SENATE BILL 1180

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 28-101 AND 28-2157, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 28, CHAPTER 7, ARTICLE 11, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 28-2357; AMENDING SECTION 28-3101, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO VEHICLE REGISTRATION.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: 2 Section 1. Section 28-101, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to 3 read: 4 28-101. Definitions 5 In this title, unless the context otherwise requires: 6 1. "Alcohol" means any substance containing any form of alcohol, 7 including ethanol, methanol, propynol and isopropynol. 8 2. "Alcohol concentration" if expressed as a percentage means 9 either: 10 (a) The number of grams of alcohol per one hundred milliliters of 11 blood. (b) The number of grams of alcohol per two hundred ten liters of 12 13 breath. "All-terrain vehicle" means either of the following: 14 3. (a) A motor vehicle that satisfies all of the following: 15 16 (i) Is designed primarily for recreational nonhighway all-terrain 17 travel. 18 (ii) Is fifty or fewer inches in width. 19 (iii) Has an unladen weight of one thousand two hundred pounds or 20 less. 21 (iv) Travels on three or more nonhighway tires. 22 (v) Is operated on a public highway. 23 (b) A recreational off-highway vehicle that satisfies all of the 24 following: 25 (i) Is designed primarily for recreational nonhighway all-terrain 26 travel. 27 (ii) Is eighty or fewer inches in width. 28 (iii) Has an unladen weight of two thousand five hundred pounds or 29 less. 30 (iv) Travels on four or more nonhighway tires. 31 (v) Has a steering wheel for steering control. 32 (vi) Has a rollover protective structure. 33 (vii) Has an occupant retention system. 4. "Authorized emergency vehicle" means any of the following: 34 35 (a) A fire department vehicle. 36 (b) A police vehicle. (c) An ambulance or emergency vehicle of a municipal department or 37 public service corporation that is designated or authorized by the 38 39 department or a local authority. 40 (d) Any other ambulance, fire truck or rescue vehicle that is 41 authorized by the department in its sole discretion and that meets 42 liability insurance requirements prescribed by the department. 43 5. "Autocycle" means a three-wheeled motorcycle on which the driver 44 and passengers ride in a fully or partially enclosed seating area that is 45 equipped with a roll cage, safety belts for each occupant and antilock

1 brakes and that is designed to be controlled with a steering wheel and 2 pedals.

6. "Automated driving system" means the hardware and software that are collectively capable of performing the entire dynamic driving task on sustained basis, regardless of whether it is limited to a specific operational design domain.

7 7. "Automotive recycler" means a person that is engaged in the 8 business of buying or acquiring a motor vehicle solely for the purpose of 9 dismantling, selling or otherwise disposing of the parts or accessories 10 and that removes parts for resale from six or more vehicles in a calendar 11 year.

12 8. "Autonomous vehicle" means a motor vehicle that is equipped with 13 an automated driving system.

9. "Aviation fuel" means all flammable liquids composed of a mixture of selected hydrocarbons expressly manufactured and blended for the purpose of effectively and efficiently operating an internal combustion engine for use in an aircraft but does not include fuel for jet or turbine powered aircraft.

19 10. "Bicycle" means a device, including a racing wheelchair, that 20 is propelled by human power and on which a person may ride and that has 21 either:

(a) Two tandem wheels, either of which is more than sixteen inchesin diameter.

24 (b) Three wheels in contact with the ground, any of which is more 25 than sixteen inches in diameter.

11. "Board" means the transportation board.

27 12. "Bus" means a motor vehicle designed for carrying sixteen or28 more passengers, including the driver.

13. "Business district" means the territory contiguous to and including a highway if there are buildings in use for business or industrial purposes within any six hundred feet along the highway, including hotels, banks or office buildings, railroad stations and public buildings that occupy at least three hundred feet of frontage on one side or three hundred feet collectively on both sides of the highway.

35 14. "Certificate of ownership" means a paper or an electronic 36 record that is issued in another state or a foreign jurisdiction and that 37 indicates ownership of a vehicle.

38 15. "Certificate of title" means a paper document or an electronic 39 record that is issued by the department and that indicates ownership of a 40 vehicle.

41 16. "Combination of vehicles" means a truck or truck tractor and 42 semitrailer and any trailer that it tows but does not include a forklift 43 designed for the purpose of loading or unloading the truck, trailer or 44 semitrailer. 1 17. "Controlled substance" means a substance so classified under 2 section 102(6) of the controlled substances act (21 United States Code 3 section 802(6)) and includes all substances listed in schedules I through 4 V of 21 Code of Federal Regulations part 1308.

18. "Conviction" means:

6 (a) An unvacated adjudication of guilt or a determination that a 7 person violated or failed to comply with the law in a court of original 8 jurisdiction or by an authorized administrative tribunal.

9 (b) An unvacated forfeiture of bail or collateral deposited to 10 secure the person's appearance in court.

(c) A plea of guilty or no contest accepted by the court.

(d) The payment of a fine or court costs.

13 19. "County highway" means a public road that is constructed and 14 maintained by a county.

15 20. "Dealer" means a person who is engaged in the business of 16 buying, selling or exchanging motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers and 17 who has an established place of business and has paid fees pursuant to 18 section 28-4302.

19 21. "Department" means the department of transportation acting20 directly or through its duly authorized officers and agents.

21 22. "Digital network or software application" has the same meaning 22 prescribed in section 28-9551.

23 23. "Director" means the director of the department of 24 transportation.

25 24. "Drive" means to operate or be in actual physical control of a 26 motor vehicle.

27 25. "Driver" means a person who drives or is in actual physical28 control of a vehicle.

26. "Driver license" means a license that is issued by a state to
an individual and that authorizes the individual to drive a motor vehicle.
27. "Dynamic driving task":

32 (a) Means all of the real-time operational and tactical functions
 33 required to operate a vehicle in on-road traffic.

34 (b) Includes:

35

(i) Lateral vehicle motion control by steering.

(iv) Object and event response execution.

36 (ii) Longitudinal motion control by acceleration and deceleration.

37 (iii) Monitoring the driving environment by object and event38 detection, recognition, classification and response preparation.

39 40

41

(v) Maneuver planning.

(vi) Enhancing conspicuity by lighting, signaling and gesturing.

42 (c) Does not include strategic functions such as trip scheduling 43 and selecting destinations and waypoints.

44 28. "Electric bicycle" means a bicycle or tricycle that is equipped 45 with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than seven 1 hundred fifty watts and that meets the requirements of one of the 2 following classes:

3 (a) "Class 1 electric bicycle" means a bicycle or tricycle that is 4 equipped with an electric motor that provides assistance only when the 5 rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle 6 or tricycle reaches the speed of twenty miles per hour.

7 (b) "Class 2 electric bicycle" means a bicycle or tricycle that is 8 equipped with an electric motor that may be used exclusively to propel the 9 bicycle or tricycle and that is not capable of providing assistance when 10 the bicycle or tricycle reaches the speed of twenty miles per hour.

11 (c) "Class 3 electric bicycle" means a bicycle or tricycle that is 12 equipped with an electric motor that provides assistance only when the 13 rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle 14 or tricycle reaches the speed of twenty-eight miles per hour.

29. "Electric miniature scooter" means a device that:

16

(a) Weighs less than thirty pounds.

17

(b) Has two or three wheels.(c) Has handlebars.

18 19

(d) Has a floorboard on which a person may stand while riding.

20

(e) Is powered by an electric motor or human power, or both.

(f) Has a maximum speed that does not exceed ten miles per hour, with or without human propulsion, on a paved level surface.

30. "Electric personal assistive mobility device" means a self-balancing device with one wheel or two nontandem wheels and an electric propulsion system that limits the maximum speed of the device to fifteen miles per hour or less and that is designed to transport only one person.

31. "Electric standup scooter":

29 (a) Means a device that:

30 (i) Weighs less than seventy-five pounds.

31 (ii) Has two or three wheels.

32 (iii) Has handlebars.

33 (iv) Has a floorboard on which a person may stand while riding.

(v) Is powered by an electric motor or human power, or both.

35 (vi) Has a maximum speed that does not exceed twenty miles per 36 hour, with or without human propulsion, on a paved level surface.

(b) Does not include an electric miniature scooter.

37 38

34

32. "Evidence" includes both of the following:

39 (a) A display on a wireless communication device of а 40 department-generated driver license, nonoperating identification license, 41 vehicle registration card or other official record of the department that 42 presented to a law enforcement officer or in a court or is an 43 administrative proceeding.

44 (b) An electronic or digital license plate authorized pursuant to 45 section 28-364. 1 33. "Farm" means any lands primarily used for agriculture 2 production.

3

"Farm tractor" means a motor vehicle designed and used 34. 4 primarily as a farm implement for drawing implements of husbandry.

5

35. "Foreign vehicle" means a motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer 6 that is brought into this state other than in the ordinary course of 7 business by or through a manufacturer or dealer and that has not been 8 registered in this state.

9 36. "Fully autonomous vehicle" means an autonomous vehicle that is equipped with an automated driving system designed to function as a level 10 11 four or five system under SAE J3016 and that may be designed to function 12 either:

13

Solely by use of the automated driving system. (a)

14 (b) By a human driver when the automated driving system is not 15 engaged.

16 37. "Golf cart" means a motor vehicle that has not less than three 17 wheels in contact with the ground, that has an unladen weight of less than 18 one thousand eight hundred pounds, that is designed to be and is operated 19 at not more than twenty-five miles per hour and that is designed to carry 20 not more than four persons including the driver.

21 38. "Hazardous material" means a material, and its mixtures or 22 solutions, that the United States department of transportation determines under 49 Code of Federal Regulations is, or any quantity of a material 23 24 listed as a select agent or toxin under 42 Code of Federal Regulations part 73 that is, capable of posing an unreasonable risk to health, safety 25 26 and property if transported in commerce and that is required to be 27 placarded or marked as required by the department's safety rules prescribed pursuant to chapter 14 of this title. 28

29 39. "Human driver" means a natural person in the vehicle who 30 performs in real time all or part of the dynamic driving task or who 31 achieves a minimal risk condition for the vehicle.

40. "Implement of husbandry" means a vehicle that is designed 32 primarily for agricultural purposes and that is used exclusively in the 33 conduct of agricultural operations, including an implement or vehicle 34 whether self-propelled or otherwise that meets both of the following 35 36 conditions:

37 (a) Is used solely for agricultural purposes including the preparation or harvesting of cotton, alfalfa, grains and other farm crops. 38

(b) Is only incidentally operated or moved on a highway whether as 39 40 a trailer or self-propelled unit. For the purposes of this subdivision, 41 "incidentally operated or moved on a highway" means travel between a farm 42 and another part of the same farm, from one farm to another farm or 43 between a farm and a place of repair, supply or storage.

41. "Limousine" means a motor vehicle providing prearranged ground 44 45 transportation service for an individual passenger, or a group of

passengers, that is arranged in advance or is operated on a regular route or between specified points and includes ground transportation under a contract or agreement for services that includes a fixed rate or time and is provided in a motor vehicle with a seating capacity not exceeding fifteen passengers including the driver.

42. "Livery vehicle" means a motor vehicle that:

7 (a) Has a seating capacity not exceeding fifteen passengers 8 including the driver.

9 (b) Provides passenger services for a fare determined by a flat 10 rate or flat hourly rate between geographic zones or within a geographic 11 area.

12

(c) Is available for hire on an exclusive or shared ride basis.

13 14 (d) May do any of the following:(i) Operate on a regular route or between specified places.

15 (ii) Offer prearranged ground transportation service as defined in 16 section 28-141.

(iii) Offer on demand ground transportation service pursuant to acontract with a public airport, licensed business entity or organization.

19 43. "Local authority" means any county, municipal or other local 20 board or body exercising jurisdiction over highways under the constitution 21 and laws of this state.

44. "Manufacturer" means a person engaged in the business ofmanufacturing motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers.

45. "Minimal risk condition":

(a) Means a condition to which a human driver or an automated
 driving system may bring a vehicle in order to reduce the risk of a crash
 when a given trip cannot or should not be completed.

28

(b) Includes bringing the vehicle to a complete stop.

46. "Moped" means a bicycle, not including an electric bicycle, an electric miniature scooter or an electric standup scooter, that is equipped with a helper motor if the vehicle has a maximum piston displacement of fifty cubic centimeters or less, a brake horsepower of one and one-half or less and a maximum speed of twenty-five miles per hour or less on a flat surface with less than a one percent grade.

47. "Motorcycle" means a motor vehicle that has a seat or saddle for the use of the rider and that is designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground but excludes a tractor, an electric bicycle, an electric miniature scooter, an electric standup scooter and a moped.

40 48. "Motor driven cycle" means a motorcycle, including every motor 41 scooter, with a motor that produces not more than five horsepower but does 42 not include an electric bicycle, an electric miniature scooter or an 43 electric standup scooter.

44 49. "Motorized quadricycle" means a self-propelled motor vehicle to 45 which all of the following apply:

1 (a) The vehicle is self-propelled by an emission-free electric 2 motor and may include pedals operated by the passengers. 3 (b) The vehicle has at least four wheels in contact with the 4 ground. 5 (c) The vehicle seats at least eight passengers, including the 6 driver. 7 (d) The vehicle is operable on a flat surface using solely the 8 electric motor without assistance from the pedals or passengers. 9 (e) The vehicle is a commercial motor vehicle as defined in section 10 28-5201. 11 (f) The vehicle is a limousine operating under a vehicle for hire 12 company permit issued pursuant to section 28-9503. (g) The vehicle is manufactured by a motor vehicle manufacturer 13 that is licensed pursuant to chapter 10 of this title. 14 (h) The vehicle complies with the definition and standards for 15 16 low-speed vehicles set forth in 49 Code of Federal Regulations sections 17 571.3(b) and 571.500, respectively. 18 50. "Motor vehicle": 19 (a) Means either: 20 (i) A self-propelled vehicle. 21 (ii) For the purposes of the laws relating to the imposition of a 22 tax on motor vehicle fuel, a vehicle that is operated on the highways of this state and that is propelled by the use of motor vehicle fuel. 23 24 (b) Does not include a scrap vehicle, a personal delivery device, a personal mobile cargo carrying device, a motorized wheelchair, an electric 25 26 personal assistive mobility device, an electric bicycle, an electric 27 miniature scooter, an electric standup scooter or a motorized skateboard. 28 For the purposes of this subdivision: 29 (i) "Motorized skateboard" means a self-propelled device that does not have handlebars and that has a motor, a deck on which a person may 30 31 ride and at least two tandem wheels in contact with the ground. 32 (ii) "Motorized wheelchair" means a self-propelled wheelchair that 33 is used by a person for mobility. 51. "Motor vehicle fuel" includes all products that are commonly or 34 commercially known or sold as gasoline, including casinghead gasoline, 35 36 natural gasoline and all flammable liquids, and that are composed of a 37 mixture of selected hydrocarbons expressly manufactured and blended for 38 the purpose of effectively and efficiently operating internal combustion 39 engines. Motor vehicle fuel does not include inflammable liquids that are specifically manufactured for racing motor vehicles 40 and that are 41 distributed for and used by racing motor vehicles at a racetrack, use fuel 42 as defined in section 28-5601, aviation fuel, fuel for jet or turbine 43 powered aircraft or the mixture created at the interface of two different 44 substances being transported through a pipeline, commonly known as 45 transmix.

1 52. "Neighborhood electric shuttle": 2 (a) Means a self-propelled electrically powered motor vehicle to 3 which all of the following apply: 4 (i) The vehicle is emission free. 5 (ii) The vehicle has at least four wheels in contact with the 6 ground. 7 (iii) The vehicle is capable of transporting at least eight 8 passengers, including the driver. 9 (iv) The vehicle is a commercial motor vehicle as defined in 10 section 28-5201. 11 (v) The vehicle is a vehicle for hire as defined in section 28-9501 12 and operates under a vehicle for hire company permit issued pursuant to 13 section 28-9503. 14 (vi) The vehicle complies with the definition and standards for low-speed vehicles set forth in 49 Code of Federal Regulations sections 15 16 571.3(b) and 571.500, respectively. 17 (b) Includes a vehicle that meets the standards prescribed in 18 subdivision (a) of this paragraph and that has been modified after market and not by the manufacturer to transport up to fifteen passengers, 19 20 including the driver. "Neighborhood 21 53. electric vehicle" means а self-propelled 22 electrically powered motor vehicle to which all of the following apply: 23 (a) The vehicle is emission free. 24 (b) The vehicle has at least four wheels in contact with the 25 ground. 26 (c) The vehicle complies with the definition and standards for 27 low-speed vehicles, unless excepted or exempted under federal law, set forth in 49 Code of Federal Regulations sections 571.3(b) and 571.500, 28 29 respectively. 30 "Neighborhood occupantless electric 54. vehicle" means а 31 neighborhood electric vehicle that is not designed, intended or marketed 32 for human occupancy. 55. "N-NUMBER LICENSE MARKING" MEANS A LICENSE NUMBER MARKING THAT 33 34 IS ASSIGNED BY THE FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION TO IDENTIFY ROADABLE 35 AIRCRAFT. 36 55. 56. "Nonresident" means a person who is not a resident of this 37 state as defined in section 28-2001. 56. 57. "Off-road recreational motor vehicle" means a motor 38 vehicle that is designed primarily for recreational nonhighway all-terrain 39 travel and that is not operated on a public highway. Off-road 40 recreational motor vehicle does not mean a motor vehicle used for 41 construction, building trade, mining or agricultural purposes. 42 43 57. 58. "Operational design domain": 44 (a) Means operating conditions under which a given automated 45 driving system is specifically designed to function.

1 (b) Includes roadway types, speed range, environmental conditions, 2 such as weather or time of day, and other domain constraints. 58. 59. "Operator" means a person who drives a motor vehicle on a 3 4 highway, who is in actual physical control of a motor vehicle on a highway 5 or who is exercising control over or steering a vehicle being towed by a 6 motor vehicle. 7 59. 60. "Owner" means: 8 (a) A person who holds the legal title of a vehicle. 9 (b) If a vehicle is the subject of an agreement for the conditional sale or lease with the right of purchase on performance of the conditions 10 11 stated in the agreement and with an immediate right of possession vested 12 in the conditional vendee or lessee, the conditional vendee or lessee. 13 (c) If a mortgagor of a vehicle is entitled to possession of the 14 vehicle, the mortgagor. 15 61. "Pedestrian" means any person afoot. A person who uses an 16 electric personal assistive mobility device or a manual or motorized 17 wheelchair is considered a pedestrian unless the manual wheelchair 18 qualifies as a bicycle. For the purposes of this paragraph, "motorized 19 wheelchair" means a self-propelled wheelchair that is used by a person for 20 mobility. 21 61. 62. "Personal delivery device": 22 (a) Means a device that is both of the following: 23 (i) Manufactured for transporting cargo and goods in an area 24 described in section 28-1225. (ii) Equipped with automated driving technology, including software 25 26 and hardware, that enables the operation of the device with the remote 27 support and supervision of a human. Does not include a personal mobile cargo carrying device. 28 (b) 29 62. 63. "Personal mobile cargo carrying device" means an electronically powered device that: 30 31 (a) Is operated primarily on sidewalks and within crosswalks and 32 that is designed to transport property. 33 (b) Weighs less than eighty pounds, excluding cargo. 34 (c) Operates at a maximum speed of twelve miles per hour. 35 (d) Is equipped with technology to transport personal property with 36 the active monitoring of a property owner and that is primarily designed 37 to remain within twenty-five feet of the property owner. 38 (e) Is equipped with a braking system that when active or engaged 39 enables the personal mobile cargo carrying device to come to a controlled 40 stop. 41 63. 64. "Power sweeper" means an implement, with or without motive 42 power, that is only incidentally operated or moved on a street or highway 43 and that is designed for the removal of debris, dirt, gravel, litter or 44 sand whether by broom, vacuum or regenerative air system from asphaltic 45 concrete or cement concrete surfaces, including parking lots, highways,

1 streets and warehouses, and a vehicle on which the implement is 2 permanently mounted.

3 64. 65. "Public transit" means the transportation of passengers on 4 scheduled routes by means of a conveyance on an individual passenger 5 fare-paying basis excluding transportation by a sightseeing bus, school 6 bus or taxi or a vehicle not operated on a scheduled route basis.

7 65. 66. "Reconstructed vehicle" means a vehicle that has been 8 assembled or constructed largely by means of essential parts, new or used, 9 derived from vehicles or makes of vehicles of various names, models and types or that, if originally otherwise constructed, has been materially 10 11 altered by the removal of essential parts or by the addition or substitution of essential parts, new or used, derived from other vehicles 12 13 or makes of vehicles. For the purposes of this paragraph, "essential parts" means integral and body parts, the removal, alteration or 14 substitution of which will tend to conceal the identity or substantially 15 16 alter the appearance of the vehicle.

17 66. 67. "Residence district" means the territory contiguous to and 18 including a highway not comprising a business district if the property on 19 the highway for a distance of three hundred feet or more is in the main 20 improved with residences or residences and buildings in use for business.

21 67. 68. "Right-of-way" when used within the context of the 22 regulation of the movement of traffic on a highway means the privilege of 23 the immediate use of the highway. Right-of-way when used within the 24 context of the real property on which transportation facilities and 25 appurtenances to the facilities are constructed or maintained means the 26 lands or interest in lands within the right-of-way boundaries.

69. "ROADABLE AIRCRAFT" MEANS AN AIRCRAFT THAT HAS A MODE OF
TRANSPORTATION TO ENABLE OPERATION LIKE A VEHICLE UNDER THIS TITLE AND
THAT IS MANUFACTURED TO MEET THE FEDERAL SAFETY STANDARDS FOR MOTORCYCLES.

30 68. 70. "SAE J3016" means surface transportation recommended 31 practice J3016 taxonomy and definitions for terms related to driving 32 automation systems for on-road motor vehicles published by SAE 33 international in June 2018.

34 69. 71. "School bus" means a motor vehicle that is designed for 35 carrying more than ten passengers and that is either:

36 (a) Owned by any public or governmental agency or other institution 37 and operated for the transportation of children to or from home or school 38 on a regularly scheduled basis.

39 (b) Privately owned and operated for compensation for the 40 transportation of children to or from home or school on a regularly 41 scheduled basis.

42 70. 72. "Scrap metal dealer" has the same meaning prescribed in 43 section 44-1641.

44 71. 73. "Scrap vehicle" has the same meaning prescribed in section 45 44-1641. 1 72. 74. "Semitrailer" means a vehicle that is with or without 2 motive power, other than a pole trailer or single-axle tow dolly, that is 3 designed for carrying persons or property and for being drawn by a motor 4 vehicle and that is constructed so that some part of its weight and that 5 of its load rests on or is carried by another vehicle. For the purposes 6 of this paragraph, "pole trailer" has the same meaning prescribed in 7 section 28-601.

8 73. 75. "Single-axle tow dolly" means a nonvehicle device that is 9 drawn by a motor vehicle, that is designed and used exclusively to 10 transport another motor vehicle and on which the front or rear wheels of 11 the drawn motor vehicle are mounted on the tow dolly while the other 12 wheels of the drawn motor vehicle remain in contact with the ground.

13 74. 76. "State" means a state of the United States and the 14 District of Columbia.

15 75. 77. "State highway" means a state route or portion of a state 16 route that is accepted and designated by the board as a state highway and 17 that is maintained by the state.

18 76. 78. "State route" means a right-of-way whether actually used 19 as a highway or not that is designated by the board as a location for the 20 construction of a state highway.

21 77. 79. "Street" or "highway" means the entire width between the 22 boundary lines of every way if a part of the way is open to the use of the 23 public for purposes of vehicular travel.

24 78. 80. "Taxi" means a motor vehicle that has a seating capacity 25 not exceeding fifteen passengers, including the driver, that provides 26 passenger services and that:

27 (a) Does not primarily operate on a regular route or between28 specified places.

(b) Offers local transportation for a fare determined on the basis
 of the distance traveled or prearranged ground transportation service as
 defined in section 28-141 for a predetermined fare.

C. The registering officer shall indicate on the face of the registration application that the registrant may be subject to vehicle emissions testing requirements pursuant to section 49-542.

D. On request of an applicant, the department shall allow the applicant to provide on the registration of a motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer a post office box address that is regularly used by the applicant and that is located in the county in which the applicant resides.

E. The person shall include with the application the required fees and the certificate of title to the vehicle for which registration is sought. The registering officer may waive the requirement that the applicant present a certificate of title at the time of making an application for renewal if the registering officer has available complete and sufficient records to accurately compute the vehicle license tax.

18 F. The department may request an applicant who appears in person to 19 register a motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer to satisfactorily 20 complete the vision screening test prescribed by the department.

A class M license is valid for operating a motorcycle, motor driven cycle or moped but is not necessary for operating an autocycle, A ROADABLE AIRCRAFT or a motorcycle that has at least three wheels and a three-point safety belt and bucket or bench seats and that is fully enclosed or uses a roll cage frame. For the purpose of licensing a driver, the department may endorse a class M license classification on a valid class A, B, C, D or G license.

B. A class A, B, C, D or G license is not valid for operating a vehicle that requires a class M license or a vehicle that requires a special endorsement unless the proper endorsement appears on the license.

C. A commercial driver license is not required to operate a vehicle described in subsection A, paragraph 1, 2 or 3 of this section if the vehicle has been issued a historic vehicle license plate pursuant to section 28-2484 and the department provides in the vehicle registration record both of the following:

That the vehicle is classified as a noncommercial vehicle and
 may not be used as a commercial vehicle.
