AMENDING SECTIONS 28-3002 AND 28-3165, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:  
2 Section 1. Section 28-3002, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4       28-3002. Fees; driver licenses; disposition; exemption

5       A. The following fees are required:

6       1. For each original or initial application or renewal application,  
7 if a written examination is required, for the following:

8           (a) Class A driver license, ~~twenty-five dollars~~ \$25.

9           (b) Class B driver license, ~~twenty five dollars~~ \$25.

10           (c) Class C driver license, ~~twelve dollars fifty cents~~ \$12.50.

11           (d) Class D driver license issued pursuant to section 28-3171, ~~ten~~  
12 ~~dollars~~ \$10.

13           (e) Class M driver license issued pursuant to section 28-3171, ~~ten~~  
14 ~~dollars~~ \$10.

15       2. Except as provided in paragraph 1 **OF THIS SUBSECTION**, for each  
16 original, renewal or reinstatement application for a class D, G or M  
17 license:

23       3. For each original or initial application or renewal examination,  
24 if a written application is required, for the following endorsements to a  
25 driver license:

26           (a) Bus endorsement, ~~ten dollars~~ \$10.

27           (b) Hazardous materials endorsement, ~~ten dollars~~ \$10.

28           (c) Tank vehicle endorsement, ~~ten dollars~~ \$10.

29           (d) Double-triple trailer endorsement, ~~ten dollars~~ \$10.

30           (e) Motorcycle endorsement, ~~seven dollars~~ \$7.

31       4. For taking each driving test for a:

32           (a) Class A driver license, ~~twenty-five dollars~~ \$25.

33           (b) Class B driver license, ~~twenty-five dollars~~ \$25.

34           (c) Class C driver license, ~~twelve dollars fifty cents~~ \$12.50.

35           (d) Bus endorsement, ~~five dollars~~ \$5.

36       5. For each application for an instruction permit under:

37           (a) Section 28-3154 or 28-3156, ~~seven dollars~~ \$7.

38           (b) Section 28-3155, ~~three dollars~~ \$3.

39           (c) Section 28-3225, class A, ~~twenty-five dollars~~ \$25.

40           (d) Section 28-3225, class B, ~~twenty five dollars~~ \$25.

41           (e) Section 28-3225, class C, ~~twelve dollars fifty cents~~ \$12.50.

42       6. For each renewal application, if a written examination is not  
43 required, for a:

44           (a) Class A driver license and any endorsement, other than a  
45 hazardous materials endorsement, to the license, ~~fifteen dollars~~ \$15.

(b) Class B driver license and any endorsement, other than a hazardous materials endorsement, to the license, ~~fifteen dollars~~ \$15.

(c) Class C driver license and any endorsement, other than a hazardous materials endorsement, to the license, ~~ten dollars~~ \$10.

7. For each application for a duplicate of a driver license, an amount determined by the director.

8. For each application for a duplicate of an instruction permit,  
~~two dollars~~ \$2.

9. In addition to the fees prescribed in paragraph 2 OF THIS SUBSECTION and except as provided in paragraph 11 OF THIS SUBSECTION:

(a) For reinstatement of driving privileges after suspension or disqualification, ~~ten dollars~~ \$10.

(b) For reinstatement of driving privileges after revocation, ~~twenty dollars~~ \$20.

10. For each application for an extension by mail of a driver license, ~~five dollars~~ \$5.

11. In addition to the fees prescribed in paragraph 2 OF THIS SUBSECTION, for reinstatement of driving privileges that were suspended or denied pursuant to section 28-1385 after completion of the suspension or revocation, ~~fifty dollars~~ \$50.

12. For vision screening tests of out-of-state drivers, ~~five dollars~~ \$5.

13. For class D or M driver license skills tests for out-of-state drivers, ~~fifteen dollars~~ \$15.

14. For a driver license or nonoperating identification license issued pursuant to section 28-3175, an amount to be determined by the director.

B. Except as otherwise provided by statute, the director shall immediately deposit, pursuant to sections 35-146 and 35-147, fees collected under this section in the Arizona highway user revenue fund.

C. The fees established ~~pursuant to~~ BY this section do not apply to a ~~veteran~~ PERSON who does not have a residence address or whose residence address is the address of a shelter that provides services to the homeless. ~~For the purposes of this subsection, "veteran" has the same meaning prescribed in section 41-601.~~

Sec. 2. Section 28-3165, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

28-3165. Nonoperating identification license; immunity; rules; emancipated minors

A. On receipt of an application from a person who does not have a valid driver license issued by this state or whose driving privilege is suspended, the department shall issue a nonoperating identification license that contains a distinguishing number assigned to the licensee, the full legal name, the date of birth, the residence address and a brief description of the licensee and either a facsimile of the signature of the

1 licensee or a space on which the licensee is required to write the  
2 licensee's usual signature with pen and ink. A nonoperating  
3 identification license that is issued to a person whose driving privilege  
4 is suspended shall not be valid for more than one hundred eighty days from  
5 the date of issuance.

6       B. On request of an applicant:

7           1. The department shall allow the applicant to provide on the  
8 nonoperating identification license a post office box address that is  
9 regularly used by the applicant.

10          2. If the applicant submits satisfactory proof to the department  
11 that the applicant is a veteran, the department shall allow a  
12 distinguishing mark to appear on the nonoperating identification license  
13 that identifies that person as a veteran.

14       C. A person who is issued a license pursuant to this section shall  
15 use it only for identification purposes of the licensee. The nonoperating  
16 identification license does not grant authority to operate a motor vehicle  
17 in this state. The department shall clearly label the nonoperating  
18 identification license "for identification only, not for operation of a  
19 motor vehicle".

20       D. On issuance of a driver license, the holder of a nonoperating  
21 identification license shall surrender the nonoperating identification  
22 license to the department and the department shall not refund any fee paid  
23 for the issuance of the nonoperating identification license.

24       E. A nonoperating identification license shall contain the  
25 photograph of the licensee. The department shall use a process in the  
26 issuance of nonoperating identification licenses that prohibits as nearly  
27 as possible the ability to superimpose a photograph on the license without  
28 ready detection. The department shall process nonoperating identification  
29 licenses and photo attachments in color.

30       F. On application, an applicant shall give the department  
31 satisfactory proof of the applicant's full legal name, date of birth, sex  
32 and residence address, if the applicant has a residence address, and that  
33 the applicant's presence in the United States is authorized under federal  
34 law. The application shall briefly describe the applicant, state whether  
35 the applicant has been licensed, and if so, the type of license issued,  
36 when and by what state or country and whether any such license is under  
37 suspension, revocation or cancellation. The application shall contain  
38 other identifying information required by the department.

39       G. The department may adopt and implement procedures to deny a  
40 nonoperating identification license to a person who has been deported.  
41 The department may adopt and implement procedures to reinstate a person's  
42 privilege to apply for a nonoperating identification license if the  
43 person's legal presence status is restored.

1        H. A nonoperating identification license issued by the department  
2 is solely for the use and convenience of the applicant for identification  
3 purposes.

4        I. The department shall adopt rules and establish fees for issuance  
5 of a nonoperating identification license, except that the department shall  
6 not require an examination.

7        J. The fees established pursuant to this section do not apply to  
8 any of the following:

- 9            1. A person who is sixty-five years of age or older.
- 10          2. A person who is a recipient of public monies as an individual  
11 with a disability under title XVI of the social security act, as amended.
- 12          3. A **veteran PERSON** who does not have a residence address.
- 13          4. A **veteran PERSON** whose residence address is the address of a  
14 shelter that provides services to the homeless.

15        5. A child **WHO IS** in the custody of the department of child safety.  
16        K. If a person qualifies for a nonoperating identification license  
17 and is under the legal drinking age, the department shall issue a license  
18 that is marked by color, code or design to immediately distinguish it from  
19 a nonoperating identification license issued to a person of legal drinking  
20 age. The department shall indicate on the nonoperating identification  
21 license issued pursuant to this subsection the year in which the person  
22 will attain the legal drinking age.

23        L. If a minor has been emancipated pursuant to title 12, chapter  
24 15, on application and proof of emancipation, the department shall issue a  
25 nonoperating identification license that contains the words "emancipated  
26 minor".

27        M. Notwithstanding any other law, if an applicant for a  
28 nonoperating identification license is at least sixteen years of age and  
29 either does not have a residence address or is in the department of child  
30 safety's custody, the applicant does not need a signature of the  
31 applicant's parent, guardian, foster parent or employer.
