SENATE BILL 1024

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 36-551, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 36-551, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 3 read: 4 36-551. Definitions 5 In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires: 6 1. "Adaptive behavior" means the effectiveness or degree to which a personal 7 person meets the standards of independence and social 8 responsibility expected of the person's age and cultural group. 9 2. "Adult developmental home" means a residential setting in a family home in which the care, physical custody and supervision of the 10 adult client are the responsibility, under a twenty-four-hour care model, 11 12 of the licensee who, in that capacity, is not an employee of the division 13 or of a service provider and the home provides the following services for 14 a group of siblings or up to three adults with developmental disabilities: 15 (a) Room and board. 16 (b) Habilitation. (c) Appropriate personal care. 17 18 (d) Appropriate supervision. 19 3. "Adult household member": 20 (a) Means a person who is at least eighteen years of age and who 21 resides in an adult developmental home, child developmental home or other 22 home and community based service setting for at least thirty days or who 23 resides in the household throughout the year for more than a cumulative 24 total of thirty days. 25 (b) Does not include a person who is receiving developmental 26 disabilities services from the department. 27 4. "Advisory council" means the developmental disabilities advisory 28 council. "Arizona training program facility" means a state-operated 29 5. institution for clients of the department with developmental disabilities. 30 31 "Attributable to cognitive disability, epilepsy, cerebral palsy 6. 32 or autism" means that there is a causal relationship between the presence of an impairing condition and the developmental disability. 33 34 7. "Autism" means a condition characterized by severe disorders in 35 communication and behavior resulting in limited ability to communicate, 36 understand, learn and participate in social relationships. 37 8. "Behavioral-supported group home" means a community residential setting that meets all of the following: 38 than six persons 39 (a) Is for not more developmental with 40 disabilities. (b) Is operated by a service provider under contract with the 41 42 department. 43 (c) Provides room and board, daily habilitation, assistance in 44 self-administering medication and medication administration and behavioral 45 health services for clients with dual disorders, including psychiatric 46 disorders and developmental disabilities, who engage in behaviors that are

1 disruptive, socially inappropriate or harmful or dangerous to self or 2 others, that interfere with functioning and quality of life or that may 3 cause destruction of property.

9. "Case management" means coordinating the assistance needed by persons with developmental disabilities and their families in order to ensure that persons with developmental disabilities attain their maximum potential for independence, productivity and integration into the community.

9 10. "Case manager" means a person who coordinates the 10 implementation of the individual program plan of goals, objectives and 11 appropriate services for persons with developmental disabilities.

12 11. "Cerebral palsy" means a permanently disabling condition 13 resulting from damage to the developing brain that may occur before, after 14 or during birth and that results in loss or impairment of control over 15 voluntary muscles.

16 12. "Child developmental certified home" means a regular foster 17 home as defined in section 8-501 that is licensed pursuant to section 18 8-509 and that is certified by the department pursuant to section 19 36-593.01.

13. "Child developmental home" means a residential setting in a family home in which the care and supervision of the child are the responsibility, under a twenty-four-hour care model, of the licensee who serves as the developmental home provider of the child in the home setting and who, in that capacity, is not an employee of the division or of a service provider and the home provides the following services for a group of siblings or up to three children with developmental disabilities:

(a) Room and board.

(b) Habilitation.

(c) Appropriate personal care.

(d) Appropriate supervision.

31 14. "Client" means a person receiving developmental disabilities 32 services from the department.

33 15. "Cognitive disability" means a condition that involves 34 subaverage general intellectual functioning, that exists concurrently with 35 deficits in adaptive behavior manifested before the age of eighteen and 36 that is sometimes referred to as intellectual disability.

37

16. "Community residential setting":

(a) Means a residential setting in which persons with developmental
 disabilities live and are provided with appropriate supervision by the
 service provider responsible for operating the residential setting.

41 (b) Includes a child developmental home or an adult developmental 42 home operated or contracted by the department or the department's 43 contracted vendor, a group home operated or contracted by the department 44 or a behavioral-supported group home or nursing-supported group home 45 contracted by the department.

1 17. "Consent" means voluntary informed consent. Consent is 2 voluntary if not given as the result of coercion or undue influence. 3 Consent is informed if the person giving the consent has been informed of 4 and comprehends the nature, purpose, consequences, risks and benefits of 5 the alternatives to the procedure, and has been informed and comprehends 6 that withholding or withdrawing consent will not prejudice the future 7 provision of care and services to the client. In cases of unusual or 8 hazardous treatment procedures performed pursuant to section 36-561, 9 experimental research, organ transplantation subsection Α. and nontherapeutic surgery, consent is informed if, in addition to 10 the foregoing, the person giving the consent has been informed of 11 and 12 comprehends the method to be used in the proposed procedure.

13 18. "Daily habilitation" means habilitation as defined in this 14 section, except that the method of payment is for one unit per residential 15 day.

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19. "Department" means the department of economic security.

17 20. "Developmental disability" means either a strongly demonstrated 18 potential that a child who is under six years of age has a developmental 19 disability or will develop a developmental disability, as determined by a 20 test performed pursuant to section 36-694 or by other appropriate tests, 21 or a severe, chronic disability that:

(a) Is attributable to a cognitive disability, cerebral palsy,
epilepsy, down syndrome, SPINA BIFIDA or autism.

24 25 (b) Is manifested before the age of eighteen.

(c) Is likely to continue indefinitely.

26 (d) Results in substantial functional limitations in three or more 27 of the following areas of major life activity:

- 28 (i) Self-care.
- 29 (ii) Receptive and expressive language.
- 30 (iii) Learning.
- 31 (iv) Mobility.
- 32 (v) Self-direction.
- 33 (vi) Capacity for independent living.
- 34 (vii) Economic self-sufficiency.

35 (e) Reflects the need for a combination and sequence of 36 individually planned or coordinated special, interdisciplinary or generic 37 care, treatment or other services that are of lifelong or extended 38 duration.

39 21. "Director" means the director of the department of economic 40 security.

41 22. "Division" means the division of developmental disabilities in42 the department of economic security.

23. "Down syndrome" means a genetic disorder caused when abnormal
 cell division results in extra genetic material from chromosome 21,
 affecting a person's cognitive and physical abilities and causing
 developmental issues.

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1 24. "Epilepsy" means a neurological condition characterized by 2 abnormal electrical-chemical discharge in the brain. This discharge is 3 manifested in various forms of physical activities called seizures.

25. "Group home":

5 (a) Means a community residential setting for not more than six 6 persons with developmental disabilities that is operated by a service 7 provider under contract with the department and that provides room and 8 board and daily habilitation and other assessed medically necessary 9 services and supports to meet the needs of each person.

10 (b) Does not include an adult developmental home, a child 11 developmental home, a behavioral-supported group home, a nursing-supported 12 group home or an intermediate care facility for individuals with 13 intellectual disabilities.

14 26. "Guardian" means the person who, under court order, is
15 appointed to fulfill the powers and duties prescribed in section 14-5312.
16 Guardian does not include a guardian pursuant to section 14-5312.01.

17 27. "Habilitation" means the process by which a person is assisted 18 to acquire and maintain those life skills that enable the person to cope 19 more effectively with personal and environmental demands and to raise the 20 level of the person's physical, mental and social efficiency.

21 28. "Indigent" means a person with a developmental disability whose 22 estate or parent is unable to bear the full cost of maintaining or 23 providing services for that person in a developmental disabilities 24 program.

25 29. "Individual program plan" means a written statement of services 26 to be provided to a person with developmental disabilities, including 27 habilitation goals and objectives, that is developed following initial 28 placement evaluation and revised after periodic evaluations.

29 30. "Intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual 30 disabilities" means a facility that primarily provides health and 31 rehabilitative services to persons with developmental disabilities that 32 are above the service level of room and board or supervisory care services 33 or personal care services as defined in section 36-401.

34 31. "Large group setting" means a setting that in addition to 35 residential care provides support services such as therapy, recreation and 36 transportation to seven or more persons with developmental disabilities 37 who require intensive supervision.

38 32. "Least restrictive alternative" means an available program or 39 facility that fosters independent living, that is the least confining for 40 the client's condition and that provides service and treatment in the 41 least intrusive manner reasonably and humanely appropriate to the 42 individual's needs.

43 33. "Likely to continue indefinitely" means that the developmental 44 disability has a reasonable likelihood of continuing for a protracted 45 period of time or for life.

34. 1 "Manifested before the age of eighteen" means that the 2 disability must be apparent and have a substantially limiting effect on a person's functioning before the age of eighteen. 3

4 35. "Nursing-supported group home" has the same meaning prescribed 5 in section 36-401.

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36. "Physician" means a person who is licensed to practice pursuant 7 to title 32, chapter 13 or 17.

8 37. "Placement evaluation" means an interview and evaluation of a 9 person with a developmental disability and a review of the person's prior medical and program histories to determine the appropriate developmental 10 disability programs and services for the person and recommendations for 11 12 specific program placements for the person.

13 38. "Psychologist" means a person who is licensed pursuant to 14 title 32, chapter 19.1.

15 39. "Respite services" means services that provide a short-term or 16 long-term interval of rest or relief to the care provider of a person with 17 a developmental disability.

40. "Responsible person" means the parent or guardian of a minor 18 19 with a developmental disability, the guardian of an adult with a 20 developmental disability or an adult with a developmental disability who 21 is a client or an applicant for whom no guardian has been appointed.

22 41. "Service provider" means a person or agency that provides 23 services to clients pursuant to a contract, service agreement or qualified 24 vendor agreement with the division.

25 42. "SPINA BIFIDA" MEANS A TYPE OF NEURAL TUBE DEFECT THAT OCCURS WHEN A PERSON'S NEURAL TUBE FAILS TO DEVELOP OR CLOSE PROPERLY BEFORE 26 27 BIRTH AND OF WHICH THE SEVERITY DEPENDS ON MANY FACTORS, INCLUDING THE 28 SIZE OF THE SPINAL OPENING AND THE LOCATION ON THE SPINE.

29 42. 43. "State operated service center" means a state owned or 30 leased facility that is operated by the department and that provides temporary residential care and space for child and adult services that 31 32 include respite care, crisis intervention and diagnostic evaluation.

33 intellectual 43. 44. "Subaverage general functioning" means measured intelligence on standardized psychometric instruments of two or 34 35 more standard deviations below the mean for the tests used.

44. 45. "Substantial functional limitation" means a limitation so 36 37 severe that extraordinary assistance from other people, programs, services 38 or mechanical devices is required to assist the person in performing 39 appropriate major life activities.

40 45. 46. "Supervision" means the process by which the activities of an individual with developmental disabilities are directed, influenced or 41 42 monitored.
