AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 15-1822, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO ADMISSION  
OF STUDENTS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 15-1822, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4 15-1822. Report; academic performance of high school  
5 graduates

6 A. On or before October 31 **OF EACH YEAR**, each community college  
7 district and the Arizona board of regents shall submit a report to the  
8 president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the  
9 superintendent of public instruction and the state board of education and  
10 shall provide a copy of this report to the secretary of state ~~and the~~  
11 ~~director of the Arizona state library, archives and public records~~, on the  
12 academic performance of the preceding year's graduates from high schools  
13 in this state enrolled in institutions under their jurisdiction during the  
14 year ending on June 30 of the current calendar year. The report shall  
15 include for each school at least the following:

16 1. The number of graduates of the school who were enrolled in the  
17 institution during the reporting period.

18 2. Information about the academic performance of graduates of the  
19 school in mathematics and English courses.

20 B. On or before September 1 **OF EACH YEAR**, each institution under  
21 the jurisdiction of the Arizona board of regents shall submit to the  
22 Arizona board of regents in the form specified by the Arizona board of  
23 regents the information that the Arizona board of regents needs to compile  
24 the report required under this section.

25 C. The superintendent of public instruction shall provide each high  
26 school in this state with a copy of the portion of the report that is  
27 applicable to its graduates.
