HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AMENDMENTS TO S.B. 1068

(Reference to Senate engrossed bill)

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert:

2 "Section 1. Section 36-2201, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended by
3 Laws 2014, chapter 215, section 141, is amended to read:

4 36-2201. Definitions

5 In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

6 1. "Administrative medical direction" means supervision of emergency
7 medical care technicians by a base hospital medical director,
8 administrative medical director or basic life support medical director.
9 For the purposes of this paragraph, "administrative medical director" means
10 a physician who is licensed pursuant to title 32, chapter 13 or 17 and who
11 provides direction within the emergency medical services and trauma system.

12 2. "Advanced emergency medical technician" means a person who has
13 been trained in an advanced emergency medical technician program certified
14 by the director or in an equivalent training program and who is certified
15 by the director to render services pursuant to section 36-2205.

16 3. "Advanced life support" means the level of assessment and care
17 identified in the scope of practice approved by the director for the
18 advanced emergency medical technician, emergency medical technician I-99
19 and paramedic.

20 4. "Advanced life support base hospital" means a health care
21 institution that offers general medical and surgical services, that is
22 certified by the director as an advanced life support base hospital and
23 that is affiliated by written agreement with a licensed ambulance service,

1 municipal rescue service, fire department, fire district or health services
2 district for medical direction, evaluation and control of emergency medical
3 care technicians.

4 5. "Ambulance" means any publicly or privately owned surface, water
5 or air vehicle, including a helicopter, that contains a stretcher and
6 necessary medical equipment and supplies pursuant to section 36-2202 and
7 that is especially designed and constructed or modified and equipped to be
8 used, maintained or operated primarily for the transportation of
9 individuals who are sick, injured or wounded or who require medical
10 monitoring or aid. Ambulance does not include a surface vehicle that is
11 owned and operated by a private sole proprietor, partnership, private
12 corporation or municipal corporation for the emergency transportation and
13 in-transit care of its employees or a vehicle that is operated to
14 accommodate an incapacitated person or person with a disability who does
15 not require medical monitoring, care or treatment during transport and that
16 is not advertised as having medical equipment and supplies or ambulance
17 attendants.

18 6. "Ambulance attendant" means any of the following:

19 (a) An emergency medical technician, an advanced emergency medical
20 technician, an emergency medical technician I-99 or a paramedic whose
21 primary responsibility is the care of patients in an ambulance and who
22 meets the standards and criteria adopted pursuant to section 36-2204.

23 (b) An emergency medical responder who is employed by an ambulance
24 service operating under section 36-2202 and whose primary responsibility is
25 the driving of an ambulance.

26 (c) A physician who is licensed pursuant to title 32, chapter 13
27 or 17.

28 (d) A professional nurse who is licensed pursuant to title 32,
29 chapter 15 and who meets the state board of nursing criteria to care for
30 patients in the prehospital care system.

1 (e) A professional nurse who is licensed pursuant to title 32,
2 chapter 15 and whose primary responsibility is the care of patients in an
3 ambulance during an interfacility transport.

4 7. "Ambulance service" means a person who owns and operates one or
5 more ambulances.

6 8. "Basic life support" means the level of assessment and care
7 identified in the scope of practice approved by the director for the
8 emergency medical responder and emergency medical technician.

9 9. "Bureau" means the bureau of emergency medical services and
10 trauma system in the department.

11 10. "Centralized medical direction communications center" means a
12 facility that is housed within a hospital, medical center or trauma center
13 or a freestanding communication center that meets the following criteria:

14 (a) Has the ability to communicate with ambulance services and
15 emergency medical services providers rendering patient care outside of the
16 hospital setting via radio and telephone.

17 (b) Is staffed twenty-four hours a day seven days a week by at least
18 a physician licensed pursuant to title 32, chapter 13 or 17.

19 11. "Certificate of necessity" means a certificate that is issued to
20 an ambulance service by the department and that describes the following:

21 (a) Service area.

22 (b) Level of service.

23 (c) Type of service.

24 (d) Hours of operation.

25 (e) Effective date.

26 (f) Expiration date.

27 (g) Legal name and address of the ambulance service.

28 (h) Any limiting or special provisions the director prescribes.

29 12. "Council" means the emergency medical services council.

30 13. "Department" means the department of health services.

31 14. "Director" means the director of the department of health
32 services.

1 15. "Emergency medical care technician" means an individual who has
2 been certified by the department as an emergency medical technician, an
3 advanced emergency medical technician, an emergency medical technician I-99
4 or a paramedic.

5 16. "Emergency medical responder" as an ambulance attendant means a
6 person who has been trained in an emergency medical responder program
7 certified by the director or in an equivalent training program and who is
8 certified by the director to render services pursuant to section 36-2205.

9 17. "Emergency medical services" means those services required
10 following an accident or an emergency medical situation:

11 (a) For on-site emergency medical care.

12 (b) For the transportation of the sick or injured by a licensed
13 ground or air ambulance.

14 (c) In the use of emergency communications media.

15 (d) In the use of emergency receiving facilities.

16 (e) In administering initial care and preliminary treatment
17 procedures by emergency medical care technicians.

18 18. "Emergency medical services provider" means any governmental
19 entity, quasi-governmental entity or corporation whether public or private
20 that renders emergency medical services in this state.

21 19. "Emergency medical technician" means a person who has been
22 trained in an emergency medical technician program certified by the
23 director or in an equivalent training program and who is certified by the
24 director as qualified to render services pursuant to section 36-2205.

25 20. "Emergency receiving facility" means a licensed health care
26 institution that offers emergency medical services, is staffed twenty-four
27 hours a day and has a physician on call.

28 21. "Fit and proper" means that the director determines that an
29 applicant for a certificate of necessity or a certificate holder has the
30 expertise, integrity, fiscal competence and resources to provide ambulance
31 service in the service area.

1 22. "Medical record" means any patient record, including clinical
2 records, prehospital care records, medical reports, laboratory reports and
3 statements, any file, film, record or report or oral statements relating to
4 diagnostic findings, treatment or outcome of patients, whether written,
5 electronic or recorded, and any information from which a patient or the
6 patient's family might be identified.

7 23. "National certification organization" means a national
8 organization that tests and certifies the ability of an emergency medical
9 care technician and whose tests are based on national education standards.

10 24. "National education standards" means the emergency medical
11 services education standards of the United States department of
12 transportation or other similar emergency medical services education
13 standards developed by that department or its successor agency.

14 25. "Paramedic" means a person who has been trained in a paramedic
15 program certified by the director or in an equivalent training program and
16 who is certified by the director to render services pursuant to section
17 36-2205.

18 26. "Physician" means any person licensed pursuant to title 32,
19 chapter 13 or 17.

20 27. "POLICE DOG":

21 (a) MEANS A SPECIALLY TRAINED DOG THAT IS OWNED OR USED BY A LAW
22 ENFORCEMENT DEPARTMENT OR AGENCY OF THIS STATE OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION
23 OF THIS STATE AND THAT IS USED IN THE COURSE OF THE DEPARTMENT'S OR
24 AGENCY'S OFFICIAL WORK.

25 (b) INCLUDES A SEARCH AND RESCUE DOG, SERVICE DOG, ACCELERANT
26 DETECTION CANINE OR OTHER DOG THAT IS IN USE BY THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY
27 FOR OFFICIAL DUTIES.

28 ~~27.~~ 28. "Stretcher van" means a vehicle that contains a stretcher
29 and that is operated to accommodate an incapacitated person or person with
30 a disability who does not require medical monitoring, aid, care or
31 treatment during transport.

1 ~~28.~~ 29. "Suboperation station" means a physical facility or
2 location at which an ambulance service conducts operations for the dispatch
3 of ambulances and personnel and that may be staffed twenty-four hours a day
4 or less as determined by system use.

5 ~~29.~~ 30. "Trauma center" means any acute care hospital that provides
6 in-house twenty-four hour daily dedicated trauma surgical services that is
7 designated pursuant to section 36-2225.

8 ~~30.~~ 31. "Trauma registry" means data collected by the department on
9 trauma patients and on the incidence, causes, severity, outcomes and
10 operation of a trauma system and its components.

11 ~~31.~~ 32. "Trauma system" means an integrated and organized
12 arrangement of health care resources having the specific capability to
13 perform triage, transport and provide care.

14 ~~32.~~ 33. "Validated testing procedure" means a testing procedure
15 that is inclusive of practical skills, or an attestation of practical
16 skills proficiency on a form developed by the department by the educational
17 training program, identified pursuant to section 36-2204, paragraph 2, that
18 is certified as valid by an organization capable of determining testing
19 procedure and testing content validity and that is recommended by the
20 medical direction commission and the emergency medical services council
21 before the director's approval.

23 designed and constructed or modified to contain a wheelchair and that is

31 person or person with a disability who does not require medical monitoring,

1 care or treatment during transport and that is not advertised as having
2 medical equipment and supplies or ambulance attendants.

3 6. "Ambulance attendant" means any of the following:

9 ambulance.

19 OF THIS STATE AND THAT IS USED IN THE COURSE OF THE DEPARTMENT'S OR
20 AGENCY'S OFFICIAL WORK.

21 (b) INCLUDES A SEARCH AND RESCUE DOG, SERVICE DOG, ACCELERANT
22 DETECTION CANINE OR OTHER DOG THAT IS IN USE BY THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY
23 FOR OFFICIAL DUTIES.

15 testing content validity and that is recommended by the medical direction
16 commission and the emergency medical services council before the director's
17 approval.

23 Sec. 3. Title 36, chapter 21.1, article 1, Arizona Revised Statutes,
24 is amended by adding section 36-2230, to read:

25 36-2230. Ambulance services; police dogs; authorization;
26 policies and procedures; immunity

27 A. EACH AMBULANCE SERVICE SHALL AUTHORIZE ITS EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE
28 TECHNICIANS TO PROVIDE EMERGENCY TREATMENT, IF TRAINED, TO A POLICE DOG
29 THAT IS INJURED IN THE LINE OF DUTY AND TO TRANSPORT THE POLICE DOG, ALONG
30 WITH A POLICE OFFICER OR OTHER POLICE PERSONNEL WHO ARE MEDICALLY TRAINED,
31 BY AMBULANCE OR ANOTHER EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES VEHICLE TO A VETERINARY
32 CLINIC OR VETERINARY HOSPITAL EQUIPPED TO PROVIDE EMERGENCY TREATMENT TO

1 DOGS, IF A PERSON IS NOT REQUIRING EMERGENCY MEDICAL TREATMENT OR TRANSPORT
2 AT THAT TIME.

3 B. EACH AMBULANCE SERVICE MAY DEVELOP WRITTEN POLICIES AND
4 PROCEDURES FOR ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

5 1. APPROPRIATE TRAINING OF THE AMBULANCE SERVICE'S EMERGENCY MEDICAL
6 CARE TECHNICIAN PERSONNEL TO PROVIDE POLICE DOGS WITH BASIC LEVEL FIRST
7 AID, CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION AND LIFE-SAVING INTERVENTIONS, INCLUDING
8 ADMINISTERING NALOXONE, THAT ARE DEVELOPED IN CONSULTATION WITH A
9 VETERINARIAN WHO IS LICENSED IN THIS STATE.

10 2. SAFE HANDLING PROCEDURES FOR INJURED POLICE DOGS, INCLUDING THE
11 USE OF A BOX MUZZLE, AND RESPONSE COORDINATION WITH A LAW ENFORCEMENT
12 AGENCY MEMBER WHO IS TRAINED IN HANDLING POLICE DOGS, THAT ARE DEVELOPED IN
13 CONSULTATION WITH A VETERINARIAN WHO IS LICENSED IN THIS STATE AND A LAW
14 ENFORCEMENT POLICE DOG HANDLER OR TRAINER.

15 3. IDENTIFICATION OF LOCAL VETERINARY FACILITIES THAT WILL PROVIDE
16 EMERGENCY TREATMENT OF INJURED POLICE DOGS ON SHORT NOTICE.

17 4. PROPER AND COMPLETE DECONTAMINATION OF STRETCHERS, THE PATIENT
18 COMPARTMENT AND ALL CONTAMINATED MEDICAL EQUIPMENT AFTER A POLICE DOG HAS
19 BEEN TRANSPORTED BY AN AMBULANCE OR OTHER EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES
20 VEHICLE.

21 5. STERILIZATION OF THE INTERIOR OF AN AMBULANCE OR OTHER EMERGENCY
22 MEDICAL SERVICES VEHICLE, INCLUDING COMPLETE SANITIZING OF ALL ALLERGENS
23 AND DISINFECTION TO A STANDARD SAFE FOR HUMAN TRANSPORT BEFORE THE
24 AMBULANCE OR OTHER VEHICLE IS RETURNED TO HUMAN SERVICE.

25 C. EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE TECHNICIANS AND ANY OTHER PERSONNEL
26 CERTIFIED UNDER THIS CHAPTER WHO IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES AND IN
27 GOOD FAITH RENDER EMERGENCY FIRST AID, CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION,
28 TRANSPORTATION OR OTHER EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES TO AN INJURED POLICE DOG
29 PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION ARE NOT PERSONALLY LIABLE AS A RESULT OF RENDERING
30 SUCH AID OR SERVICES.
