# **HOUSE BILL 2608**

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 15-189.05, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 5, ARTICLE 1, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 15-501.02; AMENDING SECTION 15-903, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO SCHOOL EMPLOYEES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:  
2       Section 1. Section 15-189.05, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended  
3 to read:

4           15-189.05. Charter school budgets; posting of teacher salary  
5           information; annual report

6       A. The budget for each charter school shall contain the following  
7 information:

8           1. The average salary of all teachers employed by the charter  
9 school for the current year.

10          2. The average salary of all teachers employed by the charter  
11 school for the previous year.

12          3. The dollar increase in the average salary of all teachers  
13 employed by the charter school for the current year.

14          4. The percentage increase in the average salary of all teachers  
15 employed by the charter school for the current year.

16          5. THE NUMBER OF FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT TEACHERS THAT THE CHARTER  
17 SCHOOL INCLUDED IN THE BUDGET FOR THE CURRENT YEAR, INCLUDING THE NUMBER  
18 OF TEACHERS INCLUDED IN THE BUDGET FOR EACH SCHOOL SITE, IF APPLICABLE,  
19 DISAGGREGATED BY SUBJECT AREA AND GRADE LEVEL.

20       B. Each charter school shall prominently post the information  
21 required by subsection A of this section on its website home page  
22 separately from its budget.

23       C. On or before November 30 of each year, the department of  
24 education shall electronically submit to the joint legislative budget  
25 committee and the governor's office of strategic planning and budgeting a  
26 report that compiles the information required by subsection A of this  
27 section for all charter schools statewide.

28       Sec. 2. Title 15, chapter 5, article 1, Arizona Revised Statutes,  
29 is amended by adding section 15-501.02, to read:

30           15-501.02. Comprehensive study; teacher retention; annual  
31           report

32       A. THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL CONDUCT AND COMPLETE A  
33 COMPREHENSIVE STUDY TO DETERMINE THE RETENTION RATE OF TEACHERS IN SCHOOL  
34 DISTRICTS AND CHARTER SCHOOLS IN THIS STATE. THE STUDY SHALL INCLUDE:

35          1. THE TOTAL NUMBER OF TEACHERS, THE RETENTION RATE AND THE  
36 TURNOVER RATE FOR EACH OF THE FOLLOWING:

37           (a) CERTIFICATED TEACHERS, BY EACH TYPE OF TEACHING CERTIFICATE  
38 PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-501.01, SUBSECTION B.

39           (b) NONCERTIFICATED TEACHERS AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 15-183,  
40 SUBSECTION C, PARAGRAPH 5.

41           (c) TEACHING ASSIGNMENT, INCLUDING BOTH:

42              (i) SUBJECT AREA TAUGHT.

43              (ii) GRADE LEVEL TAUGHT, INCLUDING TEACHERS WHO ARE ASSIGNED TO  
44 KINDERGARTEN PROGRAMS.

45           (d) LOCATION, INCLUDING ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

1                   (i) BY SCHOOL SITE.

2                   (ii) BY SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL.

3                   (iii) BY CITY OR TOWN.

4                   (iv) BY COUNTY.

5                   (e) THE NUMBER OF YEARS OF EXPERIENCE OF EACH TEACHER.

6                   (f) THE NUMBER OF TEACHERS WHO, WITHIN THEIR FIRST THREE YEARS OF  
7 TEACHING, RECEIVED FORMAL MENTORSHIP FROM AN INDIVIDUAL WITH FIVE OR MORE  
8 YEARS OF TEACHING EXPERIENCE.

9                   (g) ANY OTHER CATEGORY IDENTIFIED BY THE BOARD.

10                  2. THE NUMBER OF VACANT TEACHING POSITIONS, INCLUDING THE AVERAGE  
11 TIME TO FILL A VACANCY, FOR EACH OF THE FOLLOWING:

12                  (a) TEACHING ASSIGNMENT, INCLUDING BOTH:

13                  (i) SUBJECT AREA TAUGHT.

14                  (ii) GRADE LEVEL TAUGHT, INCLUDING TEACHERS WHO ARE ASSIGNED TO  
15 KINDERGARTEN PROGRAMS.

16                  (b) LOCATION, INCLUDING ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

17                  (i) BY SCHOOL SITE.

18                  (ii) BY SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL.

19                  (iii) BY CITY OR TOWN.

20                  (iv) BY COUNTY.

21                  (c) ANY OTHER CATEGORY IDENTIFIED BY THE BOARD.

22                  3. AN ANALYSIS OF DATA FOR EACH STATE BOARD-APPROVED TEACHER  
23 PREPARATION PROGRAM, INCLUDING:

24                  (a) DATA RELATING TO PROGRAM COMPLETION.

25                  (b) PROGRAM EMPHASIS, IF ANY, INCLUDING SUBJECT AREA AND GRADE  
26 LEVEL.

27                  (c) THE NUMBER OF YEARS THAT INDIVIDUALS SPEND WORKING AS TEACHERS  
28 IN THIS STATE AFTER COMPLETING THE PROGRAM.

29                  B. THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND STATE BOARD FOR CHARTER SCHOOLS  
30 SHALL COLLECT AND PROVIDE ANY DATA OR INFORMATION REQUESTED BY THE STATE  
31 BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION.

32                  C. ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE  
33 BOARD SHALL SUBMIT THE STUDY RESULTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR,  
34 THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF  
35 REPRESENTATIVES AND SHALL PROVIDE A COPY TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

36                  Sec. 3. Section 15-903, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
37 read:

38                  15-903. Budget format; prohibited expenditures; annual report

39                  A. The superintendent of public instruction in conjunction with the  
40 auditor general shall prepare and prescribe a budget format to be used by  
41 all school districts.

42                  B. The budget format shall be designed to allow all school  
43 districts to plan and provide in detail for using available monies. The  
44 budget format shall contain distinct sections for, but need not be limited  
45 to, maintenance and operation, debt service, special projects, capital

1 outlay, adjacent ways and classroom site fund. The maintenance and  
2 operation section shall include, but need not be limited to, separate  
3 subsections for regular education programs, special education programs and  
4 operational expenditures for pupil transportation. Each subsection shall  
5 clearly distinguish classroom instruction expenditures. The special  
6 education program subsection shall include a subtotal for the disability  
7 classifications as defined in section 15-761 and programs for gifted,  
8 vocational and technical education, remedial education and bilingual  
9 students. The total expenditures for each of these programs shall be  
10 included on the budget form. The pupil transportation subsection shall  
11 include all operational expenditures relating to transporting pupils,  
12 including all operational expenditures within a contract if the school  
13 district contracts for pupil transportation.

14 C. The capital outlay section of the budget shall include a  
15 subsection for unrestricted capital outlay. The unrestricted capital  
16 outlay subsection shall include budgeted expenditures for acquisitions by  
17 purchase, lease-purchase or lease of capital items as defined in the  
18 uniform system of financial records and shall include:

19 1. Land, buildings and improvements to land and buildings,  
20 including labor and related employee benefits costs and material costs if  
21 work is performed by school district employees.

22 2. Furniture, furnishings, athletic equipment and other equipment,  
23 including computer software.

24 3. Pupil and nonpupil transportation vehicles and equipment,  
25 including all capital expenditures within a contract if the school  
26 district contracts for pupil transportation.

27 4. Textbooks and related printed subject matter materials adopted  
28 by the governing board.

29 5. Instructional aids.

30 6. Library books.

31 7. Payment of principal and interest on bonds.

32 8. School district administration emergency needs that are directly  
33 related to pupils.

34 D. The budget format shall contain distinct subsections for the  
35 following:

36 1. Special programs to improve academic achievement of pupils in  
37 kindergarten programs and grades one through three as provided in section  
38 15-482.

39 2. School plant funds.

40 3. Capital outlay budget increases as provided in section 15-481.

41 4. Property taxation, including the following:

42 (a) The primary tax rates for the school district for the current  
43 year and the budget year.

1           (b) The secondary tax rates for maintenance and operation, K-3 and  
2 capital overrides for the school district for the current year and the  
3 budget year.

4           (c) The secondary tax rates for class A bonds for the school  
5 district for the current year and the budget year.

6           (d) The secondary tax rates for class B bonds for the school  
7 district for the current year and the budget year.

8           5. A description of any corrections or adjustments made to the  
9 budget pursuant to section 15-915.

10          E. The budget format shall also contain:

11          1. A statement identifying proposed pupil-teacher ratios and  
12 pupil-staff ratios relating to the provision of special education services  
13 for the budget year.

14          2. THE NUMBER OF FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT TEACHERS THAT THE SCHOOL  
15 DISTRICT INCLUDED IN THE BUDGET FOR THE CURRENT YEAR, INCLUDING THE NUMBER  
16 OF TEACHERS INCLUDED IN THE BUDGET FOR EACH SCHOOL THAT IS OPERATED BY THE  
17 SCHOOL DISTRICT, DISAGGREGATED BY SUBJECT AREA AND GRADE LEVEL.

18          ~~2.~~ 3. The prominent display of the average salary of all teachers  
19 employed by the school district for the current year. The school district  
20 shall also prominently post this information on its website home page  
21 separately from its budget.

22          ~~3.~~ 4. The prominent display of the average salary of all teachers  
23 employed by the school district for the previous year. The school district  
24 shall also prominently post this information on its website home page  
25 separately from its budget.

26          ~~4.~~ 5. The prominent display of the dollar increase in the average  
27 salary of all teachers employed by the school district for the current  
28 year. The school district shall also prominently post this information on  
29 its website home page separately from its budget.

30          ~~5.~~ 6. The prominent display of the percentage increase in the  
31 average salary of all teachers employed by the school district for the  
32 current year. The school district shall also prominently post this  
33 information on its website home page separately from its budget.

34          F. The special projects section shall include budgeted expenditures  
35 for state special projects, including special adult projects, career  
36 education, deficiencies correction fund projects and new school facilities  
37 fund projects, such federal special projects as ESEA title programs,  
38 vocational education and title IV Indian education, and other special  
39 projects.

40          G. A school district shall not make expenditures for campaign  
41 literature associated with school district or charter school officials.  
42 If the superintendent of public instruction determines that a school  
43 district has violated this subsection, the superintendent of public  
44 instruction may withhold any portion of the school district's  
45 apportionment of state aid.

1        H. The budget format shall include an electronic format that shall  
2 be submitted for each proposed, adopted and revised budget.

3        I. On or before November 30 of each year, the department of  
4 education shall electronically submit to the joint legislative budget  
5 committee and the governor's office of strategic planning and budgeting a  
6 report that compiles the information required by subsection E, paragraphs  
7 2 through ~~5~~ 6 of this section for all school districts statewide.
