AMENDING LAWS 2023, CHAPTER 135, SECTION 10: MAKING CAPITAL OUTLAY APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE DIFFERENT DEPARTMENTS OF THE STATE AND FOR STATE INSTITUTIONS; PROVIDING FOR REVIEW OF CAPITAL OUTLAY PROJECTS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
2 Section 1. Laws 2023, chapter 135, section 10 is amended to read:

 27 the department of transportation shall report to the joint legislative
 28 budget committee staff the projected cost and status of the projects for
 29 the appropriations made in subsection A of this section.

30 C. Before transferring monies between the projects described in
 31 subsection A of this section, the department of transportation shall
 32 submit a report for review by the joint committee on capital review.

33 D. Notwithstanding section 41-1252, Arizona Revised Statutes, the
 34 appropriations made in subsection A of this section are not subject to
 35 review by the joint committee on capital review.

37 Sec. 2. Capital outlay appropriations; major maintenance and
 38 repair of state buildings

39 A. Notwithstanding section 41-793.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, the
 40 amounts appropriated in this section are appropriated for fiscal year
 41 2024-2025 to be used by the applicable agency for major maintenance and
 42 repair activities for state buildings in accordance with title 41,
 43 chapter 4, article 7, Arizona Revised Statutes.

44 B. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION \$19,000,000
 45 Fund source:

1 Capital outlay stabilization fund \$19,000,000

2 The department of administration shall allocate the monies to state
3 agencies for necessary building renewal. If monies in the capital outlay
4 stabilization fund established by section 41-792.01, Arizona Revised
5 Statutes, are insufficient to fund the appropriation to the department of
6 administration for building renewal, the appropriation to the department
7 of administration is reduced by the difference between the amount
8 appropriated to the department of administration from the capital outlay
9 stabilization fund and the balance in the capital outlay stabilization
10 fund. Notwithstanding title 41, chapter 4, article 7, Arizona Revised
11 Statutes, the department of administration may use monies appropriated for
12 building renewal in fiscal year 2024-2025 for building projects related to
13 retrofitting facilities for space consolidation initiatives.

19 A. The amount appropriated in this section is appropriated for
20 fiscal year 2024-2025 to plan and construct state highways, including the
21 national system of interstate highways within this state, the state
22 primary or secondary system, the county primary or secondary system and
23 urban rural routes, to acquire rights-of-way and to provide for the cost
24 of contracted field administration and field engineering on construction
25 projects and debt service payments on bonds issued for highway
26 construction.

27 B. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION \$462,488,000

40 monies, federal monies, local agency monies, state highway monies, bond
41 proceeds and regional area road monies. The report shall be in the same
42 format as in the prior year unless the directors of the joint legislative
43 budget committee and the governor's office of strategic planning and
44 budgeting have approved modifications to the format.

1 D. On or before November 1, 2024, the department of transportation
2 shall report capital outlay information for fiscal years 2023-2024,
3 2024-2025 and 2025-2026, to the directors of the joint legislative budget
4 committee and the governor's office of strategic planning and budgeting.
5 This information shall appear in the same format as tables two, three and
6 six, as found in the fiscal year 2023-2024 appropriations report.

7 E. On or before November 1, 2024, the department of transportation
8 shall report the department's estimated outstanding debt principal balance
9 at the end of fiscal year 2025-2026 and the estimated debt service payment
10 amount for each of fiscal years 2025-2026, 2026-2027, 2027-2028 and
11 2028-2029, to the directors of the joint legislative budget committee and
12 the governor's office of strategic planning and budgeting. This report
13 shall include state highway fund statewide construction bonds, Arizona
14 highway user revenue fund bonds, Maricopa association of governments and
15 Pima association of governments controlled access bonds, Maricopa regional
16 area road fund bonds and grant anticipation notes and is intended to be
17 comparable to the information in the fiscal year 2023-2024 appropriations
18 report.
