HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AMENDMENTS TO S.B. 1286  
(Reference to Senate engrossed bill)

1 Page 1, strike lines 23 through 44

2 Strike pages 2 through 4

3 Page 5, strike lines 1 through 18, insert:

4            "A. The board of supervisors of each county, on or before October 1  
5        of each year preceding the year of a general election, by an order, shall  
6        establish a convenient number of election precincts in the county and  
7        define the boundaries of the precincts as follows:

8            1. The election precinct boundaries shall be established so as to be  
9        included within election districts prescribed by law for elected officers  
10      of the state and its political subdivisions, including community college  
11      district precincts, except those elected officers provided for in titles 30  
12      and 48.

13           2. If after October 1 of the year preceding the year of a general  
14      election the board of supervisors must further adjust precinct boundaries  
15      due to the redistricting of election districts as prescribed by law and to  
16      comply with this subsection, the board of supervisors shall adjust these  
17      precinct boundaries as soon as is practicable.

1           B. At least twenty days before a general or primary election, and at  
2 least ten days before a special election, the board shall designate one  
3 polling place within each precinct where the election shall be held, except  
4 that:

5           1. On a specific finding of the board, included in the order or  
6 resolution designating polling places pursuant to this subsection, that no  
7 suitable polling place is available within a precinct, a polling place for  
8 that precinct may be designated within an adjacent precinct.

9           2. Adjacent precincts may be combined if boundaries so established  
10 are included in election districts prescribed by law for state elected  
11 officials and political subdivisions including community college districts  
12 but not including elected officials prescribed by titles 30 and 48. The  
13 officer in charge of elections may also split a precinct for administrative  
14 purposes. The polling places shall be listed in separate sections of the  
15 order or resolution.

16           3. On a specific finding of the board that the number of persons who  
17 are listed as early voters pursuant to section 16-544 and who are not  
18 expected to have their ballots tabulated at the polling place as prescribed  
19 in section 16-579.02 is likely to substantially reduce the number of voters  
20 appearing at one or more specific polling places at that election, adjacent  
21 precincts may be consolidated by combining polling places and precinct  
22 boards for that election. The board of supervisors shall ensure that a  
23 reasonable and adequate number of polling places will be designated for  
24 that election. Any consolidated polling places shall be listed in separate  
25 sections of the order or resolution of the board.

26           4. On a specific resolution of the board, the board may authorize  
27 the use of voting centers ~~in place of or~~ in addition to specifically  
28 designated polling places. A voting center shall allow any voter in that  
29 county to receive the appropriate ballot for that voter on election day  
30 after presenting identification as prescribed in section 16-579 and to  
31 lawfully cast the ballot. **IN ADDITION TO SPECIFICALLY DESIGNATED POLLING**  
32 **PLACES**, voting centers may be established in coordination and consultation

1       with the county recorder, at other county offices or at other locations in  
2       the county deemed appropriate.

3           5. On a specific resolution of the board of supervisors that is  
4       limited to a specific election date and that is voted on by a recorded  
5       vote, the board may authorize the county recorder or other officer in  
6       charge of elections to use emergency voting centers as follows:

7           (a) The board shall specify in the resolution the location and the  
8       hours of operation of the emergency voting centers.

9           (b) A qualified elector voting at an emergency voting center shall  
10       provide identification as prescribed in section 16-579, except that  
11       notwithstanding section 16-579, subsection A, paragraph 2, for any voting  
12       at an emergency voting center, the county recorder or other officer in  
13       charge of elections may allow a qualified elector to update the elector's  
14       voter registration information as provided for in the secretary of state's  
15       instructions and procedures manual adopted pursuant to section 16-452.

16           (c) If an emergency voting center established pursuant to this  
17       section becomes unavailable and there is not sufficient time for the board  
18       of supervisors to convene to approve an alternate location for that  
19       emergency voting center, the county recorder or other officer in charge of  
20       elections may make changes to the approved emergency voting center location  
21       and shall notify the public and the board of supervisors regarding that  
22       change as soon as practicable. The alternate emergency voting center shall  
23       be as close in proximity to the approved emergency voting center location  
24       as possible.

25           C. If the board fails to designate the place for holding the  
26       election, or if it cannot be held at or about the place designated, the  
27       justice of the peace in the precinct, two days before the election, by an  
28       order, copies of which the justice of the peace shall immediately post in  
29       three public places in the precinct, shall designate the place within the  
30       precinct for holding the election. If there is no justice of the peace in  
31       the precinct, or if the justice of the peace fails to do so, the election  
32       board of the precinct shall designate and give notice of the place within

1       the precinct of holding the election. For any election in which there are  
2       no candidates for elected office appearing on the ballot, the board may  
3       consolidate polling places and precinct boards and may consolidate the  
4       tabulation of results for that election if all of the following apply:

5           1. All affected voters are notified by mail of the change at least  
6       thirty-three days before the election.

7           2. Notice of the change in polling places includes notice of the new  
8       voting location, notice of the hours for voting on election day and notice  
9       of the telephone number to call for voter assistance.

10          3. All affected voters receive information on early voting that  
11       includes the application used to request an early voting ballot.

12           D. The board is not required to designate a polling place for  
13       special district mail ballot elections held pursuant to article 8.1 of this  
14       chapter, but the board may designate one or more sites for voters to  
15       deposit marked ballots until 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election.

16           E. A STATE, COUNTY, CITY, TOWN OR SCHOOL DISTRICT OFFICE SHALL  
17       PROVIDE SUFFICIENT SPACE FOR USE AS A POLLING PLACE FOR ANY STATE, COUNTY,  
18       CITY OR TOWN ELECTION WHEN REQUESTED BY THE OFFICER IN CHARGE OF ELECTIONS.

19           ~~E. F. Except as provided in subsection F of this section, A public~~  
20       school THAT IS OPERATED BY A SCHOOL DISTRICT, THAT PROVIDES EDUCATIONAL  
21       INSTRUCTION IN GRADES EIGHT THROUGH TWELVE AND THAT HAS A GYMNASIUM shall  
22       provide sufficient space for use as a polling place for any city, county or  
23       state election when requested by the officer in charge of elections. IF  
24       REQUESTED FOR USE AS A POLLING PLACE, THE SCHOOL IS EXEMPT FROM ANY STATE,  
25       LOCAL OR SCHOOL DISTRICT REQUIREMENTS THAT WOULD PREVENT OR OTHERWISE LIMIT  
26       THE USE OF THE SCHOOL AND ITS GYMNASIUM AS A POLLING PLACE. FOR THE  
27       PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION, "GYMNASIUM":

28           1. MEANS AN INDOOR ROOM OR FACILITY SUITABLE FOR SPORTING EVENTS,  
29       INCLUDING BASKETBALL OR VOLLEYBALL.

30           2. DOES NOT INCLUDE A CAFETERIA OR AN AUDITORIUM.

1           F. ~~The principal of the school may deny a request to provide space  
2 for use as a polling place for any city, county or state election if,  
3 within two weeks after a request has been made, the principal provides a  
4 written statement indicating a reason the election cannot be held in the  
5 school, including any of the following:~~

- 6           1. ~~Space is not available at the school.~~  
7           2. ~~The safety or welfare of the children would be jeopardized.~~

8           G. Beginning in 2026, the department of administration shall  
9 coordinate with state agencies and counties to provide available and  
10 appropriate state-owned facilities for use as a voting location for any  
11 city, county or state election when requested by the officer in charge of  
12 elections.

13           H. The board shall make available to the public as a public record a  
14 list of the polling places for all precincts in which the election is to be  
15 held.

16           I. Except in the case of an emergency, any facility that is used as  
17 a polling place on election day or that is used as an early voting site  
18 during the period of early voting shall allow persons to electioneer and  
19 engage in other political activity outside of the seventy-five foot limit  
20 prescribed by section 16-515 in public areas and parking lots used by  
21 voters. This subsection does not allow the temporary or permanent  
22 construction of structures in public areas and parking lots or the blocking  
23 or other impairment of access to parking spaces for voters. The county  
24 recorder or other officer in charge of elections shall post on its website  
25 at least two weeks before election day a list of those polling places in  
26 which emergency conditions prevent electioneering and shall specify the  
27 reason the emergency designation was granted and the number of attempts  
28 that were made to find a polling place before granting an emergency  
29 designation. If the polling place is not on the website list of polling  
30 places with emergency designations, electioneering and other political  
31 activity shall be allowed outside of the seventy-five foot limit. If an  
32 emergency arises after the county recorder or other officer in charge of

1        elections' initial website posting, the county recorder or other officer in  
2        charge of elections shall update the website as soon as is practicable to  
3        include any new polling places, shall highlight the polling place location  
4        on the website and shall specify the reason the emergency designation was  
5        granted and the number of attempts that were made to find a polling place  
6        before granting an emergency designation.

7            J. For the purposes of this section, a county recorder or other  
8        officer in charge of elections shall designate a polling place as an  
9        emergency polling place and thus prohibit persons from electioneering and  
10        engaging in other political activity outside of the seventy-five foot limit  
11        prescribed by section 16-515 but inside the property of the facility that  
12        is hosting the polling place if any of the following occurs:

- 13            1. An act of God renders a previously set polling place as unusable.
- 14            2. A county recorder or other officer in charge of elections has  
15        exhausted all options and there are no suitable facilities in a precinct  
16        that are willing to be a polling place unless a facility can be given an  
17        emergency designation.

18            K. The secretary of state shall provide through the instructions and  
19        procedures manual adopted pursuant to section 16-452 the maximum allowable  
20        wait time for any election that is subject to section 16-204 and provide  
21        for a method to reduce voter wait time at the polls in the primary and  
22        general elections. The method shall consider at least all of the following  
23        for primary and general elections in each precinct:

- 24            1. The number of ballots voted in the prior primary and general  
25        elections.
- 26            2. The number of registered voters who voted early in the prior  
27        primary and general elections.
- 28            3. The number of registered voters and the number of registered  
29        voters who cast an early ballot for the current primary or general  
30        election.

1           4. The number of registered voters whose early ballots were  
2       tabulated on-site as prescribed in section 16-579.02 in the prior primary  
3       and general elections.

4           5. The number of election board members and clerks and the number of  
5       rosters that will reduce voter wait time at the polls."
