A RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING VARIOUS TAX REDUCTION, REGULATORY REFORM AND FISCAL DISCIPLINE
EFFORTS IN THE STATE OF ARIZONA.

1 Whereas, it is of vital importance to foster an economic environment
2 that empowers individuals, families and businesses to thrive without
3 excessive government interference; and

4 Whereas, reducing the tax burden on Arizona's residents and
5 businesses is essential to promoting job creation, stimulating local
6 investment and encouraging long-term economic growth; and

7 Whereas, the Arizona House of Representatives is committed to
8 eliminating unnecessary regulations and special interest subsidies that
9 distort Arizona's tax code and ensuring a fair and equitable tax system
10 for all Arizonans; and

11 Whereas, it is essential to uphold the principles of fiscal
12 discipline, limited government and a balanced budget to secure Arizona's
13 financial health for future generations; and

14 Whereas, the Arizona House of Representatives supports the
15 preservation of individual freedom in education and health care choices,
16 recognizing that consumers are best equipped to make decisions that serve
17 their needs and preferences; and

18 Whereas, reducing the influence of public sector unions in the
19 political process supports employee rights and diminishes undue political
20 influence from taxpayer-funded entities.

21 Therefore

22 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Arizona:

23 1. That the Members of the House of Representatives support various
24 tax reduction, regulatory reform and fiscal discipline measures that will
25 provide relief to Arizona's working families and reduce burdens on small
26 businesses and entrepreneurs in this state.

27 2. That the Members of the House of Representatives support the
28 various state agencies in their efforts to collaborate in implementing
29 these principles, thus ensuring that Arizona remains a model of limited,
30 effective government that upholds individual freedom and economic liberty.
