpose of the

1 expenditure limitation for use pursuant to section 41-563. The auditor  
2 general shall report the results of the audit to the staffs of the joint  
3 legislative budget committee, the governor's office of strategic planning  
4 and budgeting and the economic estimates commission on or before October  
5 15 of each year.

6 D. Pursuant to section 15-1445, paragraph 4, a community college  
7 district may submit to the economic estimates commission one of the  
8 following estimates of full-time equivalent student enrollment:

9 1. The most recent audited full-time equivalent student enrollment  
10 count calculated pursuant to subsection B of this section.

11 2. The average of the five most recent audited full-time equivalent  
12 student enrollment counts calculated pursuant to subsection B of this  
13 section.

14 3. A full-time equivalent student enrollment count that exceeds the  
15 most recent audited full-time equivalent student enrollment count  
16 calculated pursuant to subsection B of this section by up to five percent  
17 if the actual full-time equivalent student enrollment count as of  
18 forty-five days after classes begin in the current fall semester exceeds  
19 the actual full-time equivalent student enrollment count as of forty-five  
20 days after classes began in the fall semester of the previous year.

21 E. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "NONCREDIT WORKFORCE TRAINING"  
22 MEANS A NONCREDIT WORKFORCE TRAINING OR CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION  
23 COURSE DESCRIBED IN SECTION 15-1410, SUBSECTION B.
