AN ACT

ESTABLISHING THE ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION PILOT PROGRAM.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Electric vehicle charging station pilot program;
3 requirements; report; federal monies;
4 conditional repeal; delayed repeal

5 A. The department of administration shall conduct a two-year
6 electric vehicle charging station pilot program.

7 B. All state agencies may apply to the department for funding
8 necessary to cover the costs of installing electric vehicle charging
9 stations at their agency locations.

10 C. The department may allow a private entity to locate and operate
11 a retail fee-based electric vehicle charging station at the legislature,
12 at any state agency and on any property under the control of a state
13 university that is under the jurisdiction of the Arizona board of regents.

14 D. The department may adopt policies and procedures to carry out
15 the purposes of this pilot program.

16 E. On or before December 31, 2025, the department shall submit a
17 report to the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of
18 representatives and the governor detailing any revenues and costs
19 resulting from installing and operating electric vehicle charging stations
20 pursuant to this section. The report shall include an estimate of the
21 volume of greenhouse gas emissions avoided by vehicles using the charging
22 stations. The department shall provide a copy of this report to the
23 secretary of state.

24 F. The department shall apply for and use applicable federal monies
25 to fund the pilot program. This section is repealed if no federal monies
26 are received by the department within eighteen months after the effective
27 date of this section. The department shall notify in writing the director
28 of the Arizona legislative council if federal monies are not received
29 within eighteen months after the effective date of this act.

30 G. This section is repealed from and after September 30, 2026.
