# HOUSE RESOLUTION 2004

A RESOLUTION

ON THE DEATH OF RUBEN T. CASTRO.

1 Ruben T. Castro passed away on June 21, 2023 in Superior, Arizona,  
2 at the age of 92.

3 Born in Miami, Arizona on January 18, 1931, Ruben Castro graduated  
4 from Superior High School in 1950 and soon after began his lengthy career  
5 with the Magma Copper Railroad. He was a dedicated and valuable employee  
6 of the company for 32 years, serving over the years as a foreman and a  
7 state certified railroad track inspector.

8 Ruben took a leave of absence from his employment to serve his  
9 country in the United States Army during the Korean War. He was awarded  
10 his Paratrooper Jump wings in the 82nd Airborne Division, and following  
11 his two years of military service, he returned to Magma Copper Railroad.

12 On October 22, 1960, Ruben married Estella Quiroz, and they went on  
13 to raise five children together in the Superior community. He strived to  
14 devote his life to his family and to God, serving St. Francis of Assisi  
15 Catholic Church as a Eucharistic Minister and often portraying Jesus in  
16 the passion play during Holy Week. Ruben was a dedicated member of the  
17 Knights of Columbus, and he enjoyed spending time with his family and  
18 participating in outdoor activities such as camping, fishing and hiking.

19 A loving and devoted husband and father, Ruben Castro will be  
20 greatly missed by his wife, Estella, his children, Michael Ruben (Cheryl),  
21 John (Janna), Steven (Sheryl), Anna (Raul) and Diana (David), his 10  
22 grandchildren and his great-grandchild.

24 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Arizona:

25 That the Members of the House of Representatives regret the passing  
26 of Ruben T. Castro and extend their deepest sympathies to his family and  
27 friends.
