AN ACT

ESTABLISHING THE MOVE OVER LAW STUDY COMMITTEE.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Move over law study committee; membership; duties;
3 report; delayed repeal

4 A. The move over law study committee is established consisting of
5 the following members:

6 1. Two members of the senate who are appointed by the president of
7 the senate and who are from different political parties. The president of
8 the senate shall designate one of these members to serve as cochairperson
9 of the committee.

10 2. Two members of the house of representatives who are appointed by
11 the speaker of the house of representatives and who are from different
12 political parties. The speaker of the house of representatives shall
13 designate one of these members to serve as cochairperson of the committee.

14 3. The director of the department of transportation or the
15 director's designee.

16 4. Two members who are appointed by the director of the department
17 of public safety.

18 5. One designated towing representative who is appointed by the
19 governor.

20 B. Committee members are not eligible to receive compensation, but
21 the member who is appointed by the governor is eligible for reimbursement
22 of expenses pursuant to title 38, chapter 4, article 2, Arizona Revised
23 Statutes.

24 C. The committee shall:

25 1. Conduct a comprehensive study to determine the efficacy of
26 section 28-775, Arizona Revised Statutes, and to determine if additional
27 promotion of the law is needed to ensure its effectiveness.

28 2. Identify any potential additional resources or policy
29 initiatives that would enhance public safety or could be devoted to
30 improving the efficacy of section 28-775, Arizona Revised Statutes.

31 3. Propose legislation to address issues identified by the
32 committee.

33 4. Make policy recommendations to improve safety matters for first
34 responders and citizens and produce policy recommendations relating to
35 safety under section 28-775, Arizona Revised Statutes.

36 5. On or before December 1, 2024, submit a report regarding the
37 study committee's activities and recommendations for administrative or
38 legislative action to the governor, the president of the senate and the
39 speaker of the house of representatives and provide a copy of this report
40 to the secretary of state.

41 D. This section is repealed from and after September 30, 2025.
